

HB 1009 -- CIVIL RIGHTS FOR HOMELESS PERSONS

SPONSOR: Collins

This bill specifies that a person's rights, privileges, or access to public services may not be denied because such person is homeless. The bill specifies that a person experiencing homelessness has the right to move freely in public spaces, to camp in outdoor public spaces, to equal treatment by city and state agencies, to emergency medical care, to a reasonable expectation of privacy for personal property, and the right to vote.

This bill is similar to HB 413 (2021).
