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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section 324.009 – Professional Licensing Reciprocity

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** state this proposal revises the professional licensing reciprocity criteria necessary to legally practice an occupation or profession in the state of Missouri to include military occupational specialties issued by a branch or unit of the military. Applicants applying for licensure under the proposed legislation would fall under the same reciprocity process, fee and review as current applicants. Changing regulations and applicant licensure reviews are within the normal ebb and flow for the Division of Regulation and Licensure so minimal time and expense will be required to conduct the requirements of the proposed legislation.

The department anticipates being able to absorb these costs. However, until the FY22 budget is final, the department cannot identify specific funding sources.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

Officials from the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Revenue, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Agriculture, the Department of Transportation, the Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol and the Missouri National Guard and the Office of Administration - Administrative Hearing Commission each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.
