## **AN ACT**

To amend chapter 1, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the show me the money job protection act, with an emergency clause.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 1, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be 2 known as section 1.515, to read as follows:

1.515. 1. This section shall be known and may be cited as the "Show Me the Money Job Protection Act". 2

3 2. Except as provided under subsection 3 of this section, neither the state nor any 4 agency or political subdivision thereof shall enforce any federal law, rule, regulation, or 5 order if such enforcement would result in the elimination of a job in this state unless the department of economic development authorizes the enforcement of such federal law, rule, 6 7 regulation, or order. 8

- 3. This section shall not apply to any federal laws, rules, regulations, or orders:
- (1) Applicable to the National Guard or Air National Guard;
- (2) Required of the state under Medicaid law, 42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq.; 10
- 11 (3) That are a condition of receiving funding under Medicaid law, 42 U.S.C. 1396 12 et seq.;
- 13 (4) That protect a right that the Supreme Court of the United States has found to 14 be a fundamental right; or
- 15 (5) That protect a right that is also protected under state law.
- 16 4. The department of economic development shall authorize the enforcement of a
- 17 federal law, rule, regulation, or order if:

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

(1) The department determines that the enforcement of the federal law, rule,
regulation, or order would not result in the elimination of a job in this state; or

20 (2) The state, or an agency or political subdivision thereof, submits to the 21 department a plan to replace every job that would be eliminated by the enforcement of 22 such federal law, rule, regulation, or order with a new job that pays at least as much as the 23 eliminated job.

24 5. The director of the department of economic development may promulgate all 25 necessary rules and regulations for the administration of this section. Any rule or portion 26 of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority 27 delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all 28 of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and 29 chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul 30 31 a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and 32 any rule proposed or adopted after the effective date of this section shall be invalid and 33 void.

6. Each department of the state shall review all federal laws, rules, regulations, and orders that affect the department and shall report any federal law, rule, regulation, or order whose enforcement would eliminate a job in this state to the director of the department of economic development no later than three months after the effective date of this section.

Section B. Because immediate action is necessary to prevent the elimination of jobs in this state, the enactment of section 1.515 of section A of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace, and safety and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and the enactment of section 1.515 of section A of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval.
