**Decline In Hunters Threatens How U.S. Pays For Conservation** U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service shows that today, only about 5 percent of Americans, 16 years old and older, actually hunt. That's half of what it was 50 years ago and the decline is expected to accelerate over the next decade. The average age of Trappers is 49 and Hunters is 42. The shift is being welcomed by Anti Hunting, Fishing and Trapping groups. So why would you add additional money over and beyond 1/8 sales tax and limiting the number of hunters when it is in decline. Next the Missouri Conservation Commission Members even stated that small game is the introduction to hunting and should stay at 5 acres, but why exclude deer and turkey - where is the the line going to be drawn in future the deer home range or turkey home range. Deer - A home range is the entire area that a deer lives in. On average, these are generally about 650 acres or one square mile. But remember, the home ranges aren't square. As for the core area, this is the location that most the deer will spend the vast majority of their time. In fact, core areas are approximately 50 to 75 acres and deer will spend 75 to 80 percent of their time within that location. OR We going to use the research data from the MDC that they used to establish CWD Zones of 10 miles. OR The annual home range of wild turkeys varies from 370 to 1,360 acres So are you going to have Missouri landowners buy tags that own under 50 acres, 75 acres, 370 acres, 650 acres 1,360 acres or 10 miles radius or 201 thousand acres. It was a purely power and money grab by the Missouri Department of Conservation.

While the cost is nominal for the permits when combined with everything else required for hunting it can add up, and landowners pay taxes on that land every year I think we should at least give them the freedom to hunt it without paying more fees. I oppose HB 1010. Fraudulent claims of land ownership results in individuals receiving free hunting permits when they should not get them. Such fraud is an affront to legitimate landowners as well as hunters like me that purchase permits to pay our share of conservation. In my life, I have to provide all kinds of 'proof' in order to meet requirements (property tax receipt to get a auto license renewed, proof of residency to be registered as a voter, birth certificate to get a drivers license, photo ID to get a Covid vaccine). It is reasonable to ask landowners to show proof of ownership in order to get free deer permits, etc. and it puzzles me that some landowners would not want to help by providing information to stop fraud by people that are not landowners. This kind of fraud shortchanges funding that, in no small part, helps landowners with wildlife conservation (cost-share MDC provides landowners, response to hunter trespassing/poaching, etc). Regarding acreage minimums to receive landowner hunting privilege, 5 acres is not enough to support even one whitetail deer year-round. An on-line search indicates it would take many times that acreage to support even one deer and would depend on the quality of the habitat. Five acres is woefully insufficient. MDC is the agency with the expertise to set seasons, limits, and permit requirements and they have done a stellar job and been nationally recognized for decades. These judgements should be left with MDC as the agency entrusted with this role by the public. I am not currently a landowner but have had and continue to have family and friends that are landowners. I know there are varying opinions from time to time about wildlife conservation but have never heard any of them complain about MDC having the lead with permit requirements. I do not know Representative Boggs but graduated high school in Barry County to the south of him and know he is from good country and representing good people and guess that he is one of the good people also. But, I believe that HB 1010 is not necessary and, therefore, should not move forward. The management of wildlife in Missouri should be left to MDC.

My Name is Zach Morris and I am from Columbia. I am a biologist for an environmental services company and an avid hunter and angler. I would like to testify in opposition to this bill. I am opposed to both aspects of this bill. In regard to the first portion, which prevents the Conservation Department from maintaining a landowner registry, this would lead to a lot of fraud. I do think certain landowners should be able to get free hunting permits, but I also think you should be able to prove that you own the land in order to get the permits. If there is no registry, what would stop someone from lying on his or her permit application and cheating the system? I register my car, my house, and my boat because the law requires it and I see no efforts to repeal these requirements. I don't see a need to eliminate the landowner registration required by the Conservation Department, and I think this would lead to people cheating the system and stealing resources from ethical hunters like me. I am also opposed to the language regarding the amount of land required to obtain free landowner permits. I understand the Conservation Department recently raised this requirement from five acres to 20 acres. I think the Conservation Department know the best way to manage their permit requirements and the impacts thereof to wildlife populations. Further, I don't think that five acres is enough land to justify a free permit. There is very little you can do to manage for game species on such a small parcel. Certainly, many species benefit from habitat improvements on small acreages, but no game animal in Missouri can survive on only five acres. They need multiple habitat types that exist across the landscape, which is why I don't think landowners with such small acreages should receive free permits. The home range of something like a whitetail deer is much larger than 20 acres, but if the Conservation Department thinks this is a fair acreage requirement for free permits, then I support keeping the requirements where they are.
