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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from **University of Missouri System** assume this proposal could have a significant financial impact on the University depending on the final language and implementation.

Officials from **Missouri State University** assume a potential positive fiscal impact due to increased flexibility in establishing tuition based on programs of study

Officials from **State Technical College of Missouri** assume this proposal could have a positive fiscal impact on the college.

Officials from the **University of Central Missouri** estimate a potential revenue impact of an indeterminate amount.

Officials from the **St. Charles Community College** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes, based on the <u>Tuition Differential Fee Report</u> by the Board of Governors of the State University System of Florida, the tuition differential fees ranged from \$35.14 to \$52.29 per credit hour for the 2017-18 academic year for an estimated total of \$269.6 million in differential tuition revenues. Oversight assumes there could be a positive impact to colleges and universities from this proposal; however, the impact is unknown. Oversight will show a range of impact \$0 (no revenue increase) to an unknown increase in revenue based on the differential rates of tuition that may be implemented.

Oversight assumes, if institutions charge differential tuition rates, this could have an unknown impact on the tuition reimbursement scholarships and grants offered by the State such as the A+ program and the Missouri State Tuition Assistance program. Oversight assumes this would be an indirect impact and will not a show a fiscal impact.

This bill defines "program of study" as a program offered by an institution of higher education to which students are admitted and allows public institutions of higher education to charge differential tuition rates based on program of study.
