FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** assume this bill seeks to exclude those with serious mental illnesses from receiving a sentence of death.

The death penalty was reinstated in Missouri in 1977 with the first execution occurring in 1989. The average time for executing someone with a death sentence is 10 plus years, which is beyond the scope of fiscal analysis. On the last day of FY 2020, there were 21 offenders awaiting execution. The average age of these offenders was 50 years old. The average age of natural death in prison is 55 years old. Therefore, this group can expect to spend, on average, an additional five years in prison.

There have only been 2 offenders sentenced to death since 2015. The average time for executing someone with a death sentence is 10 plus years, and current rates of execution are very low (2 in FY2020, 0 in FY2019, 0 in FY2018, and 1 in FY2017). Therefore, the resentence from death to a life sentence or other long-term sentence in prison is not likely to have a significant operational impact on the department.

Oversight does not have information to the contrary and therefore, Oversight will reflect the information as provided by the DOC.

Officials from the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Attorney General's Office, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Social Services, the Missouri Office of Prosecution Services, the Office of the State Public Defender each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.
