Governor Parson and the leaders of this state have made clear that personal responsibility is the key to combating the pandemic. Healthcare workers have worked excruciating hours, sometimes with inadequate PPE in order to save lives. Grocery workers have shown up to work to interact face to face with hundreds of customers daily to keep us fed. Factory workers have stood shoulder to shoulder on assembly lines to keep our economy moving. Teachers and children alike have made tremendous sacrifices and worked extra hours to continue education while keeping families safe. First responders have walked into homes to transport dangerously sick Missourians to medical care, knowing full well that they are being exposed to a potentially deadly virus. At some point they have asked for help from various levels of government. They've asked for a state-wide mask mandate to slow the spread of the virus. They've asked for economic relief to keep workers safe and cushion the blow from an unforgiving economy. They've asked for hazard pay to compensate for increased stress and danger, PPE to save lives and increased testing and tracing to keep people safe and empower them to live closer to normal lives. They have all been told by their government that the answer is to take personal responsibility. How hypocritical then for Covid legislation to be about special exemptions carving out a chosen few from having to take personal responsibility.HB-1064 is a mockery of the concept of personal responsibility that the State of Missouri has based it's entire COVID response on. It does nothing to protect the lives of workers, improve the lives of our children or help struggling families make ends meet. The Missouri AFL-CIO urges a NO vote on HB-1064 and urges the state's lawmakers to pass a Covid relief package that is built around directly improving the safety and economic security of the working families of this State.
