1 AMEND House Bill No. 1088, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by inserting after all of said section and  
2 line the following:

4 "590.1150. 1. Prior to January 1, 2022, the attorney general shall create a database to  
5 coordinate the sharing of information between state, local, and federal law enforcement agencies  
6 concerning instances of excessive use of force related to law enforcement matters, accounting for  
7 applicable privacy and due process rights. All law enforcement agencies shall provide to the  
8 attorney general any information required to be disclosed under Section 590.118 relating to  
9 incidents that occurred prior to January 1, 2022.

10 2. The database described in subsection 1 of this section shall include a mechanism to track  
11 terminations or decertifications of peace officers, criminal convictions of peace officers for on-duty  
12 conduct, and civil judgments against peace officers. The database shall account for instances in  
13 which a peace officer resigns or retires while under active investigation but shall clearly state that  
14 the investigation was not completed and that the police officer may not have been afforded due  
15 process. The attorney general shall take appropriate steps to ensure that the information in the  
16 database consists only of instances in which peace officers were afforded due process or disclose  
17 that due process may not have been afforded.

18 3. The attorney general shall regularly and annually make available to the public aggregated  
19 and anonymized data from the database described in subsection 1 of this section, as consistent with  
20 applicable law.

21 590.1152. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if any peace officer is convicted of or  
22 pleads guilty or nolo contendere to a crime or is found civilly liable for acts or omissions that could  
23 otherwise amount to criminal conduct, the POST commission shall revoke the peace officer's  
24 certification under this chapter. The POST commission shall not reinstate the peace officer's  
25 certification or grant new certification to the peace officer unless the peace officer is exonerated for  
26 such offense by a court. The POST commission shall record each decertified peace officer in the  
27 database created under section 590.1150."; and
