ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Attorney General's Office, Office of Administration – Administrative Hearing Commission, Department of Commerce and Insurance, Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development, Department of Revenue, Department of Health and Senior Services, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Corrections, Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Department of Public Safety - Director's Office, Alcohol and Tobacco Control, Capitol Police, Fire Safety, National Guard, Highway Patrol, Veterans Commission, Department of Social Services, Missouri Ethics Commission, Missouri Department of Agriculture, Missouri Department of Conservation, Missouri Department of Transportation, MODOT – Patrol Employees' Retirement System, Office of Administration, Missouri State Public Defender, Office of the Secretary of State, Office of the Governor, Office of the Lieutenant Governor, Office of the State Auditor, Office of the State Treasurer, Economic & Policy Analysis Research Center, Missouri House of Representatives, Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, Joint Committee on Education, Legislative Research, Oversight Division, Missouri Senate, Missouri Lottery, Missouri State Employee Retirement System, Missouri Higher Education Loan Authority, Office of State Courts Administrator, and Missouri State Tax Commission each assume that the proposal will have no direct fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the City of Claycomo, City of Corder, Kansas City, and City of Springfield each assume that the proposal will have no direct fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the above organizations assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies and local political subdivisions.

Oversight notes that the House Committee Substitute adds subsection 2. (Section 407.028) allowing for opt-out clause in which both parties could agree to arbitration in a form of separate written agreement.

This bill specifies that no claim for damages brought under unlawful merchandising practices statutes will be subject to arbitration unless both parties agree to arbitration in a separate written agreement.
