HB 34 -- DEATH CERTIFICATES

SPONSOR: Pollock (123)

This bill requires when a county medical examiner, coroner, physician, or local register has been referred a case of the death of a child under four years old by natural causes more than 36 hours after being treated by a health care provider, the death certificate must include a request for information about the child's last immunization. The health care provider must provide information on all types of immunizations provided at the last visit. The immunization information will appear on the child's death certificate.

This bill is similar to HB 2553 (2020).
