## AN ACT

To amend chapter 21, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the joint committee on federal government oversight.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 21, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 21.1000, to read as follows:

- 21.1000. 1. There is hereby established the "Joint Committee on Federal Government Oversight". The committee shall consist of five members from the senate, chosen by the president pro tempore of the senate and five members from the house of representatives, chosen by the speaker of the house of representatives.
- 2. The joint committee may review any executive order issued by the President of the United States if the order has not been affirmed by a vote of Congress and signed into law as prescribed by the Constitution of the United States.
- 3. The joint committee may recommend to the attorney general and the governor that the order be further examined by the attorney general to determine the constitutionality of the order and to determine whether the state should seek an exemption from the application of the order or seek to have the order declared to be an unconstitutional exercise of authority by the President.
- 4. Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, no state agency, political subdivision, or any elected or appointed official or employee of this state or any political subdivision thereof shall implement an executive order that restricts a person's constitutional rights or that is determined by the attorney general to be unconstitutional under this section if the order relates to:

31	sunset four years after the effective date of the reauthorization of this section; and
