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### **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

§192.027 – Relating to infection diseases

Officials from the **City of Springfield (Springfield)** state Springfield anticipates a negative fiscal impact of an unknown amount from this bill due to the inability to use effective mitigation strategies to stop the spread of communicable diseases which may increase the cost of contact tracing and fighting diseases. It is impossible to estimate the amount of negative fiscal impact because it is unknown how many additional cases of communicable disease might result from this bill.

Officials from the Columbia/Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services (PHHS) state there will be an unknown cost due to an increase in COVID-19 cases and other communicable diseases requiring disease investigation and contact tracing. It is impossible to estimate how many additional COVID-19 cases and other communicable disease cases there will be as a result of not quarantining close contacts or taking appropriate actions to prevent the spread of illness in various properties.

Officials from the City of Kansas City Health Department assume the proposal would have an indeterminate fiscal impact.

Oversight notes it is currently the responsibility of local public health agencies (LPHAs) to conduct disease investigation and contact tracing regardless of whether a statewide emergency has been proclaimed by the governor. It is assumed any potential costs that may be incurred as a result of this proposal are indirect costs. Therefore, Oversight will present no fiscal impact for provisions of this proposal that relate to communicable diseases and potential impacts incurred by local governments and public health departments.

Officials from the Department of Social Services, the Missouri Office of Prosecution Services, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the City of Claycomo, the City of Corder, the City of Kansas City, the City of O'Fallon, and the Newton County Health Department each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

In response to the previous version of this proposal, officials from the Attorney General's Office, the Department of Health and Senior Services and the City of St. Louis each assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

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**Oversight** only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other local public health agencies, cities and various county officials were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.
