2	WHEREAS, people of color in the United States are disproportionately the victims of shootings, chokeholds, and other uses of excessive force by law enforcement officers; and

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12	WHEREAS, the use of excessive force during a period of pretrial detention constitutes
13	the deprivation of due process under the Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments to the Constitution
14	of the United States, which guarantee the right of every person in the United States to be free
15	from arbitrary interference with the liberty of that person at the hands of law enforcement

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WHEREAS, the use of excessive force during a term of imprisonment constitutes the use of cruel and unusual punishment under the Eighth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which guarantees the right of every person in the United States to be free from cruel and unusual punishment at the hands of law enforcement officers; and

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23 24 25	WHEREAS, the rule of law in the United States and in the state of Missouri is undermined when law enforcement officers engage in conduct inconsistent with the Constitution of the United States; and
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27 28	WHEREAS, it is a fundamental principle of a democratic society that law enforcement officers should be held to account for their actions; and
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30 31	WHEREAS, it is necessary to focus attention upon legislation to address violence committed by law enforcement and law enforcement officer accountability:
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33 34 35 36 37	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of Representatives of the One Hundred First General Assembly, First Regular Session, hereby urge a commitment to addressing police violence, particularly against people of color, and ensuring that law enforcement officers who engage in misconduct, discrimination, or inappropriate use of force are held accountable for their actions; and
