AN ACT

To amend chapter 301, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to a Safety Net of Missouri special license plate.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 301, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 301.3177, to read as follows:

301.3177. 1. Any vehicle owner may apply for "Safety Net of Missouri" license plates for any motor vehicle the person owns, either solely or jointly, other than an 2 apportioned motor vehicle or a commercial motor vehicle licensed in excess of twenty-four 4 thousand pounds gross weight. Upon making a ten dollar contribution to Safety Net of Missouri, the vehicle owner may apply for the "Safety Net of Missouri" plate. If the contribution is made directly to Safety Net of Missouri, the organization shall issue the individual making the contribution a receipt, verifying the contribution, that may be used to apply for the "Safety Net of Missouri" license plate. If the contribution is made directly to the director of revenue pursuant to section 301.3031, the director shall note the contribution and the owner may then apply for the "Safety Net of Missouri" plate. The applicant for such plate shall pay a fifteen dollar fee in addition to the regular registration 11 12 fees and present any other documentation required by law for each set of "Safety Net of 13 Missouri" plates issued pursuant to this section. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 14 301.144, no additional fee shall be charged for the personalization of license plates issued pursuant to this section. The "Safety Net of Missouri" plate shall bear the emblem of a 15 16 thin blue line encompassed in black as prescribed by the director of revenue and shall have the words "SAFETY NET OF MISSOURI". Such license plates shall be made with fully 17

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reflective material with a common color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by section 301.130.

2. The director of revenue may promulgate rules and regulations for the administration of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2020, shall be invalid and void.

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
