12	3. In any action brought under this section, a court shall award reasonable attorney fees and costs to	
13	a prevailing plaintiff. In actions for injunctive relief	, a court shall deem a plaintiff to have prevailed if the

21	of law, the peace officer shall be personally liable and shall not be indemnified by the peace officer's

23	is less. Notwithstanding any provision of this section, if the peace officer's portion of the judgment is	
24	uncollectable from the peace officer, the peace officer's employer or insurance shall satisfy the full amount of	
25	the judgment or settlement. A public entity is not required to indemnify a peace officer if the peace officer	
26	was convicted of a criminal violation for the conduct from which the claim arises.	
27	5. A civil action under this section shall be commenced within two years after the cause of action
