2 3 4	WHEREAS, freedom of speech is a fundamental right recognized throughout our society and enshrined in Article I, Section 8 of the Constitution of Missouri and in the First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States; and
5 6 7 8 9	WHEREAS, federal law, under 26 U.S.C. Section 501 and related statutes and regulations, provides a federal income tax exemption to nonprofit organizations including, but not limited to, certain religious organizations, but requires such nonprofit organizations to refrain from engaging in certain forms of political speech in order to maintain their tax-exempt status; and
1011121314	WHEREAS, many religious organizations desire a greater opportunity to speak politically on matters relating to elections and campaigns and desire the opportunity to publicly endorse and oppose specific electoral candidates and political campaigns; and
15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, in order for such religious organizations to secure these opportunities without losing their tax-exempt status, the United States Congress must first pass legislation that amends certain existing provisions of the Internal Revenue Code; and
19 20 21 22	WHEREAS, the members of the Missouri House of Representatives believe that such an amendment to the Internal Revenue Code would be proper and would advance the cause of freedom of speech for religious organizations:
