AN ACT

To repeal section 32.056, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to confidentiality of motor vehicle registration records.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 32.056, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 32.056, to read as follows:

32.056. Except for uses permitted under 18 U.S.C. Section 2721(b)(1), the department of revenue shall not release the home address of or any information that identifies any vehicle 2 owned or leased by any person who is a county, state, or federal parole officer[-]; a federal 3 pretrial officer[,]; a peace officer pursuant to section 590.010[,]; a person employed by the 4 Missouri department of corrections; any jailer or corrections officer of the state or any 5 6 political subdivision of the state; a person vested by Article V, Section 1 of the Missouri Constitution with the judicial power of the state^[-]; a member of the federal judiciary^[-]; or a 7 8 member of such person's immediate family contained in the department's motor vehicle or driver 9 registration records, based on a specific request for such information from any person. Any such 10 person may notify the department of his or her status and the department shall protect the confidentiality of the home address and vehicle records on such a person and his or her 11 immediate family as required by this section. This section shall not prohibit the department from 12 releasing information on a motor registration list pursuant to section 32.055 or from releasing 13 information on any officer who holds a class A, B or C commercial driver's license pursuant to 14 the Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act of 1999, as amended, 49 U.S.C. 31309. 15
