HCR 30 -- FORGIVENESS OF INADVERTENT PAYMENTS

SPONSOR: Merideth

COMMITTEE ACTION: Voted "Do Pass" by the Special Committee on Government Oversight by a vote of 7 to 1.

This resolution calls upon the Governor to forgive any inadvertent but nonfraudulent overpayments of unemployment compensation that were funded by federal moneys during the officially declared state of emergency relating to the COVID-19 pandemic.

PROPONENTS: Supporters say that Missourians are currently suffering and in need of relief as soon as possible. This HCR is a short term action that can be done now while the other bill moves through Congress. The State already has the authority to waive payments and this resolution would call on the Governor to use that authority.

OPPONENTS: Those who oppose the bill say that the state needs to recover these funds. These citizens were not entitled to receive these overpayments and therefore should pay them back.
