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#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

§§84.344 and 285.040 - Residency Requirement

Officials from the **City of St. Louis** state the Fiscal Manager of the **St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department**, the Deputy Director of the **City of St. Louis's Public Safety Department** and the Chief of the **St. Louis Fire Department** all stated there would be no measurable fiscal impact from the passage of this legislation.

**Oversight** notes §84.344 and §285.040 remove the residency requirement for all employees of the City of St. Louis Police Department and public safety employees of the City of St. Louis. Oversight assumes these sections of the proposal could have a potential <u>indirect</u> impact on the City of St. Louis (such as an increase in earnings tax collections if the removal of the residency requirement aids the City of St. Louis in hiring additional public safety employees that reside outside the city limits but will be employed within the city); however, Oversight assumes these sections will have no direct fiscal impact on state or local governments.
