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#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Transportation (MoDOT)** assume this proposal would remove the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission from overseeing MoDOT and the state highway system. Instead, this proposal places the Director in charge of MoDOT, and requires this person to be appointed by the Governor with consent of the Senate. The Director would also oversee the state highway system, transportation programs, and facilities including the other modes of transportation. This change removes the current safeguard shielding the statewide transportation system from political influence.

By law, the members of the Commission (6) are entitled to a \$25 per day per diem and expenses. Most of the members do not collect the per diem, and some occasionally request mileage reimbursement.

The following is a summary of the expenses paid.

Calendar Year 2019: \$1,645.38 Calendar Year 2018: \$1,467.51

**Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary in regards to MoDOT's assumptions; therefore, Oversight will reflect MoDOT's savings of approximately \$1,500 per year on the fiscal note. (Oversight does note that this proposal is contingent upon passage of a constitutional amendment. Therefore, Oversight will range the impact from \$0 (joint resolution is not approved by voters) to the \$1,500 in potential savings.

Officials from the **Office of the Governor** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

**Oversight** notes that the Office of the Governor has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note for the Office of the Governor.
