

HB 1303 -- BALLOT REGULATIONS

SPONSOR: Adams

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass" by the Standing Committee on Elections and Elected Officials by a vote of 10 to 0.

This bill repeals an existing law preventing a voter from allowing his or her ballot to be seen by another individual with the intent of showing how he or she voted. It also creates a class one election offense for coercing or forcing a voter to vote in a certain manner and to take a ballot picture in order to verify their vote.

This bill is the same as HB 2298 (2020).

PROPOSERS: Supporters say that the bill clarifies that recording your own vote with a picture is permissible. Many people take ballot pictures and it should not be a criminal act.

Testifying for the bill were Representative Adams; and Arnie C. Dienoff.

OPPOSERS: Those who oppose the bill provided written testimony.

Testifying against the bill was Dan Kent Deplois.
