TO: House Committee on Crime Prevention and Public SafetyFROM: Karen Aroesty, Regional Director, ADL HeartlandRE: HB 291The Anti-Defamation League (ADL) Heartland office submits this written testimony in support of HB 291 and Representative Roberts' leadership on a highly volatile event when false reports are called into 911 or other emergency systems in an effort to victimize an individual on the basis of hate or any other reason. "Swatting" can and has resulted in injury to the target or other witnesses and has even caused fatalities. Moreover, it burdens already-limited police resources. Missouri law currently protects individuals against cyber-harassment, cyber-stalking and doxing. HB 291 would close a cyber protection gap on this unique form of electronic harassment. HB 291 is part of a national effort started by ADL in 2019 called Backspace Hate™. The initiative supports victims and targets of online hate and harassment by raising awareness and passing legislation to better hold perpetrators accountable for actions online, intentional actions that reflect a reckless disregard for potential harm on the ground, both to targets and to first responders. When harassment pushes targets offline, perpetrators spew hateful messages and silence valuable voices. It's time to backspace the hate and make room for good. Recent surveys on harassment online indicate that: • respondents experienced severe online harassment, which includes sexual harassment, stalking, physical threats, swatting, doxing and sustained harassment; Over one-third (35%) of Americans who had been harassed reported they felt the harassment was a result of their sexual orientation. religion, race or ethnicity, gender identity, or disability. Around one-in-five respondents who had experienced online harassment believed it was because of religion (21%), which is nearly twice the amount reported in 2019. (11%). One-in-four (25%) respondents felt the focus of their harassment was gender and some 25% because of race or ethnicity, up significantly from the 15% reported previously. Around one-in-ten had been targeted as a result of sexual orientation (9%), occupation (12%), or disability (11%). One consequence of widespread online hate and harassment is that it leaves people worried about being a future target: 26% of those who had previously experienced harassment and 11% of Americans who had not experienced harassment reported anxiety about future harassment and altered their own online engagement.
