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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Natural Resources, the Attorney General's Office, the Cass County Pwsd, the Macon County Pwsd, the Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District, the South River Drainage District each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

In response to the previous version of this proposal, the Glasgow Village Street Light District, the Hancock Street Light District, the High Point Elementary School District, the Little Blue Valley Sewer District, the Tipton Water/Wastewater District and Wayne County Pwsd each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

House Amendment 1 and House Amendment 1 to House Amendment 1

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 27), officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** stated Sections 610.020 require governmental bodies to post notices of meetings, proposed rules, ordinances, laws, or regulations to the governmental body's website and social media pages.

Posting notices on the department's website and social media pages are within the normal duties for the Department of Health and Senior Services so minimal time and expense will be required to conduct the requirements of the proposed legislation. The department anticipates being able to absorb these costs; however, until the FY22 budget is final, the department cannot identify specific funding sources.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for this agency.

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 27), officials from the **Office of Administration (OA)** stated his legislation requires meeting notices and minutes of open meetings to be posted on the public governmental body's website and social media pages. It also requires any public governmental body to post any proposed rules, ordinances, laws or regulations to a website and social media pages within 24 hours after the meeting in which they are proposed. Similarly, the final text of any rule, ordinance, law or regulation which is adopted must be posted to the public governmental body's website and social media pages within 24

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hours of adoption. OA estimates that 1 FTE Administrative Support Staff at \$35,000 annually would be needed to ensure that OA remains in compliance with the specified requirements and timeframes.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect the estimated FTE requested by OA to the General Revenue Fund.

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 27), officials the **Missouri Senate** anticipated an impact if the proposed legislation passes. The impact could be absorbed using existing resources for just this one occurrence.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for this agency.

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 27), officials from the Attorney General's Office, the Department of Commerce and Insurance, the Department of Economic Development, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Department of Revenue, the Department of Public Safety (Office of the Director, Capitol Police, Alcohol & Tobacco Control, Fire Safety, Gaming Commission, Missouri Highway Patrol, Missouri National Guard, State Emergency Management Agency and Veterans Commission), the Department of Social Services, the Office of the Governor, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, the Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement, the Missouri Lottery Commission, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Department of Agriculture, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Missouri Ethics Commission, the Missouri House of Representatives, the Department of Transportation, the Office of Prosecution Services, the Office of Administration (Administrative Hearing Commission and Budget and Planning), the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Office of the State Auditor, the Missouri Senate, the Office of the State Public Defender, the Office of the State Treasurer and the State Tax Commission each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations for this proposal.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note for these agencies.

Rule Promulgation

In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 27), officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assumed this proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact beyond its current appropriation.

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In response to a similar proposal from this year (HB 27), officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State** noted many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The Secretary of State's office is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to Secretary of State's office for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The Secretary of State's office recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, they also recognize that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what our office can sustain with our core budget. Therefore, they reserve the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other utilities were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill adds individually identifiable customer usage and billing records for customers of municipally owned utilities to the list of records that are exempt from disclosure under the Sunshine Law, except that a municipally owned utility must make available the customer's name, billing address, location of service and dates of service for a commercial service account.

This bill requires posting notice, required under Section 610.020, RSMo, of the Open Records Law commonly known as the Sunshine Law, of meeting times, dates, places, and agendas as well as minutes of open meetings on a public governmental body's website and social media pages. In addition, public governmental bodies must post proposed and adopted rules, ordinances, laws, or regulations on their website and social media pages within 24 hours after the meeting at which they are proposed or adopted exclusive of weekends and holidays.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
