### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Office of Administration - Budget and Planning**, the **Department of Commerce and Insurance**, the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education**, the **Department of Higher Education**, the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Department of Natural Resources**, the **Department of Corrections**, the **Department of Labor and Industrial Relations**, the **Department of Revenue**, the **Department of Public Safety** (Office of the Director, Missouri Highway **Patrol**, Missouri National Guard, State Emergency Management Agency), the **Department of Social Services**, the **Office of the Governor**, the Joint Committee on Administrative **Rules**, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Missouri House of Representatives, the **Department of Transportation**, the **Office of the State Courts Administrator**, the **Office of the State Auditor**, the **Missouri Senate**, the **Oversight Division**, the **Legislative Research Division**, the **Office of the State Treasurer**, and the **State Tax Commission** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations for this proposal.

**Oversight** notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

In response to a previous version, officials from the Attorney General's Office, the Department of Public Safety (Office of the Director, Capitol Police, Alcohol & Tobacco Control, Fire Safety, Missouri Highway Patrol and Veterans Commission) the Missouri Lottery Commission the Missouri Office of Prosecution Services, the Department of Agriculture, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Missouri Ethics Commission, the Office of Administration (Administrative Hearing Commission), the Office of the State Public Defender and the University of Missouri System each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

**Oversight** notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

#### **Rule Promulgation**

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assume this proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** notes many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The Secretary of State's office is provided with core funding to handle a

certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to Secretary of State's office for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The Secretary of State's office recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, they also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, they reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

## House Amendment 1

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 657), officials from the **Glasgow Village Street Light District**, the **Hancock Street Light District**, the **High Point Elementary School District**, the **Little Blue Valley Sewer District**, the **Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District**, the **South River Drainage District**, the **Tipton Water/Wastewater District** and **Wayne County Pwsd** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

## House Amendment 2

**Oversight** assumes there is no fiscal impact to state or local governments as a result of House Amendment 2.

## House Amendment 3

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 177), officials from the cities of **Ballwin**, **Corder, Kansas City, Springfield, St. Louis** and **Urich** and the boards of election commissioners of **Jackson County, Kansas City, Platte County** and **St. Louis County** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. **Oversight** does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.
