# HOUSE BILL NO. 1285

## AN ACT

To repeal section 537.555, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to immunity from civil liability for forcible entry into a locked vehicle.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 537.555, RSMo, is repealed and one new section enacted in lieu 2 thereof, to be known as section 537.555, to read as follows:

537.555. 1. A person shall not be held civilly liable for damages resulting from the 2 forcible entry into a vehicle for the purpose of removing an unsupervised minor **or an animal** 3 if such person:

4 (1) Determines that the vehicle is locked or there is no other reasonable method for 5 removing the minor **or animal** from the vehicle;

6 (2) Has a good faith belief that forcible entry into the vehicle is necessary because the 7 minor **or animal** is in imminent danger of suffering harm if not immediately removed from the 8 vehicle;

9 (3) Contacts emergency response personnel including any firefighter, emergency medical 10 technician, law enforcement officer, registered nurse, physician, or first responder prior to 11 forcibly entering the vehicle;

12 (4) Remains with the minor **or animal** at a safe location reasonably close to the vehicle 13 until emergency response personnel arrives; and

14 (5) Uses no more force to enter the vehicle and remove the minor **or animal** from the 15 vehicle than was necessary under the circumstances.

16 2. Nothing in this section shall provide immunity from civil liability for actions to aid 17 a minor **or animal** in addition to what is authorized by this section.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

3. As used in this section, the term "animal" means a dog of the canine species, a
cat of the feline species, or any other animal that is domesticated and kept as a household
pet. The term "animal" does not include livestock as defined in section 144.010.
