FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

In response to a previous version, officials from the **City of Kansas City** assumed this proposal will have a negative fiscal impact on Kansas City in an indeterminate amount because Kansas City is sometimes able to generate savings on its contracts by renewing early and sometimes Kansas City needs to renew early to get scarce goods and services.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **City of Springfield** anticipated an unknown fiscal impact due to increased staff time renewing contracts. However, the impact is difficult to estimate because the term "definite action" is not defined in the statute so it is unclear what type of action would satisfy the statutory requirement.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Florissant Valley Fire Protection District** assumed this bill would create inefficiency in awarding and renewing contracts that will also likely have a financial impact on staff time and posting. This bill ties the hands of local jurisdictions to service their members and constituents in the most effective and efficient manner available, which in the long term, could increase costs.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **City of Springfield Utilities** assumed this proposal would result in an unknown fiscal impact because of the additional requirements for contract review.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **State Technical College of Missouri** assumed this proposal would result in a negative fiscal impact on the college that cannot be estimated.

Oversight notes while the local political subdivisions (LPS) addressed some concerns about negative unknown impacts from this proposal, Oversight assumes LPS are provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of activity each year. Oversight assumes these LPS could absorb the costs related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require additional staffing and duties at substantial costs, then the LPS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Oversight also assumes §162.091 allows for any public official who willfully neglects or refuses to perform any duty imposed upon such public official under certain chapters as defined in the proposal could be charged with a misdemeanor and could be subject to a civil claim for damages, including injunctive relief, compensatory damages, punitive damages, costs of litigation, and attorney's fees. Oversight assumes this may result in a cost to local political subdivisions.

Oversight received a limited number of responses from counties and school districts related to the fiscal impact of this proposal. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information available. Upon the receipt of additional responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education**, the **Missouri Office of Prosecution Services** and the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from **Boone County** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

In response to a previous version, officials from the City of Ballwin, the City of O'Fallon, the Ellisville Police Department, Kansas City Police Department, the St. Louis County Police Department, the Rolla Rural Fire Protection District, the Crawford County 911 Board, the High Point R-III School District, the Glasgow Village Street Light District, the Hancock Street Light District, the High Point Elementary School, the Howard County C-PWSD #1, the Jefferson County PWSD #7, the Lexington Water/Wastewater, the Little Blue Valley Sewer District, the Macon County PWSD #1, the Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District, the Platte County PWSD #6, the Schell City Water Department, the South River Drainage District, the Wayne County PWSD #2, the Missouri State University and the University of Missouri System each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other counties and school districts were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill prohibits the renewal of contracts earlier than three months prior to the expiration of any existing contract. The renewal of one contract shall not automatically entail agreement to a new contract. Definite action such as a vote shall be required to renew a contract and violations of the bill shall render contracts void and of no effect.

The proposal also allows a civil claim for damages against public officials.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
