AN ACT

To repeal section 304.820, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the use of hand-held wireless communication devices, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 304.820, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 304.820, to read as follows:

304.820. 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person twenty-one years of age or younger operating a moving motor vehicle upon the highways of this state shall, by means of a hand-held electronic wireless [communications] communication device, send, read, or write a text message or electronic message.

5 2. Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person shall operate a commercial 6 motor vehicle while using a hand-held mobile telephone.

3. Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person shall operate a commercial
motor vehicle while using a wireless [communications] communication device to send, read,
or write a text message or electronic message.

10 4. Except as otherwise provided in this section, no person shall operate a motor 11 vehicle within a school zone or within a construction zone or work zone while using a hand-12 held wireless communication device in any manner while operating such vehicle. 13 Prohibited uses shall include, but not be limited to reading, composing, viewing, or posting 14 any electronic message; initiating, receiving, or conducting a conversation; or manually 15 typing data into any electronic wireless communication device. For purposes of this 16 subsection, "school zone" means any area upon or around any street or highway as defined 17 in section 302.010 that is visibly marked by a sign erected by a county or municipality as

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an area in which a school building is located and the sections of street or highway on or 18 19 adjacent to the school property that are designated by signs indicating that it is a school 20 zone and showing the posted speed limit. "Construction zone" or "work zone" means any 21 area upon or around any highway as defined in section 302.010 which is visibly marked 22 by the department of transportation or a contractor or subcontractor performing work for 23 the department of transportation as an area where construction, maintenance, incident 24 removal, or other work is temporarily occurring. The term "work zone" or "construction 25 zone" also includes the lanes of highway leading up to the area upon which an activity 26 described in this subsection is being performed, beginning at the point where appropriate 27 signs or traffic control devices are posted or placed.

5. The provisions of subsection 1 through subsection [3] 4 of this section shall not apply
 to a person operating:

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(1) An authorized emergency vehicle; or

(c) Prevent injury to a person or property; or

31 (2) A moving motor vehicle while using a hand-held electronic wireless
 32 [communications] communication device to:

33 (a) Report illegal activity;

34 (b) Summon medical or other emergency help;

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36 (d) Relay information between a transit or for-hire operator and that operator's 37 dispatcher, in which the device is permanently affixed to the vehicle.

[5.] 6. Nothing in this section shall be construed or interpreted as prohibiting a person
 from making or taking part in a telephone call, by means of a hand-held electronic wireless
 [communications] communication device, while operating a noncommercial motor vehicle upon
 the highways of this state.

42 [6.] 7. As used in this section, "electronic message" means a self-contained piece of 43 digital communication that is designed or intended to be transmitted between hand-held 44 electronic wireless communication devices. "Electronic message" includes, but is not limited 45 to, electronic mail, a text message, an instant message, or a command or request to access an 46 internet site.

47 [7.] 8. As used in this section, "hand-held electronic wireless [communications] 48 communication device" includes any hand-held cellular phone[, palm pilot, blackberry,] or other 49 mobile electronic device used to communicate verbally or by text or electronic messaging, but 50 shall not apply to any device that is permanently embedded into the architecture and design of 51 the motor vehicle. 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52 [8.] 9. As used in this section, "making or taking part in a telephone call" means listening 53 to or engaging in verbal communication through a hand-held electronic wireless communication 54 device.

55 [9-] 10. As used in this section, "send, read, or write a text message or electronic 56 message" means using a hand-held electronic wireless [telecommunications] telecommunication 57 device to manually communicate with any person by using an electronic message. Sending, 58 reading, or writing a text message or electronic message does not include reading, selecting, or 59 entering a phone number or name into a hand-held electronic wireless [communications] 60 communication device for the purpose of making a telephone call.

61 [10.] **11.** A violation of this section shall be deemed an infraction and shall be deemed 62 a moving violation for purposes of point assessment under section 302.302.

[11.] 12. The state preempts the field of regulating the use of hand-held electronic wireless [communications] communication devices in motor vehicles, and the provisions of this section shall supercede any local laws, ordinances, orders, rules, or regulations enacted by a county, municipality, or other political subdivision to regulate the use of hand-held electronic wireless communication devices by the operator of a motor vehicle.

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[12.] 13. The provisions of this section shall not apply to:

69 (1) The operator of a vehicle that is lawfully parked or stopped;

70 (2) Any of the following while in the performance of their official duties: a law 71 enforcement officer; a member of a fire department; or the operator of a public or private 72 ambulance;

(3) The use of factory-installed or aftermarket global positioning systems (GPS) or
 wireless [communications] communication devices used to transmit or receive data as part of
 a digital dispatch system;

76 (4) The use of voice-operated technology;

(5) The use of two-way radio transmitters or receivers by a licensee of the FederalCommunications Commission in the Amateur Radio Service.

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
