

HB 1704 -- BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA LICENSE PLATE

SPONSOR: O'Donnell

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass" by the Standing Committee on Transportation by a vote of 14 to 0. Voted "Do Pass" by the Standing Committee on Rules- Administrative Oversight by a vote of 8 to 0.

Currently, an organization is required to send a list of at least 200 potential applicants who plan to purchase a specialty plate before such a specialty plate will be issued. This bill removes this requirement for Boy Scouts of America specialty license plates.

PROPONENTS: Supporters say that removing the 200 applicant minimum requirement would help get Boy Scouts of America specialty license plates in circulation. Boy Scouts of America is an organization that is over 100 years old and should be advertised.

Testifying for the bill was Representative O'Donnell.

OPPONENTS: There was no opposition voiced to the committee.
