FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§191.227 – Copies of medical records

Officials from the University of Missouri Health Care (UMHC) have reviewed the proposed legislation and have determined that as written it should not create additional expenses in excess of \$100,000 annually.

Based on previous conversations with UMHC officials, **Oversight** has determined that \$100,000 is the threshold for absorbable expenses for UMHC. Therefore, Oversight will reflect no fiscal impact for UMHC for fiscal note purposes.

Officials from the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Department of Public Safety - Missouri Veterans Commission, the Department of Social Services and the Hermann Area District Hospital each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other hospitals were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.
