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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

For the purpose of the proposed legislation, officials from the **Office of the State Public Defender (SPD)** state they cannot assume existing staff will be able to provide competent, effective representation for any new cases for indigent children. The SPD is currently providing legal representation in caseloads in excess of recognized standards.

In the FY 2018 Youth and Families report, OSCA indicated that 2,192 delinquency cases were filed by formal petition. SPD anticipates that 12 juvenile attorney specialists, specifically trained to represent children, would be necessary if this bill were passed.

Oversight inquired SPD regarding their response from last year, HB 1422, which included an '(Unknown)' fiscal impact. Upon further review of the current legislation, SPD had more of a specific response. **Oversight** does not have anything to the contrary and will reflect the impact as "Up to" the costs presented by SPD in the table below.

Officials from the Department of Social Services, the Office of the State Courts
Administrator (OSCA), the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of
Mental Health, the Department of Corrections and the Missouri Office of Prosecution
Services each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.
Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill specifies that if a child waives his or her right to counsel, such waiver shall be made in open court and be recorded and in writing. In determining whether a child has knowingly, intelligently, and voluntarily waived his or her right to counsel, the court shall look to the totality of the circumstances, as specified in the bill. If a child waives his or her right to counsel, the waiver shall only apply to that particular proceeding. The bill also specifies certain proceedings in which a child's right to counsel cannot be waived.

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This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
