AN ACT

To repeal section 115.199, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to voter registration records.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 115.199, RSMo, is repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 115.199 and 193.147, to read as follows:

115.199. Each election authority shall remove from its registration records the names of voters reported dead or adjudged incapacitated and shall determine the voting qualifications of those reported convicted or pardoned. **The election authority shall consult death certificates provided under section 193.147 and update its records at least once per month.**

193.147. The person preparing the death certificate shall make every attempt to collect relevant statistical information on the deceased person, including the county of current voter registration. Beginning January 1, 2022, the state registrar shall provide an election authority with a copy of the death certificate of any deceased person believed to be registered to vote within the jurisdiction of the election authority at least once per month.
