Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other state agencies, cities, counties, schools, colleges, and universities were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. FISCAL DESCRIPTION



This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.

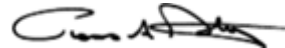
