FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Office of Administration - Budget and Planning** state Section 1.370 prohibits state agencies or political subdivisions from conducting business with any financial institution that does not attest annually that they do not have a policy, guidance, or directive against conducting business with a firearm business. Any person who falsely attests that an institution does not have such a policy is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. To the extent any related fines are deposited in the state treasury, Total State Revenues may be impacted.

Officials from the **Department of Mental Health** deferred to the Office of Administration.

Officials from the **Office of Administration (OA)** state the proposed legislation will require OA/Purchasing to include bid language and exhibits for vendor to self-certification/attestation that the vendor does not discriminate against firearms manufacturers to ensure that contracts are not awarded to such entities so that subsequent expenditures under the contract are not made to such entities.

OA-Purchasing and OA- Facilities Management, Design, Construction each believe that the impact of this bill is less than \$10,000 total. However, until the FY22 budget is finalized, specific funding sources cannot be identified.

At this time, it is believed that the additional staff time and resources can be absorbed by FMDC. However, if there are multiple pieces of legislation passed where FMDC has responded that the costs can be absorbed, FMDC would need to reevaluate to see if additional staff and associated expenses would then be required.

Oversight assumes the proposal would not create a material amount of fiscal impact to the state or any local political subdivision.

Officials from the Attorney General's Office, Office of Administration - Administrative Hearing Commission, Department of Commerce and Insurance, Department of Economic Development, Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Higher Education and Workforce Development, Department of Mental Health, Department of Natural Resources, Department of Revenue, Department of Public Safety (Division of Alcohol and Tobacco Control, Capitol Police, Fire Safety, Director's Office, Gaming Commission, National Guard, Highway Patrol, Veterans' Commission, SEMA), Department of Social Services, Missouri Department of Agriculture, Missouri Department of Conservation, Missouri Ethics Commission, Missouri Department of Transportation, MoDOT & Patrol Employees' Retirement System, Office of the Secretary of State, Office of the State Public Defender, Office of the Governor, Office of the Lieutenant Governor, L.R. Office of the State Auditor, Missouri House of Representatives, Missouri Senate, Missouri Lottery, Missouri Office of Prosecution Services, Missouri State Employee's Retirement System, Office of the State Courts Administrator, Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, and the State Tax Commission each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **University of Missouri** state they are unable to determine the financial impact of the proposed legislation. Switching financial institutions could cause unexpected costs, but their policies as related to the proposed legislation are unknown.

Officials from the city of **Claycomo**, **Corder**, **O'Fallon**, **Springfield**, and **St. Louis** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective cities. Officials from **Kansas City**; however, state the bill could result in a negative fiscal impact of an indeterminate amount.

Officials from the Boone County/Columbia Health Department, Kansas City Health Department, Newton County Health Department, Missouri State University, Northwest Missouri State University, State Technical College of Missouri and the University of Central Missouri each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective entities.
