2 after all of said section and line the following:

4 "41.676. The National Guard armory located in or nearest to Joplin shall be designated as
5 the "Sergeant Robert Wayne Crow Jr. Memorial Armory".

6 143.1032. 1. In each taxable year beginning on or after January 1, 2022, each individual or
7 corporation entitled to a tax refund in an amount sufficient to make a designation under this section
8 may designate that one dollar or any amount in excess of one dollar on a single return, and two
9 dollars or any amount in excess of two dollars on a combined return, of the refund due be credited to
10 the Missouri Medal of Honor fund. The contribution designation authorized by this section shall be
11 clearly and unambiguously printed on the first page of each income tax return form provided by this
12 state. If any individual or corporation that is not entitled to a tax refund in an amount sufficient to
13 make a designation under this section wishes to make a contribution to the Missouri Medal of Honor
14 fund, such individual or corporation may, by separate check, draft, or other negotiable instrument,
15 send in with the payment of taxes, or may send in separately, that amount, clearly designated for the
16 Missouri Medal of Honor fund, the individual or corporation wishes to contribute. The department
17 of revenue shall deposit such amount to the Missouri Medal of Honor fund as provided in subsection
18 2 of this section.

19 2. The director of revenue shall deposit at least monthly all contributions designated by
20 individuals under this section to the state treasurer for deposit to the Missouri Medal of Honor fund.
21 The fund shall be administered by the director of revenue.

22 3. The director of revenue shall deposit at least monthly all contributions designated by the
23 corporations under this section, less an amount sufficient to cover the cost of collection, handling,
24 and administration by the department of revenue during fiscal year 2021, to the Missouri Medal of
25 Honor fund.

26 4. A contribution designated under this section shall only be deposited in the Missouri
27 Medal of Honor fund after all other claims against the refund from which such contribution is to be
28 made have been satisfied.

29 5. Moneys deposited in the Missouri Medal of Honor fund shall be used by the department
30 of transportation to pay for the costs of the Missouri Medal of Honor signs.

31 6. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are
32 invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund.

33 227.299. 1. Except as provided in subsection 7 of this section, an organization or person
34 that seeks a bridge or highway designation on the state highway system to honor an event, place,
35 organization, or person who has been deceased for more than two years shall petition the department
36 of transportation by submitting the following:

1 (1) An application in a form prescribed by the director, describing the bridge or segment of
2 highway for which designation is sought and the proposed name of the bridge or relevant portion of
3 highway. The application shall include the name of at least one current member of the general
4 assembly who will sponsor the bridge or highway designation. The application may contain written
5 testimony for support of the bridge or highway designation;

6 (2) A list of at least one hundred signatures of individuals who support the naming of the
7 bridge or highway; and

8 (3) A fee to be determined by the commission to cover the costs of constructing and
9 maintaining the proposed signs. The fee shall not exceed the cost of constructing and maintaining
10 each sign.

11 2. All moneys received by the department of transportation for the construction and
12 maintenance of bridge or highway signs on the state highway system shall be deposited in the state
13 treasury to the credit of the state road fund.

14 3. The documents and fees required under this section shall be submitted to the department
15 of transportation no later than November first prior to the next regular session of the general
16 assembly to be approved or denied by the joint committee on transportation oversight during such
17 legislative session.

18 4. The department of transportation shall give notice of any proposed bridge or highway
19 designation on the state highway system in a manner reasonably calculated to advise the public of
20 such proposal. Reasonable notice shall include posting the proposal for the designation on the
21 department's official public website, and making available copies of the sign designation application
22 to any representative of the news media or public upon request and posting the application on a
23 bulletin board or other prominent public place which is easily accessible to the public and clearly
24 designated for that purpose at the principal office.

25 5. If the memorial highway designation requested by the organization is not approved by the
26 joint committee on transportation oversight, ninety-seven percent of the application fee shall be
27 refunded to the requesting organization.

28 6. Two highway signs shall be erected for each bridge and highway designation on the state
29 highway system processed under this section. When a named section of a highway crosses two or
30 more county lines, consideration shall be given by the department of transportation to allow
31 additional signage at the county lines or major intersections.

32 7. (1) Highway or bridge designations on the state highway system honoring fallen law
33 enforcement officers, members of the Armed Forces killed in the line of duty, Missouri recipients of
34 the Medal of Honor, emergency personnel killed while performing duties relating to their
35 employment, or state employees killed while serving the state shall not be subject to the provisions
36 of this section.

37 (2) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, beginning August 28, 2021, for
38 designations honoring Missouri Medal of Honor recipients, no fees shall be assessed and all costs
39 associated with such designations shall be funded by the department of transportation.

40 8. No bridge or portion of a highway on the state highway system may be named or
41 designated after more than one event, place, organization, or person. Each event, place,
42 organization, or person shall only be eligible for one bridge or highway designation.

43 9. Any highway signs erected for any bridge or highway designation on the state highway
44 system under the provisions of this section shall be erected and maintained for a twenty-year period.
45 After such period, the signs shall be subject to removal by the department of transportation and the
46 bridge or highway may be designated to honor events, places, organizations, or persons other than
47 the current designee. An existing highway or bridge designation processed under the provisions of
48 this section may be retained for additional twenty-year increments if, at least one year before the
49 designation's expiration, an application to the department of transportation is made to retain the

1 designation along with the required documents and all applicable fees required under this section.

2 10. For persons honored with designations on the state highway system under this chapter
 3 after August 28, 2021, the department of transportation shall post a link on its website to
 4 biographical information of such persons.

5 11. The provisions of this section shall apply to bridge or highway designations sought after
 6 August 28, 2006.

7 227.450. The portion of U.S. Highway 60 from the intersection of State Route O to the
 8 intersection of [State Highway 5] Leadhill Drive in Wright County shall be designated the "Spc.
 9 Justin Blake Carter Memorial Highway ~~[for Life]~~". The department of transportation shall erect and
 10 maintain appropriate signs designating such highway with the costs to be paid for by private
 11 donations.

12 227.463. The portion of Interstate 29 from its intersection of Interstate 70/U.S. State
 13 Highway 71/40 in Jackson County north to the bridge crossing over Nishnabotna River in Atchison
 14 County, except for those portions of Interstate 29 previously designated as of August 28, 2021, shall
 15 be designated the "Purple Heart Trail". Costs for such designation shall be paid by private
 16 donations.

17 227.464. The portion of Interstate 55 from State Highway O in Pemiscot County to U.S.
 18 Highway 40 in St. Louis City, except for those portions of Interstate 55 previously designated as of
 19 August 28, 2021, shall be designated the "Purple Heart Trail". Costs for such designation shall be
 20 paid by private donations.

21 227.465. The portion of Interstate 57 from the Missouri/Illinois state line in Mississippi
 22 County continuing south to U.S. State Highway 60/State Highway AA in Scott County shall be
 23 designated the "Purple Heart Trail". Costs for such designation shall be paid by private donations.

24 227.466. The portion of Interstate 64 from Interstate 70 from the city of Wentzville in St.
 25 Charles County continuing east to Interstate 55 at the Missouri/Illinois state line in St. Louis City,
 26 except for those portions of Interstate 64/US40/US61 previously designated as of August 28, 2021,
 27 shall be designated the "Purple Heart Trail". Costs for such designation shall be paid by private
 28 donations.

29 227.467. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter to the contrary, a highway's
 30 classification as a "Purple Heart Trail" shall not prevent a segment of such highway from being
 31 additionally designated as a memorial highway.

32 227.477. The portion of U.S. Business 71 from State Highway 76 West to State Highway
 33 EE in McDonald County shall be designated the "Army PFC Christopher Lee Marion Memorial
 34 Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating
 35 such highway, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

36 227.478. The portion of U.S. State Highway 160 from West BYP to County Road 115 in
 37 Greene County shall be designated the "Otis E Moore Memorial Highway". The department of
 38 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs to
 39 be paid by private donations.

40 227.486. The portion of U.S. State Highway 60 from CRD Mockingbird Road continuing
 41 east to State Highway PP in Webster County shall be designated as the "Army SGT Timothy J
 42 Sutton Memorial Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate
 43 signs designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

44 227.488. The bridge on U.S. State Highway 63 crossing over Business 63 in Adair County
 45 shall be designated the "U.S. Army SGT Brandon Maggart Memorial Bridge". The department of
 46 transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such bridge, with the costs to
 47 be paid for by private donations.

48 227.489. The bridge on U.S. Highway 63 crossing over the BSNF Railroad/Marceline Sub
 49 in La Plata in Macon County shall be designated as the "U.S. Army PFC Adam L Thomas Memorial

Bridge". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such bridge, with the costs to be paid for by private donations.

227.490. The bridge on U.S. State Highway 63 crossing over Patterson Street in Adair County shall be designated as the "U.S. Army SFC Matthew C Lewellen Memorial Bridge". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such bridge, with the costs to be paid for by private donations.

227.495. The portion of U.S. State Highway 54 from State Highway E to State Highway D in Cole County shall be designated as the "U.S. Army Specialist Michael Campbell Memorial Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.496. The portion of State Highway T from .05 miles west of Laretto Ridge Drive to Decker Road in the town of Labadie in Franklin County shall be designated as "Medal of Honor PVT George Phillips Memorial Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by the department.

227.497. The portion of U.S. State Highway 63 from Spruce Street to McKay Street within the city of Macon in Macon County shall be designated as the "US Army Sergeant Hugh C Dunn Memorial Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.498. The portion of Interstate 64 from Winghaven Boulevard to Prospect Road within the city of Lake St. Louis in St. Charles County shall be designated as "US Navy SEAL Scotty Wirtz Memorial Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.777. The bridge on State Highway 17 crossing over the BSNF Railroad south of the city of Crocker in Pulaski County shall be designated as "US Navy FA Paul Akers Jr Memorial Bridge". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such bridge, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.780. The portion of State Highway 163 from Stadium Boulevard/State Highway 740 continuing south to Mick Deaver Drive in Boone County shall be designated as "PFC Dale Raymond Jackson Memorial Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.781. The portion of State Highway 163 from Mick Deaver Drive to Old Route K in Boone County shall be designated as "Corporal Steven Lee Irvin Memorial Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.782. The portion of State Highway 163 from Old Route K to Green Meadows Drive in Boone County shall be designated as "CPL Daniel Joseph Heibel Memorial Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.783. The portion of State Highway 163 from Green Meadows Drive to Nifong in Boone County shall be designated as "LCPL Larry Harold Coleman Memorial Highway". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such highway, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.784. The bridge on U.S. State Highway 63 crossing over Beaver Creek in Phelps County shall be designated as "VFW Post 2025 Memorial Bridge". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such bridge, with the costs to be paid by private donations.

227.785. The bridge on State Highway 21 crossing over the Current River in Ripley County shall be designated as "Veterans Memorial Bridge". The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate signs designating such bridge, with the costs to be paid by private

1 donations.

2 227.793. The portion of Interstate 44 from State Highway 744/N. MulRoy Road continuing
 3 east to RA IS 44 Strafford/Greene County Line in Greene County shall be designated the
 4 “Nathanael Greene Highway”. The department of transportation shall erect and maintain appropriate
 5 signs designating such highway, with the cost to be paid for by private donations.

6 301.020. 1. Every owner of a motor vehicle or trailer, which shall be operated or driven
 7 upon the highways of this state, except as herein otherwise expressly provided, shall annually file,
 8 by mail or otherwise, in the office of the director of revenue, an application for registration on a
 9 blank to be furnished by the director of revenue for that purpose containing:

10 (1) A brief description of the motor vehicle or trailer to be registered, including the name of
 11 the manufacturer, the vehicle identification number, the amount of motive power of the motor
 12 vehicle, stated in figures of horsepower and whether the motor vehicle is to be registered as a motor
 13 vehicle primarily for business use as defined in section 301.010;

14 (2) The name, the applicant's identification number and address of the owner of such motor
 15 vehicle or trailer;

16 (3) The gross weight of the vehicle and the desired load in pounds if the vehicle is a
 17 commercial motor vehicle or trailer.

18 2. If the vehicle is a motor vehicle primarily for business use as defined in section 301.010
 19 and if such vehicle is ten years of age or less and has less than one hundred fifty thousand miles on
 20 the odometer, the director of revenue shall retain the odometer information provided in the vehicle
 21 inspection report, and provide for prompt access to such information, together with the vehicle
 22 identification number for the motor vehicle to which such information pertains, for a period of ten
 23 years after the receipt of such information. This section shall not apply unless:

24 (1) The application for the vehicle's certificate of ownership was submitted after July 1,
 25 1989; and

26 (2) The certificate was issued pursuant to a manufacturer's statement of origin.

27 3. If the vehicle is any motor vehicle other than a motor vehicle primarily for business use, a
 28 recreational motor vehicle, motorcycle, motortricycle, autocycle, bus, or any commercial motor
 29 vehicle licensed for over twelve thousand pounds and if such motor vehicle is ten years of age or
 30 less and has less than one hundred fifty thousand miles on the odometer, the director of revenue
 31 shall retain the odometer information provided in the vehicle inspection report, and provide for
 32 prompt access to such information, together with the vehicle identification number for the motor
 33 vehicle to which such information pertains, for a period of ten years after the receipt of such
 34 information. This subsection shall not apply unless:

35 (1) The application for the vehicle's certificate of ownership was submitted after July 1,
 36 1990; and

37 (2) The certificate was issued pursuant to a manufacturer's statement of origin.

38 4. If the vehicle qualifies as a reconstructed motor vehicle, motor change vehicle, specially
 39 constructed motor vehicle, non-USA-std motor vehicle, as defined in section 301.010, or prior
 40 salvage as referenced in section 301.573, the owner or lienholder shall surrender the certificate of
 41 ownership. The owner shall make an application for a new certificate of ownership, pay the
 42 required title fee, and obtain the vehicle examination certificate required pursuant to subsection 9 of
 43 section 301.190. If an insurance company pays a claim on a salvage vehicle as defined in section
 44 301.010 and the owner retains the vehicle, as prior salvage, the vehicle shall only be required to
 45 meet the examination requirements under subsection 10 of section 301.190. Notarized bills of sale
 46 along with a copy of the front and back of the certificate of ownership for all major component parts
 47 installed on the vehicle and invoices for all essential parts which are not defined as major
 48 component parts shall accompany the application for a new certificate of ownership. If the vehicle
 49 is a specially constructed motor vehicle, as defined in section 301.010, two pictures of the vehicle

1 shall be submitted with the application. If the vehicle is a kit vehicle, the applicant shall submit the
2 invoice and the manufacturer's statement of origin on the kit. If the vehicle requires the issuance of
3 a special number by the director of revenue or a replacement vehicle identification number, the
4 applicant shall submit the required application and application fee. All applications required under
5 this subsection shall be submitted with any applicable taxes which may be due on the purchase of
6 the vehicle or parts. The director of revenue shall appropriately designate "Reconstructed Motor
7 Vehicle", "Motor Change Vehicle", "Non-USA-Std Motor Vehicle", or "Specially Constructed
8 Motor Vehicle" on the current and all subsequent issues of the certificate of ownership of such
9 vehicle.

10 5. Every insurance company that pays a claim for repair of a motor vehicle which as the
11 result of such repairs becomes a reconstructed motor vehicle as defined in section 301.010 or that
12 pays a claim on a salvage vehicle as defined in section 301.010 and the owner is retaining the
13 vehicle shall in writing notify the owner of the vehicle, and in a first party claim, the lienholder if a
14 lien is in effect, that he is required to surrender the certificate of ownership, and the documents and
15 fees required pursuant to subsection 4 of this section to obtain a prior salvage motor vehicle
16 certificate of ownership or documents and fees as otherwise required by law to obtain a salvage
17 certificate of ownership, from the director of revenue. The insurance company shall within thirty
18 days of the payment of such claims report to the director of revenue the name and address of such
19 owner, the year, make, model, vehicle identification number, and license plate number of the
20 vehicle, and the date of loss and payment.

21 6. Anyone who fails to comply with the requirements of this section shall be guilty of a
22 class B misdemeanor.

23 7. An applicant for registration may make a donation of one dollar to promote a blindness
24 education, screening and treatment program. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and
25 deposit all such donations in the state treasury to the credit of the blindness education, screening and
26 treatment program fund established in section 209.015. Moneys in the blindness education,
27 screening and treatment program fund shall be used solely for the purposes established in section
28 209.015; except that the department of revenue shall retain no more than one percent for its
29 administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may be refused by
30 the applicant for registration at the time of issuance or renewal. The director shall inquire of each
31 applicant at the time the applicant presents the completed application to the director whether the
32 applicant is interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection.

33 8. An applicant for registration may make a donation of one dollar to promote an organ
34 donor program. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and deposit all such donations in
35 the state treasury to the credit of the organ donor program fund as established in sections 194.297 to
36 194.304. Moneys in the organ donor fund shall be used solely for the purposes established in
37 sections 194.297 to 194.304, except that the department of revenue shall retain no more than one
38 percent for its administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may
39 be refused by the applicant for registration at the time of issuance or renewal. The director shall
40 inquire of each applicant at the time the applicant presents the completed application to the director
41 whether the applicant is interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection.

42 9. An applicant for registration may make a donation of one dollar to the Missouri Medal of
43 Honor recipients fund. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and deposit all such
44 donations in the state treasury to the credit of the Missouri Medal of Honor recipients fund as
45 established in Section 1 of this Act. Moneys in the Medal of Honor recipients fund shall be used
46 solely for the purposes established in Section 1 of this Act, except that the department of revenue
47 shall retain no more than one percent for its administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this
48 subsection is voluntary and may be refused by the applicant for registration at the time of issuance
49 or renewal. The director shall inquire of each applicant at the time the applicant presents the

1 completed application to the director whether the applicant is interested in making the one dollar
 2 donation prescribed in this subsection.

3 302.171. 1. The director shall verify that an applicant for a driver's license is a Missouri
 4 resident or national of the United States or a noncitizen with a lawful immigration status, and a
 5 Missouri resident before accepting the application. The director shall not issue a driver's license for
 6 a period that exceeds the duration of an applicant's lawful immigration status in the United States.
 7 The director may establish procedures to verify the Missouri residency or United States
 8 naturalization or lawful immigration status and Missouri residency of the applicant and establish the
 9 duration of any driver's license issued under this section. An application for a license shall be made
 10 upon an approved form furnished by the director. Every application shall state the full name, Social
 11 Security number, age, height, weight, color of eyes, sex, residence, mailing address of the applicant,
 12 and the classification for which the applicant has been licensed, and, if so, when and by what state,
 13 and whether or not such license has ever been suspended, revoked, or disqualified, and, if revoked,
 14 suspended or disqualified, the date and reason for such suspension, revocation or disqualification
 15 and whether the applicant is making a one dollar donation to promote an organ donation program as
 16 prescribed in subsection 2, to promote a blindness education, screening and treatment program as
 17 prescribed in subsection 3, or the Missouri Medal of Honor recipients fund prescribed in subsection
 18 4 of this section. A driver's license, nondriver's license, or instruction permit issued under this
 19 chapter shall contain the applicant's legal name as it appears on a birth certificate or as legally
 20 changed through marriage or court order. No name change by common usage based on common
 21 law shall be permitted. The application shall also contain such information as the director may
 22 require to enable the director to determine the applicant's qualification for driving a motor vehicle;
 23 and shall state whether or not the applicant has been convicted in this or any other state for violating
 24 the laws of this or any other state or any ordinance of any municipality, relating to driving without a
 25 license, careless driving, or driving while intoxicated, or failing to stop after an accident and
 26 disclosing the applicant's identity, or driving a motor vehicle without the owner's consent. The
 27 application shall contain a certification by the applicant as to the truth of the facts stated therein.
 28 Every person who applies for a license to operate a motor vehicle who is less than twenty-one years
 29 of age shall be provided with educational materials relating to the hazards of driving while
 30 intoxicated, including information on penalties imposed by law for violation of the intoxication-
 31 related offenses of the state. Beginning January 1, 2001, if the applicant is less than eighteen years
 32 of age, the applicant must comply with all requirements for the issuance of an intermediate driver's
 33 license pursuant to section 302.178. For persons mobilized and deployed with the United States
 34 Armed Forces, an application under this subsection shall be considered satisfactory by the
 35 department of revenue if it is signed by a person who holds general power of attorney executed by
 36 the person deployed, provided the applicant meets all other requirements set by the director.

37 2. An applicant for a license may make a donation of one dollar to promote an organ donor
 38 program. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and deposit all such donations in the
 39 state treasury to the credit of the organ donor program fund established in sections 194.297 to
 40 194.304. Moneys in the organ donor program fund shall be used solely for the purposes established
 41 in sections 194.297 to 194.304 except that the department of revenue shall retain no more than one
 42 percent for its administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may
 43 be refused by the applicant for the license at the time of issuance or renewal of the license. The
 44 director shall make available an informational booklet or other informational sources on the
 45 importance of organ and tissue donations to applicants for licensure as designed by the organ
 46 donation advisory committee established in sections 194.297 to 194.304. The director shall inquire
 47 of each applicant at the time the licensee presents the completed application to the director whether
 48 the applicant is interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection and
 49 whether the applicant is interested in inclusion in the organ donor registry and shall also specifically

1 inform the licensee of the ability to consent to organ donation by placing a donor symbol sticker
 2 authorized and issued by the department of health and senior services on the back of his or her
 3 driver's license or identification card as prescribed by subdivision (1) of subsection 1 of section
 4 194.225. A symbol may be placed on the front of the license or identification card indicating the
 5 applicant's desire to be listed in the registry at the applicant's request at the time of his or her
 6 application for a driver's license or identification card, or the applicant may instead request an organ
 7 donor sticker from the department of health and senior services by application on the department of
 8 health and senior services' website. Upon receipt of an organ donor sticker sent by the department
 9 of health and senior services, the applicant shall place the sticker on the back of his or her driver's
 10 license or identification card to indicate that he or she has made an anatomical gift. The director
 11 shall notify the department of health and senior services of information obtained from applicants
 12 who indicate to the director that they are interested in registry participation, and the department of
 13 health and senior services shall enter the complete name, address, date of birth, race, gender and a
 14 unique personal identifier in the registry established in subsection 1 of section 194.304.

15 3. An applicant for a license may make a donation of one dollar to promote a blindness
 16 education, screening and treatment program. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and
 17 deposit all such donations in the state treasury to the credit of the blindness education, screening and
 18 treatment program fund established in section 209.015. Moneys in the blindness education,
 19 screening and treatment program fund shall be used solely for the purposes established in section
 20 209.015; except that the department of revenue shall retain no more than one percent for its
 21 administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this subsection is voluntary and may be refused by
 22 the applicant for the license at the time of issuance or renewal of the license. The director shall
 23 inquire of each applicant at the time the licensee presents the completed application to the director
 24 whether the applicant is interested in making the one dollar donation prescribed in this subsection.

25 4. An applicant for registration may make a donation of one dollar to the Missouri Medal of
 26 Honor recipients fund. The director of revenue shall collect the donations and deposit all such
 27 donations in the state treasury to the credit of the Missouri Medal of Honor recipients fund as
 28 established in Section 1 of this Act. Moneys in the Medal of Honor recipients fund shall be used
 29 solely for the purposes established in Section 1 of this Act, except that the department of revenue
 30 shall retain no more than one percent for its administrative costs. The donation prescribed in this
 31 subsection is voluntary and may be refused by the applicant for registration at the time of issuance
 32 or renewal. The director shall inquire of each applicant at the time the applicant presents the
 33 completed application to the director whether the applicant is interested in making the one dollar
 34 donation prescribed in this subsection.

35 5. Beginning July 1, 2005, the director shall deny the driving privilege of any person who
 36 commits fraud or deception during the examination process or who makes application for an
 37 instruction permit, driver's license, or nondriver's license which contains or is substantiated with
 38 false or fraudulent information or documentation, or who knowingly conceals a material fact or
 39 otherwise commits a fraud in any such application. The period of denial shall be one year from the
 40 effective date of the denial notice sent by the director. The denial shall become effective ten days
 41 after the date the denial notice is mailed to the person. The notice shall be mailed to the person at
 42 the last known address shown on the person's driving record. The notice shall be deemed received
 43 three days after mailing unless returned by the postal authorities. No such individual shall reapply
 44 for a driver's examination, instruction permit, driver's license, or nondriver's license until the period
 45 of denial is completed. No individual who is denied the driving privilege under this section shall be
 46 eligible for a limited driving privilege issued under section 302.309.

47 ~~[5.]~~ 6. All appeals of denials under this section shall be made as required by section
 48 302.311.

49 ~~[6.]~~ 7. The period of limitation for criminal prosecution under this section shall be extended

1 under subdivision (1) of subsection 3 of section 556.036.

2 [7.] 8. The director may promulgate rules and regulations necessary to administer and
3 enforce this section. No rule or portion of a rule promulgated pursuant to the authority of this
4 section shall become effective unless it has been promulgated pursuant to chapter 536.

5 [8.] 9. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter that requires an applicant to provide
6 proof of Missouri residency for renewal of a noncommercial driver's license, noncommercial
7 instruction permit, or nondriver's license, an applicant who is sixty-five years and older and who
8 was previously issued a Missouri noncommercial driver's license, noncommercial instruction
9 permit, or Missouri nondriver's license is exempt from showing proof of Missouri residency.

10 [9.] 10. Notwithstanding any provision of this chapter, for the renewal of a noncommercial
11 driver's license, noncommercial instruction permit, or nondriver's license, a photocopy of an
12 applicant's United States birth certificate along with another form of identification approved by the
13 department of revenue, including, but not limited to, United States military identification or United
14 States military discharge papers, shall constitute sufficient proof of Missouri citizenship.

15 [10.] 11. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, if an applicant does not meet
16 the requirements of subsection 8 of this section and does not have the required documents to prove
17 Missouri residency, United States naturalization, or lawful immigration status, the department may
18 issue a one-year driver's license renewal. This one-time renewal shall only be issued to an applicant
19 who previously has held a Missouri noncommercial driver's license, noncommercial instruction
20 permit, or nondriver's license for a period of fifteen years or more and who does not have the
21 required documents to prove Missouri residency, United States naturalization, or lawful immigration
22 status. After the expiration of the one-year period, no further renewal shall be provided without the
23 applicant producing proof of Missouri residency, United States naturalization, or lawful immigration
24 status.

25 Section 1. There is hereby created in the state treasury the "Missouri Medal of Honor
26 Recipients Fund". The fund shall consist of moneys donated pursuant to sections 301.020, 302.171,
27 and 143.1032 of this act. Unexpended balances in the fund at the end of any fiscal year shall not be
28 transferred to the general revenue fund or any other fund, the provisions of section 33.080 to the
29 contrary notwithstanding. Moneys in the fund shall be used to pay for memorial highway signs for
30 Missouri Medal of Honor recipients, and for the maintenance and repair of all such signs, whether
