AN ACT

To repeal sections 115.357 and 115.761, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to filing fees for candidates for political office.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 115.357 and 115.761, RSMo, are repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 115.357 and 115.761, to read as follows:

115.357. 1. Except as provided in subsections 3 and 4 of this section, each candidate for federal, state or county office shall, before filing his declaration of candidacy, pay to the treasurer of the state or county committee of the political party upon whose ticket he seeks nomination a certain sum of money as follows:

(1) To the treasurer of the state central committee, ~~two~~ **five** hundred dollars if he or she is a candidate for statewide office or for United States senator, ~~one~~ **three** hundred dollars if he or she is a candidate for representative in Congress, circuit judge or state senator, and **one hundred** fifty dollars if he or she is a candidate for state representative;

(2) To the treasurer of the county central committee, ~~fifty~~ **one hundred** dollars if he or she is a candidate for county office.

2. The required sum may be submitted by the candidate to the official accepting his declaration of candidacy. All sums so submitted shall be forwarded promptly by the official to the treasurer of the appropriate party committee.

3. Any person who cannot pay the fee required to file as a candidate may have the fee waived by filing a declaration of inability to pay and a petition with his declaration of candidacy. Each such declaration shall be in substantially the following form:

33 If the candidate's declaration of candidacy is to be filed in person, the declaration of inability to
34 pay shall be subscribed and sworn to by the candidate before the election official who witnesses
35 the candidate's declaration of candidacy. If his declaration of candidacy is to be filed by certified
36 mail pursuant to subsection 2 of section 115.355, the declaration of inability to pay shall be
37 subscribed and sworn to by the candidate before the notary or other officer who witnesses the
38 candidate's declaration of candidacy. With his declaration of inability to pay, the candidate shall
39 submit a petition endorsing his candidacy. Except for the number of signatures required, each
40 such petition shall, insofar as practicable, be in the form provided in sections 115.321 and
41 115.325. If the person filing declaration of indigence is to be a candidate for statewide office, his
42 petition shall be signed by the number of registered voters in the state equal to at least one-half
43 of one percent of the total number of votes cast in the state for the office at the last election in
44 which a candidate ran for the office. If the person filing a declaration of indigence is to be a
45 candidate for any other office, the petition shall be signed by the number of registered voters in
46 the district or political subdivision which is equal to at least one percent of the total number of
47 votes cast for the office at the last election in which a candidate ran for the office. The
48 candidate's declaration of inability to pay and the petition shall be filed at the same time and in
49 the same manner as his declaration of candidacy is filed. The petition shall be checked and its
50 sufficiency determined in the same manner as new party and independent candidate petitions.

51 4. No filing fee shall be required of any person who proposes to be an independent
52 candidate, the candidate of a new party or a candidate for presidential elector.

53 5. Except as provided in subsections 3 and 4 of this section, no candidate's name shall
54 be printed on any official ballot until the required fee has been paid.

115.761. 1. The official list of presidential candidates for each established political party
2 shall include the names of all constitutionally qualified candidates for whom, on or after 8:00
3 a.m. on the fifteenth Tuesday prior to the presidential primary, and on or before 5:00 p.m., on
4 the eleventh Tuesday prior to the presidential primary, a written request to be included on the
5 presidential primary ballot is filed with the secretary of state along with:

6 (1) Receipt of payment to the state committee of the established political party on whose
7 ballot the candidate wishes to appear of a filing fee of ~~one~~ **five** thousand dollars; or

8 (2) A written statement, sworn to before an officer authorized by law to administer oaths,
9 that the candidate is unable to pay the filing fee and does not have funds in a campaign fund or
10 committee to pay the filing fee and a petition signed by not less than five thousand registered
11 Missouri voters, as determined by the secretary of state, that the candidate's name be placed on
12 the ballot of the specified established political party for the presidential preference primary. The
13 request to be included on the presidential primary ballot shall include each signer's printed name,
14 registered address and signature and shall be in substantially the following form:

17 I (We) the undersigned, do hereby request that the name of _____ be placed upon the February
18 _____, _____, presidential primary ballot as candidate for nomination as the nominee for
19 President of the United States on the _____ party ticket.

21 2. The state or national party organization of an established political party that adopts
22 rules imposing signature requirements to be met before a candidate can be listed as an official
23 candidate shall notify the secretary of state by October first of the year preceding the presidential
24 primary.

25 3. Any candidate or such candidate's authorized representative may have such candidate's
26 name stricken from the presidential primary ballot by filing with the secretary of state on or
27 before 5:00 p.m. on the eleventh Tuesday prior to the presidential primary election a written
28 statement, sworn to before an officer authorized by law to administer oaths, requesting that such
29 candidate's name not be printed on the official primary ballot. Thereafter, the secretary of state
30 shall not include the name of that candidate in the official list announced pursuant to section
31 115.758 or in the certified list of candidates transmitted pursuant to section 115.765.

32 4. The filing times set out in this section shall only apply to presidential preference
33 primaries, and are in lieu of those established in section 115.349.

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
