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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** estimate that approximately 10 workgroups will be needed at an average cost of \$7,500 per workgroup (\$75,000 in total). This cost will be spread out over multiple years as it will take some time to update the standards for all areas. Therefore, the Department will show the impact over a three year period with a range of \$0 - \$25,000 per year as the workgroups are on an as needed basis.

Oversight does not have information to the contrary and therefore, Oversight will reflect the estimates as provided by DESE.

Officials from the **Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their department.

Officials from the **High Point R-III School District** and the **Springfield Public Schools** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their schools.

Officials from the Lee's Summit R-VII Schools state the cost is minimal and would amount to the cost of the ACT exam for students.

Oversight assumes school districts will not be materially impacted by this proposal.

FISCAL IMPACT – Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill requires the State Board of Education, in consultation with the Career and Technical Advisory Council, to develop a statewide plan establishing the minimum requirements for a Career and Technical Education (CTE) Certificate. The statewide plan will match workforce needs with appropriate educational resources. Each local school district shall determine the curriculum, programs of study, and course offerings based on the requirements of the statewide plan. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education is required to convene workgroups, as needed, from each CTE program area to develop written model curriculum frameworks that may be used by districts.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
