These people were not on a summer break, they were furloughed due to the pandemic. I submit this testimony to you for your consideration on behalf on my fellow employees. I was fortunate enough to not be negatively financially impacted, however, when I see who among our employees was impacted, they are our lowest paid and most vulnerable. Please do whatever is necessary to stop the efforts to recoup unemployment benefits paid out to these people months after they actually received the payments. Again, to sum up the situation; many of our fellow citizens made legitimate application for unemployeent benefits. That the State of Missouri was not able to correct accept, process, and pay these applications according to their rules, should not now be held against those who are among our most vulnerable citizens. Thank you for your public service to our state.

apply for UI and then be denied, instead I was granted and paid UI for months until they decided because I no longer worked for Stlcc as a. Staff interpreter that I should pay back \$7,000 of federal and state UI benefits. After hours of unfruitful attempts to remedy this issue via the state's phone system, I still have yet to resolve the overpayment and prove that I deserved them. My future wages will likely be garnished.
