AMEND House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 744, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by inserting after said section and line the following:
"455.010. As used in this chapter, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the
following terms shall mean:
(1) "Abuse" includes but is not limited to the occurrence of any of the following acts,
attempts or threats against a person who may be protected pursuant to this chapter, except abuse
shall not include abuse inflicted on a child by accidental means by an adult household member of
discipline of a child, including spanking, in a reasonable manner:
(a) "Assault", purposely or knowingly placing or attempting to place another in fear of
physical harm;
(b) "Battery", purposely or knowingly causing physical harm to another with or without a
deadly weapon;
(c) "Coercion", compelling another by force or threat of force to engage in conduct from
which the latter has a right to abstain or to abstain from conduct in which the person has a right t
engage; (d) "Harassmant" angaging in a numasaful ar knowing source of conduct involving mar
(d) "Harassment", engaging in a purposeful or knowing course of conduct involving mor than one incident that alarms or causes distress to an adult or child and serves no legitimate purp
The course of conduct must be such as would cause a reasonable adult or child to suffer substant
emotional distress and must actually cause substantial emotional distress to the petitioner or child
Such conduct might include, but is not limited to:
a. Following another about in a public place or places;
b. Peering in the window or lingering outside the residence of another; but does not inclu
constitutionally protected activity;
(e) "Sexual assault", causing or attempting to cause another to engage involuntarily in an
sexual act by force, threat of force, duress, or without that person's consent;
(f) "Unlawful imprisonment", holding, confining, detaining or abducting another person
against that person's will;
(2) "Adult", any person seventeen years of age or older or otherwise emancipated;
(3) "Child", any person under seventeen years of age unless otherwise emancipated;
(4) "Coercive control", purposely or unreasonably interfering with a person's free will an
personal liberty, which may include, but is not limited to, unreasonably engaging in the following
a. Isolating the person from friends, relatives, or other sources of support;
b. Depriving the person of basic necessities;
c. Controlling, regulating, or monitoring the person's movements, communications, daily
behavior, finances, economic resources, or access to services; or

d. Compelling the person by force, threat of force, or intimidation, including threats based 1 2 on actual or suspected immigration status, to engage in conduct from which the person has a right to 3 abstain or to abstain from conduct in which the person has a right to engage; (5) "Court", the circuit or associate circuit judge or a family court commissioner: 4 5 (6) "Disturbing the peace of the petitioner" or "disturbing the peace of the victim", conduct 6 that, based on the totality of the circumstances, destroys the mental or emotional calm of the 7 petitioner or the victim. Such conduct may be committed directly or indirectly, including through 8 the use of a third party, and by any method or through any means including, but not limited to, 9 telephone, online accounts, text messages, internet-connected devices, or other electronic 10 technologies. Such conduct may also include, but is not limited to, coercive control, as defined in this section; 11 12 [(5)] (7) "Domestic violence", abuse or stalking committed by a family or household 13 member, as such terms are defined in this section; 14 [(6)] (8) "Ex parte order of protection", an order of protection issued by the court before the 15 respondent has received notice of the petition or an opportunity to be heard on it; 16 (7) (9) "Family" or "household member", spouses, former spouses, any person related by 17 blood or marriage, persons who are presently residing together or have resided together in the past, 18 any person who is or has been in a continuing social relationship of a romantic or intimate nature 19 with the victim, and anyone who has a child in common regardless of whether they have been 20 married or have resided together at any time; [(8)] (10) "Full order of protection", an order of protection issued after a hearing on the 21 22 record where the respondent has received notice of the proceedings and has had an opportunity to be 23 heard: 24 [(9)] (11) "Order of protection", either an ex parte order of protection or a full order of 25 protection; 26 [(10)] (12) "Pending", exists or for which a hearing date has been set; [(11)] (13) "Petitioner", a family or household member who has been a victim of domestic 27 28 violence, or any person who has been the victim of stalking or sexual assault, or a person filing on 29 behalf of a child pursuant to section 455.503 who has filed a verified petition pursuant to the 30 provisions of section 455.020 or section 455.505; [(12)] (14) "Respondent", the family or household member alleged to have committed an act 31 32 of domestic violence, or person alleged to have committed an act of stalking or sexual assault, 33 against whom a verified petition has been filed or a person served on behalf of a child pursuant to 34 section 455.503; 35 [(13)] (15) "Sexual assault", as defined under subdivision (1) of this section; 36 [(14)] (16) "Stalking" is when any person purposely engages in an unwanted course of 37 conduct that causes alarm to another person, or a person who resides together in the same household 38 with the person seeking the order of protection when it is reasonable in that person's situation to 39 have been alarmed by the conduct. As used in this subdivision: 40 (a) "Alarm" means to cause fear of danger of physical harm; and 41 (b) "Course of conduct" means a pattern of conduct composed of two or more acts over a 42 period of time, however short, that serves no legitimate purpose. Such conduct may include, but is 43 not limited to, following the other person or unwanted communication or unwanted contact."; and 44 45 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references 46 accordingly.
