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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

<u>§67.260 – Special permission to implement extended public health or safety closures</u>

Officials from the **Columbia/Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services** state there will be an unknown cost due to an increase in COVID-19 cases and other communicable diseases requiring disease investigation and contact tracing. It is impossible to estimate how many additional COVID-19 cases and other communicable diseases there will be during the time governing body would have to accept the order. If the order is rejected, the fiscal impact would be greater.

Oversight notes it is currently the responsibility of local public health agencies (LPHAs) to conduct disease investigation and contact tracing regardless of whether a statewide emergency has been proclaimed by the Governor. It is assumed any potential costs that <u>may</u> be incurred as a result of this proposal are indirect costs. Therefore, Oversight will present no fiscal impact for provisions of this proposal.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Missouri House of Representatives**, the **Missouri Senate**, the **City of Claycomo**, the **City of Corder**, the **City of Hughesville**, the **City of Kansas City**, the **City of O'Fallon**, the **City of Springfield**, the **City of St. Louis** and the **Newton County Health Department** each indicate this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

In response a previous version of this proposal, officials from the **City of Southwest City** stated this proposal will have a fiscal impact. Officials stated they are currently following all CDC and local health department guidelines regarding this issue. **Oversight** notes no additional information regarding the fiscal impact of this proposal was provided.

In response a previous version of this proposal, officials from the **City of Tipton** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Rule Promulgation

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assume this proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** note many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to

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implement the act. The Secretary of State's office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to Secretary of State's office for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The Secretary of State's office recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, they also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, they reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other cities, various county officials and county health departments were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.

This proposal contains an emergency clause.
