2 3	WHEREAS, SSM Health currently operates a hospital in St. Charles County, St. Joseph Hospital, which is designated by the Missouri department of health and senior services as a level II trauma center; and
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5 6	WHEREAS, St. Charles County has a population of over three hundred ninety thousand people and has no level I trauma center and no other level II trauma center; and
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8 9 10 11	WHEREAS, in September 2020, SSM Health announced a decision to terminate its trauma services at St. Joseph Hospital in St. Charles County, placing the health and safety of the residents of St. Charles County and the nearby counties of Lincoln and Warren at greater risk due to the longer transportation times for trauma patients that will result from such termination; and
12 13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, an often-congested section of highway and the Missouri River separate the residents of the counties of St. Charles, Lincoln, and Warren from the next nearest level II trauma center, which will add to the transportation times for patients in critical need of the lifesaving services these centers provide; and
18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, promises were made to the City and County of St. Charles of major investment and expansion of the existing St. Joseph Hospital by SSM Health in exchange for public funding of major road and aesthetic improvements and the assistance of the local government in relocating and securing a site for a United States Post Office to make room for

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such expansion and improvements; and

24	WHEREAS, these promises were not kept by SSM Health, which now claims it cannot
25	afford to maintain its trauma services for the residents of St. Charles County and the surrounding
26	counties even while it has expended hundreds of millions of dollars in other expansions and has
27	failed to provide evidence that the system as a whole is unable to maintain the trauma services
28	at St. Joseph Hospital; and
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30	WHEREAS, the removal of trauma services and the termination of other services appear
31	to be the first steps towards the ultimate closure of St. Joseph Hospital, at a time when Missouri
32	appears to have insufficient hospital capacity to handle the current pandemic, further reducing
33	the state's ability to respond to any future public health crisis; and
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35	WHEREAS, SSM Health voluntarily sought the designation of level II trauma center for
36	St. Joseph Hospital and received the designation to become part of the state's network of trauma-
37	receiving hospitals:
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39	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the members of the House of
40	Representatives of the One Hundred First General Assembly, First Regular Session, the Senate
41	concurring therein, hereby urge SSM Health to reconsider its decision to terminate trauma
42	services at St. Joseph Hospital in St. Charles County and seek input from the general public and
43	local city and county governments, fire districts, fire departments, ambulance districts, and law
44	enforcement agencies before moving forward with its decision; and
