AN ACT

To repeal sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to absentee voting.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, RSMo, are repealed and three new 2 sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, to read 3 as follows:

115.277. 1. Except as provided in subsections 2, 3, 4, and 5 of this section, any registered voter of this state may vote by absentee ballot for all candidates and issues for which such voter [would be] is eligible to vote at the polling place [if such voter expects to be prevented from going to the polls to vote on election day due to:

(1) Absence on election day from the jurisdiction of the election authority in which such
 voter is registered to vote;

7 (2) Incapacity or confinement due to illness or physical disability, including a person

- 8 who is primarily responsible for the physical care of a person who is incapacitated or confined
- 9 due to illness or disability;
- 10 <u>(3) Religious belief or practice;</u>

(4) Employment as an election authority, as a member of an election authority, or by an
 election authority at a location other than such voter's polling place;

13 (5) Incarceration, provided all qualifications for voting are retained;

14 (6) Certified participation in the address confidentiality program established under

15 sections 589.660 to 589.681 because of safety concerns; or

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

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(7) For an election that occurs during the year 2020, the voter has contracted or is in an
 at-risk category for contracting or transmitting severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus
 2. This subdivision shall expire on December 31, 2020].

19 2. Any covered voter who is eligible to register and vote in this state may vote in any 20 election for federal office, statewide office, state legislative office, or statewide ballot initiatives 21 by submitting a federal postcard application to apply to vote by absentee ballot or by submitting 22 a federal postcard application at the polling place even though the person is not registered. A 23 federal postcard application submitted by a covered voter pursuant to this subsection shall also 24 serve as a voter registration application under section 115.908 and the election authority shall, 25 if satisfied that the applicant is entitled to register, place the voter's name on the voter registration 26 file. Each covered voter may vote by absentee ballot or, upon submitting an affidavit that the 27 person is qualified to vote in the election, may vote at the person's polling place.

3. Any interstate former resident may vote by absentee ballot for presidential and vicepresidential electors.

4. Any intrastate new resident may vote by absentee ballot at the election for presidential
and vice presidential electors, United States senator, representative in Congress, statewide
elected officials and statewide questions, propositions and amendments from such resident's new
jurisdiction of residence after registering to vote in such resident's new jurisdiction of residence.

5. Any new resident may vote by absentee ballot for presidential and vice presidential electors after registering to vote in such resident's new jurisdiction of residence.

36 [6. For purposes of this section, the voters who are in an at-risk category for contracting
 37 or transmitting severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 are voters who:

38 (1) Are sixty-five years of age or older;

39 (2) Live in a long-term care facility licensed under chapter 198;

40 (3) Have chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma;

41 (4) Have serious heart conditions;

42 (5) Are immunocompromised;

43 <u>(6) Have diabetes;</u>

44 (7) Have chronic kidney disease and are undergoing dialysis; or

45 <u>(8) Have liver disease.</u>]

115.279. 1. Application for an absentee ballot may be made by the applicant in person, or by mail, or for the applicant, in person, by his or her guardian or a relative within the second degree by consanguinity or affinity. The election authority shall accept applications by facsimile transmission and by electronic mail within the limits of its telecommunications capacity.

5 2. Each application shall be made to the election authority of the jurisdiction in which 6 the person is or would be registered. Each application shall be in writing and shall state the

applicant's name, address at which he or she is or would be registered, [his or her reason for 7 voting an absentee ballot,] whether the applicant is incapacitated or confined due to illness 8 9 or physical disability or is a person who is primarily responsible for the physical care of 10 a person who is incapacitated or confined due to illness or physical disability, the address to which the ballot is to be mailed, if mailing is requested, and for absent uniformed services and 11 12 overseas applicants, the applicant's email address if electronic transmission is requested. If the 13 [reason for the applicant voting absentee is due to the reasons established under subdivision (6) 14 of subsection 1 of section 115.277] applicant is a certified participant in the address 15 confidentiality program established under sections 589.660 to 589.681, the applicant shall 16 state the voter's identification information provided by the address confidentiality program in lieu of the applicant's name, address at which he or she is or would be registered, and address to 17 18 which the ballot is to be mailed, if mailing is requested. Each application to vote in a primary 19 election shall also state which ballot the applicant wishes to receive. If any application fails to 20 designate a ballot, the election authority shall, within three working days after receiving the 21 application, notify the applicant by mail that it will be unable to deliver an absentee ballot until 22 the applicant designates which political party ballot he or she wishes to receive. If the applicant 23 does not respond to the request for political party designation, the election authority is authorized 24 to provide the voter with that part of the ballot for which no political party designation is 25 required.

26 3. [Except as provided in subsection 3 of section 115.281.] All applications for absentee 27 ballots received prior to the sixth Tuesday before an election shall be stored at the office of the 28 election authority until such time as the applications are processed in accordance with section 29 115.281. No application for an absentee ballot received in the office of the election authority by 30 mail, by facsimile transmission, by electronic mail, or by a guardian or relative after 5:00 p.m. 31 on the second Wednesday immediately prior to the election shall be accepted by any election authority. No application for an absentee ballot submitted by the applicant in person after 5:00 32 33 p.m. on the day before the election shall be accepted by any election authority, except as 34 provided in subsections 6, 8 and 9 of this section.

35 4. Each application for an absentee ballot shall be signed by the applicant or, if the application is made by a guardian or relative pursuant to this section, the application shall be 36 37 signed by the guardian or relative, who shall note on the application his or her relationship to the 38 applicant. If an applicant, guardian or relative is blind, unable to read or write the English 39 language or physically incapable of signing the application, he or she shall sign by mark, 40 witnessed by the signature of an election official or person of his or her own choosing. Any 41 person who knowingly makes, delivers or mails a fraudulent absentee ballot application shall be 42 guilty of a class one election offense.

43 5. (1) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any resident of the state of Missouri who 44 resides outside the boundaries of the United States or who is on active duty with the Armed 45 Forces of the United States or members of their immediate family living with them may request 46 an absentee ballot for both the primary and subsequent general election with one application.

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(2) The election authority shall provide each absent uniformed services voter and each 48 overseas voter who submits a voter registration application or an absentee ballot request, if the 49 election authority rejects the application or request, with the reasons for the rejection.

50 (3) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, if a standard oath regarding material 51 misstatements of fact is adopted for uniformed and overseas voters pursuant to the Help America 52 Vote Act of 2002, the election authority shall accept such oath for voter registration, absentee 53 ballot, or other election-related materials.

54 (4) Not later than sixty days after the date of each regularly scheduled general election 55 for federal office, each election authority which administered the election shall submit to the 56 secretary of state in a format prescribed by the secretary a report on the combined number of 57 absentee ballots transmitted to, and returned by, absent uniformed services voters and overseas 58 voters for the election. The secretary shall submit to the Election Assistance Commission a 59 combined report of such information not later than ninety days after the date of each regularly 60 scheduled general election for federal office and in a standardized format developed by the 61 commission pursuant to the Help America Vote Act of 2002. The secretary shall make the report 62 available to the general public.

63 (5) As used in this section, the terms "absent uniformed services voter" and "overseas 64 voter" shall have the meaning prescribed in 52 U.S.C. Section 20310.

65 6. An application for an absentee ballot by a new resident shall be submitted in person 66 by the applicant in the office of the election authority in the election jurisdiction in which such applicant resides. The application shall be received by the election authority no later than 7:00 67 68 p.m. on the day of the election. Such application shall be in the form of an affidavit, executed 69 in duplicate in the presence of the election authority or any authorized officer of the election 70 authority, and in substantially the following form:

An application for an absentee ballot by an interstate former resident shall be received in the office of the election authority where the applicant was formerly registered by 5:00 p.m. on the second Wednesday immediately prior to the election, unless the application is made in person by the applicant in the office of the election authority, in which case such application shall be made no later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election.

115.283. 1. Each ballot envelope shall bear a statement on which the voter shall state the voter's name, the voter's voting address, and the voter's mailing address and the voter's 2 3 reason for voting an absentee ballot]. If the [reason for the voter voting absentee is due to the reasons established under subdivision (6) of subsection 1 of section 115.277,] applicant is a 4 certified participant in the address confidentiality program established under sections 5 6 **589.660** to **589.681**, the voter shall state the voter's identification information provided by the address confidentiality program in lieu of the applicant's name, voting address, and mailing 7 8 address. On the form, the voter shall also state under penalties of perjury that the voter is 9 qualified to vote in the election, that the voter has not previously voted and will not vote again 10 in the election, that the voter has personally marked the voter's ballot in secret or supervised the 11 marking of the voter's ballot if the voter is unable to mark it, that the ballot has been placed in 12 the ballot envelope and sealed by the voter or under the voter's supervision if the voter is unable 13 to seal it, and that all information contained in the statement is true. In addition, any person 14 providing assistance to the absentee voter shall include a statement on the envelope identifying 15 the person providing assistance under penalties of perjury. Persons authorized to vote only for 16 federal and statewide officers shall also state their former Missouri residence.

- 168 [9.] 8. No notary shall charge or collect a fee for notarizing the signature on any absentee
 169 ballot or absentee voter registration.
- 170 [10.] 9. A notary public who charges more than the maximum fee specified or who 171 charges or collects a fee for notarizing the signature on any absentee ballot or absentee voter 172 registration is guilty of official misconduct.

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
