1 AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 784, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by  
2 inserting after all of said section and line the following:

3  
4 "8.010. 1. The governor, attorney general and lieutenant governor constitute the board of  
5 public buildings. The governor is chairman and the lieutenant governor, secretary. The speaker of  
6 the house of representatives and the president pro tempore of the senate shall serve as ex officio  
7 members of the board but shall not have the power to vote. The board shall constitute a body  
8 corporate and politic. Except as provided under ~~[section]~~ sections 8.007 and 8.111, the board has  
9 general supervision and charge of the public property of the state at the seat of government,  
10 including the building located at 105 West Capitol Avenue in Jefferson City, and other duties  
11 imposed on it by law.

12 2. The commissioner of administration shall provide staff support to the board.

13 8.111. 1. There is hereby established the "Capitol Police Board", which shall be composed  
14 of seven members, as follows:

15 (1) The governor, or his or her designee;

16 (2) The speaker of the house of representatives, or his or her designee;

17 (3) The minority floor leader of the house of representatives, or his or her designee;

18 (4) The president pro tempore of the senate, or his or her designee;

19 (5) The minority floor leader of the senate, or his or her designee;

20 (6) The chief justice of the Missouri supreme court, or his or her designee; and

21 (7) The chair of the state capitol commission.

23 The lieutenant governor, the chief clerk of the house of representatives, and the secretary of the  
24 senate, or their designees, shall serve as ex officio members of the board but shall not have the  
25 power to vote. At the first meeting of the board and at yearly intervals thereafter, the members shall  
26 select from among themselves a chair, a vice chair, and a secretary.

27 2. The board shall be assigned to the house of representatives with supervision by the house  
28 of representatives only for budgeting and reporting. Such supervision shall not extend to matters  
29 relating to policies, regulatory functions, or appeals from activities of the board, and no member or  
30 employee of the house of representatives shall participate in or interfere with the activities of the  
31 board in any manner not specifically provided by law, or at the direction of the board, and no  
32 member or employee of the house of representatives shall interfere in any manner with any budget  
33 request of or with respect to the withholding of any moneys appropriated to the board by the general  
34 assembly.

35 3. The board shall provide for public safety at the seat of government and for the safety and  
36 security of elected officials, government employees, and their guests as needed outside the seat of

1 government. The board shall hire police officers as described in section 8.177.

2 4. The board shall hire a chief of police, who shall be certified under chapter 590 and serve  
 3 subject to the supervision of and at the pleasure of the board. The chief of police shall be  
 4 responsible for the administrative operations of the capitol police and perform such other duties as  
 5 may be delegated or assigned to the chief by law or by the board. The chief of police shall employ  
 6 staff and retain such contract services as he or she deems necessary, within the limits authorized by  
 7 appropriations of the general assembly.

8 5. The board may promulgate all necessary rules and regulations for the administration of  
 9 sections 8.111 to 8.178. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that  
 10 is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies  
 11 with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This  
 12 section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly  
 13 pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are  
 14 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or  
 15 adopted after August 28, 2021, shall be invalid and void.

16 8.170. The [director] Missouri capitol police shall prosecute, in the name of the state, for all  
 17 trespasses and injuries of every kind done to the public buildings and other property, and shall attend  
 18 to the suits relative to the same. The attorney general shall give counsel, or prosecute suits, when  
 19 required by the [director] chief.

20 8.172. The [commissioner of administration] capitol police board shall make rules and  
 21 regulations for the regulation of traffic and parking at all parking space upon the capitol grounds and  
 22 upon the grounds of other state buildings located within the capital city. The regulations shall be  
 23 enforced by the Missouri capitol police.

24 8.177. 1. The [director of the department of public safety] capitol police board shall employ  
 25 Missouri capitol police officers for public safety at the seat of state government. Each Missouri  
 26 capitol police officer, upon appointment, shall take and subscribe an oath of office to support the  
 27 constitution and laws of the United States and the state of Missouri and shall receive a certificate of  
 28 appointment, a copy of which shall be filed with the secretary of state, granting such police officers  
 29 all the same powers of arrest held by other police officers to maintain order and preserve the peace  
 30 in all state-owned or leased buildings, and the grounds thereof, at the seat of government and such  
 31 buildings and grounds within the county which contains the seat of government.

32 2. The [director of the department of public safety] capitol police board shall appoint a  
 33 sufficient number of Missouri capitol police officers, with available appropriations, as appropriated  
 34 specifically for the purpose designated in this subsection, so that the capitol grounds may be  
 35 patrolled at all times, and that traffic and parking upon the capitol grounds and the grounds of other  
 36 state buildings owned or leased within the capital city and the county which contains the seat of  
 37 government may be properly controlled. Missouri capitol police officers may make arrests for the  
 38 violation of parking and traffic regulations promulgated by the [office of administration] capitol  
 39 police board.

40 3. Missouri capitol police officers shall be authorized to arrest a person anywhere in the  
 41 county that contains the state seat of government, when there is probable cause to believe the person  
 42 committed a crime within capitol police jurisdiction or when a person commits a crime in the  
 43 presence of an on-duty capitol police officer.

44 8.178. Any person who violates sections 8.172 to 8.174, or section 8.177, or any of the  
 45 traffic or parking regulations of the [commissioner] capitol police board shall be punished as  
 46 follows:

47 (1) Fines for traffic violations shall not, except as provided by section 301.143, exceed five  
 48 dollars for overparking, fifteen dollars for double parking and fifty dollars for speeding[;] ; and

49 (2) The circuit court of Cole County has authority to enforce [this law] the traffic or parking

- 3 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references
- 4 accordingly.
