FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§194.119, 333.041, 333.042, 333.061, 333.081, 333.315, 456.1-114, and 456.4-419 – Relating to deceased

Officials from the Attorney General's Office, the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Revenue, the Department of Social Services, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Kansas City Health Department and the Newton County Health Department assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note.

Rule Promulgation

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** notes many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The Secretary of State's office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to Secretary of State's office for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The Secretary of State's office recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the they also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the they can sustain within their core budget. Therefore, they reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other local public health agencies were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.
