Testimony of Dr. Andre Van Mol, M.D., co chair Committee on Adolescent Sexuality American College of Pediatricians HB 33 protects already at-risk sexual minority youth from experimental and unproven gender affirming therapy (GAT). GAT permanently and prematurely medicalizes children for a condition that overwhelmingly resolves (desists) by adulthood. GAT is not proven effective, not proven safe, does not reduce suicides , and is not the international standard of care for gender dysphoric minors. Desistance is the norm for the minors with gender dysphoria (GD). GD youth have an overwhelming probability of desistance, resolving ON ITS OWN in 75-96% by adulthood. 12345. Medicalizing children for life for a psychological process that usually resolves requires strong scientific support that GAT does not have. 678 Gender Dysphoria in minors has no co morbidities. The overwhelming majority of youth with gender dysphoria have additional mental health conditions (depression, anxiety, bi polar disorder, psychoses, personality disorders, histories of self harm or suicidality, ect), neuro-developmental disabilities like autism spectrum, adverse childhood events, and family issues that pre-date or coincide with gender incongruence. 9 10 11. These issues need counseling, not GAT.Minors cannot give truly informed consent. 12 Children have developing brain, their minds change often and they don't grasp long-term consequences. 13 14 15. -The UK High Court in Bell vs Tavistock (2020) ruled that GAT in minors was experimental and could not , in most cases, be given to minors under 16 without court order, and that such was advisable for those ages 16-17: " There is no age appropriate way to explain to many of these children what losing their fertility or full sexual function may mean to them in later years. "16. -The Swedish Pediatric Society and Swedish National Council for Medical Ethics (2019) proposed a complete review of treatment of youth with gender dysphoria : "Giving children the right to independently make vital decisions whereby at that age they cannot be expected to understand the consequences of their decisions is not scientifically founded and contrary to medical practice". There is no medical proof that the long term benefits or safety of a child undergoing hormonal therapy or surgical transitioning. -World Professional Association for Transgender Health (WPATH) Standards of Care confirms, "To date, no controlled clinical trial of any feminizing/masculinizing hormone regimen have conducted to evaluate safety or efficacy in producing physical transition"-The 2017 Endocrine Society Guidelines on hormone treatment of gender dysphoria noted their recommendations for GAT were supported by "low" or "very low" evidence. Low evidence means low science but high ideology.-Professor Michael Biggs of Oxford (2019) found the GD children in the UK's Gender Identity Development Service's trial of puberty blockers showed greater self harm, more emotional problems and worsening of the GD.-Branstrom, et al(2019) published the first total population study of 9.7 million Swedes ultimately finding neither "gender affirming hormone treatment" nor "surgery" lead to reductions in mental health treatment.-Finlands Council for Choices in Health Care in Finlan (COHERE) in 2020 rejected routine "affirmation" pathway for minors with GD.Thy MYTH OF SUICIDE reduction from GAT-The threat of suicide is used as emotional blackmail for GAT-

**Psychology professors J. Baily and R. Blanchard stated : "There is no persuasive evidence that gender transition reduces gender dysphoric children's likelihood of killing themselves.-The Lupron (the main puberty blocker in the US) package insert warns of "mood swings, depression, rare reports of suicidal ideation and attempt"-A 2011 Swedish study of all their post -sex re assignment adults showed a completed suicide rate 19 times that of the general population 10 year out with nearly 3 times the rate of psychiatric inpatient care-A 2011 long term Dutch study of cross-sex hormone therapy revealed significantly increased mortality from multiple causes including suicide. The international standard of care for youth Gender Dysphoria is watchful waiting, including psychological evaluation and support of the child and family, not gender affirming therapy (GAT). I am writing this due to a push from my medical school to have students testify in opposition of this bill. I am in favor of this bill due to the scant medical evidence in support of gender-affirming care. Medical organizations such as the APA revised care for transgender patients out of fear of being viewed as bigoted, not out of robust scientific inquiry. Healthcare for transgender individuals is highly important and they should never, ever be discriminated against on account of their gender identity. But to perform what can only be described as medical experiments on children with puberty blockers and "sex reassignment" surgery is, in my opinion, child abuse. There is a reason we do not let those under 18 years old vote. There is a reason we don't let individuals under 21 drink alcohol. The reason is because the brain is not fully developed until approximately 25 years old. There are no long term studies evaluating the efficacy of puberty blocking hormones and transgender surgeries, and, therefore, what is being done to transgender youth across America is nothing short of pure experimentation without evidence. Children are not mature to make life altering decisions, such as blocking the natural course of puberty. I say natural because that is what it is. It is not "abnormal" for puberty to occur and normal sexual development to take place. If transgender individuals that are capable of making such decisions desire to (i.e. individuals over 18 years old), they should be able to receive care from a physician in support of gender-affirming care. But that is entirely different from an 8 year old child doing the same thing. For these reasons, I think this bill is correct to prevent children from receiving life-altering medical therapies with no long term evidence to support such therapies.

My name is Kevin Whitt formerly known as Dominique O'Hara Skyy. I lived a childhood of sexual, verbal, and physical abuse. All the abuse lead to much gender confusion, depression, and sexual brokenness which caused me to believe I was born "gay" and even in the "wrong body". When I was 15 years old I came out of the closet as gay and soon after I began dressing as a female. I was living full time as a transgendered woman by the time I reached the age of 18 years old. I was quickly embraced by the gay community and I was indoctrinated into the club scene and began performing in drag shows. As a young kid, of course, I loved all the attention I was getting. It wasn't long before I starting working in all aspects of the adult sex industry that you can think of. After becoming addicted to the money I mainly worked as a full-time "escort", which we all know is just a fancy word for "prostitute", for many years. The men made me feel wanted and valuable for the first time in my life. After living that lifestyle for over 20 years and through a series of circumstances including going with my friend to an Easter Church Service I received the Lord Jesus Christ. Keep in mind that I did not come to Christ seeking change, I went with an open mind, a loving heart, and a desire for a healthy life. I was introduced to Living Hope Ministries which is a ministry that helps people with unwanted same-sex attraction. Through the guidance and counseling, I received at this ministry the Lord began to heal those broken areas of my life. As I stand here today, I am a Christian man, with a little residue from my past, who loves Jesus Christ. I feel I have been blessed with a second chance at life. I now volunteer to help others on a path to healing, similar to my own story. Pediatric Gender Transition is Child Abuse , if a child can't get a tattoo until they are 18 they definitely can not make such a permanent life altering decision as a child. I ask that you vote against this child abuse by voting yes to HB\_\_\_\_\_ Long Version: I am Kevin Whitt, I discovered my true identity in Christ after having lived as a transsexual woman named "Dominique" for over 20 years. I grew up in a dysfunctional home with a very abusive father. As a child, I endured , physical, and sexual abuse. Starting around the 1st grade, everyone called me "gay" and "faggot" because I seemed more feminine than other boys. Words are powerful, and I believed those lies. The abuse continued at home and at school throughout my entire adolescent and teen life. I was severely bullied for my feminine mannerisms and high pitched voice. I began questioning my gender identity at a very young age after being raised by my mother and sisters and really only trusting females because most males I was ever around abused me. Yet at the same time I longed for a father like other kids had. Wishing so badly I could just be a normal boy like the rest of the guys that wasn't feminine , awkward or get made fun of. I wanted to be one of the popular guys, with a lot of friends and the perfect body who everyone wanted to be around. But unfortunately that wasn't what I was, I was a very feminine boy with a high pitched voice and was mistaken as a girl most of the time. I would go places with my mom and people would say " Awww your daughter is so pretty" and she would have to correct them saying " This is my son". I remember getting so depressed and trying everything I could to be a masculine guy like the rest, but it never worked. Deep down I hated

my femininity but there was nothing I could do to change it and society said If your a even a slightly feminine boy you must be gay and tossed out deemed a degenerate. I began having same-sex attraction by the age of 15, I came out and immediately started dressing in drag. I decided if I couldn't change my femininity I would just use it to my advantage. Immediately I was embraced and accepted into a community of people that I could relate to, gaining the attention and friendships I always wanted. For once in my life I felt wanted, loved, and I fit in somewhere in society. I loved the recognition I received when dressing in drag so as you can imagine it became addictive. As soon as I was old enough, I got into the club scene and became a drag performer. I began to question my gender identity more and more. I remember thinking that maybe this is it, maybe I was supposed to actually be born a female. I decided I would seek counseling because I really wanted to make sure and also get help for the abuse I endured. I found a therapist that specialized in Gender Dysphoria so I quickly made an appointment. When she first saw me she said "You are beautiful I would have had no idea you were actually male". As we proceeded with our appointment I explained how I had been abused by my father and even bullied at school. She said I'm sorry you had to go through that but you have gender dysphoria and my treatment was to present as female as much as possible. She seemed to have dismissed the abuse I explained to her that I endured. So I went on with my life but at least then I had reassurance from a "therapist" that I was supposed to be born female. That's when I began living full time as female. Later desperate for money, I started working in the adult industry as a transsexual prostitute, phone sex operator, dominatrix, and webcam "model." I thought this would be temporary, but earning over \$1k a day became addictive and I couldn't stop. Men made me feel sexy and wanted. I hated Christians because all I'd ever been taught by the Church was that gay people were going to hell and their punishment from God was to contract AIDS and die. So, I figured, if I'm going to hell, I might as well have fun doing it. Eventually I realized how toxic and addictive my lifestyle had become. Many friends and acquaintances had died young from HIV, and I saw others ruin their lives with drug and alcohol addictions. One day, while working in a male strip club, one of the stripper boys invited me to go to church. I thought it was weird, but I was open to it and I went. That day a seed was planted in my heart. A few months later, I got invited to church on Easter Sunday. God grabbed my attention through a modern-day version of the resurrection of Christ being played out on stage, and I began to cry. I saw all that Jesus had done for me. That was the first day of my walk with Christ. Eventually my desires to do drag, party, or have sex lessened. God began speaking to me and I got rid of all of my female clothing and accessories. My heart began to change dramatically as God continued to change as my relationship with Christ drew stronger. I began going to a faith based discipleship program called "Living Hope". It was there that I learned my true identity in Christ and the scientific reason why I had the feelings I had throughout my life. I did not come to Christ seeking change in my sexuality. I simply came to Him with the desire for a healthy life, and kept an open mind and loving heart. He did the rest. I now understand that my sensitivity and interests in art, fashion, and beauty do not equate to homosexuality. American culture places a stigma on men. If we don't watch football and act a certain way, we must be gay. But that is a lie. I am created in God's image, and He gave me a creative mind. I love being a man just the way I was designed to be.

Dear members of the Missouri House Children and Families committee: I am writing this letter in support of House Bill 33. Though many opinions may be heard on this issue in support of either side, I speak from personal experience and from first-hand knowledge of many others I have met who have transitioned and now regret their decision. I am a former transgender, having previously lived as transgender and medically transitioning between the years of 2007 and 2016. I believed, like so many young people, that I was born transgender and had no possible course in life but to transition. Yet nearly nine years later I had learned the hard way that transgenderism is not real and it is only a cosmetic change that masks the deep inner wounds that cause rejection of one's gender. In 2007, I did not know any other transgenders until I looked up the issue online and found a local support group. Within minutes of meeting me, they agreed that I was definitely transgender, and recommended a therapist to me that could help me begin the legal process of transition. I had no interest in counseling at the time, but since it was a legal requirement at the time, I agreed to the minimal number of sessions. After mindlessly answering the questions and just wanting to progress through the process and begin hormones, the therapist stumbled on some deep issues. She put down her notebook, looked right in my eyes and said, "Wow, you really have issues with your mom...". I was stunned. I could not see how we had gotten from talking about me being a man trapped in a woman's body to talking about my mother. She had stumbled upon the source of the problem without realizing it. I had deep, bitter roots against my mother because I felt she loved my brother more than me because of the difference in the way she treated us. But I had not consciously realized that. I blew up at her and I said, "I am not here to talk about my mom." I still did not see the connection (and wouldn't until many years later). She asked, "So you just want me to give you the diagnosis?" "Yes, that's all I'm here for," I responded curtly. She gave me a letter that I was then able to take to a doctor indicating that I had been diagnosed with Gender Identity Disorder (later updated to Gender Dysphoria in the DSM-IV) and begin hormone therapy to "transition" to male. She saw the root of the problem but was afraid to act in the correct manner. Let me ask you, what other disease or condition do we allow the patient to dictate their medical care when it is contrary to the evidence the doctor has uncovered? It might not seem like a big deal to someone who has not walked the path I did, but because no one was willing to stand up and fight for me (granted, against my own wishes at the time) I have serious consequences in my body to this day. I took testosterone for nearly nine years which caused a wealth of medical problems including increased blood pressure, increased body fat, increased heart rate, scar tissue buildup in my leg muscles from the injections, and trouble with memory and brain organization. I was twenty-five when I began transition and so I was young to be experiencing these types of health problems. My blood was so thick that my doctor finally forced me to go to a blood bank monthly to have a therapeutic withdraw.

They would take a pint of blood each time and I was still in great danger of having a stroke. In addition, the chest binders I wore for over a year prior to my double mastectomy severely altered the muscular structure in my back, solidifying the fascia to a nearly solid state. It took over three years of regular massage therapy to undo the damage from the binders. In 2009 I had an outpatient double mastectomy and two years later had all of the female organs removed. After several years of transitioning, I was devastated as I began to realize that none of it was real. At the time I didn't regret transition, I had no desire to be female. But I was beginning to see the truth that no matter what I did to my body it was never going to make me a man. All I was doing was changing the appearance. In fact, the more I transitioned the more paranoid and reclusive I became. Whereas before I was proud of being transgender, once I was fully passing as male, I was afraid of people finding out the truth. My life became a living hell as I was spending all of my money trying to come up with ways to make the transition real. I tried every product and gimmick available, but nothing helped. The dysphoria was not going away. I was beginning to become suicidal as I didn't see a way out. But finally, after I gave my life to my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, He began to call me out of that lifestyle. I left everything behind including that identity, my job, my home, and my partner to follow Him. In doing so, God has revealed to me what my therapist had stumbled upon years earlier and much more. In forgiving and reconciling with my mom, the feelings and desires to be male began to fade away. I have since met many transgenders, some former and some currently living with that identity. I have heard the same thing over and over again: it is never real. It becomes extremely depressing when you realize that you have totally maimed your body, changed your identity, and in many cases alienated your family, for a lie. In addition to the stories I have heard, there have been several documentaries, many YouTube videos, books, articles and more about people who regret transition. Unlike regretting many things in life, this type of transition has serious permanent consequences. Many cannot face the reality of what they have done, and some studies have shown very high suicide rates even after surgery and full transition. I understand fully that I cannot keep an adult from harming themselves if they want to. What I am imploring you to consider is that a child's brain is not even fully developed, and they cannot possibly understand the long-term effects of the decision they are making. Many of these treatments and procedures will sterilize them, at the very least, and as children they cannot comprehend what they are giving up in one day being able to conceive children. Because of this path I took, I no longer have breasts, I can never have my own children, I have to shave my face every day, and I have other health problems related to severe hormonal imbalance. There are many things a child may want to do, even beg and insist on doing, that is harmful to them. It is our job as parents and as legislators to keep children from doing such harm to themselves. Let us allow them to receive counseling and uncover the reasons they want to transition. The reasons vary widely, but in the many I have met over the last several years, there is always a cause of some kind. The problem is not with the body, it is with the mind. Transgenderism, at its core, is a dissociation from one's gender due to some kind of emotional or physical trauma. While it is often a result of abuse, it is sometimes as simple as sibling rivalry, misunderstood family dynamics, or difficulty fitting in with peers. This fraud of transition has been a failed experiment and should not be allowed to be performed on our children at the expense of their future. We must protect those who are not mature enough yet to know how to protect themselves. This bill would protect children from making the biggest mistake of their life, of which much of the consequences could never be undone. Please vote in favor of HB 33 for the sake of confused, innocent children.

I am Anne Stanton from Columbia and I very strongly OPPOSE HB 33. I am the mother of a person whose interests, as soon as she could express them, did not follow anything that boys are 'supposed to like'. In elementary school, in spite of the male name we gave her at birth, and the short hair and jeans she wore, she was bullied as a 'faggot' (a word she did not then understand) and by the start of middle school her emotional and physical health began to plummet. The onset of male puberty was emotionally wrenching for her. We did not understand, and she could not articulate her experience beyond saying that everything was wrong. Her school experience was awful, and her decline in health affected all of us who loved her, from her big brother to her grandmother, who lives with us. Her therapist, in conjunction with our family physician – who had delivered her – recommended social and medical support for her transition, following the evidence-based science, following best practices as recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics. This was a long process, and it took a long time to get an appointment with a pediatric endocrinologist. Our daughter began to feminize her clothing and general appearance, and we signed paperwork to begin hormone treatment to stall further puberty changes, and finally went through the process to treat her with feminizing hormones. It was terrifying to drop her off at school in a dress, but in many ways her emotional health improved and as her true self began to appear our family began to realize what she had been going through, and how close we had come to losing her. And this was in spite of the fact that she has a loving, middle-class, stable family. And as she settled into her true self, we all improved. We are very happy to have our living, kind, creative, and generous daughter with us today. Passage of HB 33 into law would criminalize the healthcare she received, affecting the professional lives of her family practice doctor – who was the doctor for our entire family, including my mom – and several specialists. One of these an endocrinologist whose practice is largely focused on treating children with diabetes, growth issues, and early puberty onset, which is treated with exactly the same kind of medication we initially used to pause male puberty. HB 33 would threaten my husband and I with prosecution and jail time, affecting the well-being of the rest of our family. Finally and most importantly to us, HB 33 would have prevented the medical care that has kept our child alive. Today, our daughter often rejects the label of 'transgender' because she was never a boy inside. She was born with what amounts to a birth defect, and the trauma of living with that for years is still with her. But SHE is still alive, a part of this world, with friends and family and a path of her own. Please, please vote against this bill. Passing it would be extremely harmful not just for young Missourians whose interior selves do not match their exterior bodies, but also for their families, their friends, and their doctors. My name is Anneliese Schaefer and I'm here to testify in opposition to HB33. I'm here as a parent of a transgender child, now in her late teens. Our child first questioned her gender in late elementary school. My husband and I both are scientists and work at a large academic medical center. That said, we're not medical doctors and this was outside our research areas. We tried to educate ourselves through a measured process of reading and reaching out to others. Eventually we met with our medical team. They were very measured in gathering information from us and in getting to know our child. They followed best practices, and that gave us confidence. The term 'best practices' is not simply a compliment – 'best practices' means that we can have confidence that the medical guidance is based on research that shows what is in the patient's best interest, and guidance that is consistent on a national level. That guidance helped our daughter to thrive. She's excelling as a college student. That was not always the case – she hit a very rough patch that was incredibly stressful for us and a dangerous time for her. She got through it, and we owe our medical team a debt of gratitude for their central role in her recovery. Our family's relationship with the medical team is a relationship of trust and privacy. I cannot think of any group that is better qualified to guide us through medical decision-making than our medical team. I sincerely hope that this committee respects that relationship. Especially for the families with younger children, I hope they have the same opportunities that our family did, to work with caring and compassionate doctors who followed best practices.

My husband and I will move heaven and earth for our daughter to receive appropriate medical care when she reaches puberty. We don't know for sure what she will want her body to look like, that will be up to her in consultation with her doctor, but we are determined to make sure she has access to appropriate scientifically and medically sound treatment and every ounce of support we can give her. If you pass this bill or one like it, my family will have to move sometime in the next approximately four years before she starts puberty and likely take a considerable financial hit to do so, though we will be lucky in that we will likely escape with our child's life. Dear Honorable Committee Members, Thank you for allowing me to present testimony to you today. As a transgender Boone County resident and parent, I would like to express my opposition to HB 33, which would ban widely-accepted gender-affirming care for transgender youth. This bill is extremely harmful and disturbing in its nature. Not only will it deny transgender youth from accessing comprehensive healthcare, it will criminalize doctors and parents who support transgender youth. Standard best practices of care for transgender youth are research-based and backed by American Academy of Pediatrics and other leading medical authorities; to criminalize this care is taking Missouri several terrifying steps backward. To destroy a critical lifeline for transgender youth by criminalizing the support of a transgender young person is cruel and denies all involved their individual liberty, personal freedom, and the right to live a life free of government overreach. Personal healthcare decisions should be made privately between transgender youth, their families, and their team of healthcare providers, not subject to government intrusion. Please accept this written testimony on behalf of the Jewish Community Relations Council of St. Louis in opposition to HB 33. This bill prohibits medical providers from administering any medical or surgical treatment for the purpose of gender reassignment for anyone under the age of 18, which would result in license revocation and names parents of children who receive such treatments, child abusers. The Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC), guided by Jewish values, advocates, educates, collaborates and mobilizes action on issues important to the Jewish community, 60,000 strong in St. Louis. We are committed to pursuing religious tolerance, civic discourse and social justice in St. Louis and beyond. One of the strongest ethical principles in Judaism is kavod habriyot, human dignity. Every individual is entitled to kavod habriyot by having been made b'tzelem elohim, in God's image. As an organization grounded in Jewish values, we have an ethical and moral responsibility to fight for a society that ensures the humanity, dignity, and equality of all people. Every person is entitled to live without fear of persecution, harassment, or discrimination. For centuries, there has been recognition within Judaism and Jewish movements of a diverse spectrum of sex and gender identities. Across Jewish legal codes and rabbinic commentary, there are hundreds of references to at least six different genders. Many of our texts affirm the existence of transgender, intersex, and genderfluid individuals and acknowledge that gender may change after birth. The Talmud, a compilation of Jewish laws indicates whoever destroys a single life is considered by Scripture to have destroyed the whole world, and whoever saves a single life is considered by Scripture to have saved the whole world. For many transgender youth, receiving hormone treatment or other medical care is truly a matter of life and death. Studies have shown that transgender youth who are experiencing gender dysphoria are more likely to feel depressed or anxious, harm themselves or attempt suicide. Such an extreme rejection of the scientific consensus on appropriate healthcare for transgender children will not only destroy lives; it will end lives. By creating legislation around the specific medical treatment for transgender children – you are treating these children as different, treating them as “other,” and not as people who deserves dignity and who are created in God's image. We urge you to oppose HB 33.

My name is Debi Jackson. I live with my family in Kansas City, Missouri. I would like to register my vehement opposition to HB 33. This bill has been constructed without discussion from leading medical professionals, psychologists, psychiatrists, social workers, counselors or transgender kids, teens and adults. The bill is not based on any accurate medical research and did not come as a result of speaking to the thousands of parents who have transgender children. I am one of those parents. I'm blessed to have a 13-year-old transgender child, and I didn't choose her sex or her gender. I simply love her for the person she is. Most parents of trans youth had little understanding of what it means to be transgender before our children told us who they are or had already endured years of silently struggling on their own. Parents like me spend countless hours lying awake at night, worried and scared for our kids. We read and re-read and research every piece of information we can get our hands on. We take them to therapists and doctors. We don't decide on a whim to rush them through a transition — social or medical. We constantly worry for our children and their future. We don't take any decision about their health care lightly; in fact we tend to agonize over every decision that we are forced to make because the clock around puberty keeps ticking. We lie awake in our beds at night, praying we are doing the right thing and thoughtfully and carefully weighing the pros and cons of EVERY. SINGLE. OPTION. You haven't been in our homes. You haven't seen our stress and anguish. You haven't witnessed our tears. You haven't felt our fears. And you haven't done the research we have. A landmark study published by "Pediatrics" found that if trans teens have access to puberty blockers, their chance of mental health struggles significantly declines. I didn't need a study to know that. Before the procedure to get her puberty blocking implant, my daughter said "I'm scared to death to get an implant but I will want to die without it. When I told her about this bill, she said "They want to take away the one thing that makes me feel confident about my life and that I can have a future. If I can't keep my blocker and start hormones, I don't know if I'll make it 18." Trans adolescents and teens and their families all across Missouri are scared. We are afraid that because you have read a few salacious headlines and have believed the completely false narrative that pre-pubertal kids are undergoing medical procedures from being sterilized to having surgery, you are going to take away the actual best-practice life-saving options that our kids need at puberty and beyond. The health care providers who treat our children, who get to know them through multiple visits — sometimes for years before there is any medical intervention needed — have all sworn an oath to "do no harm." Have you done the same? This bill doesn't protect children. This bill will interfere with the decisions that parents, teens and doctors can make about life-saving medical care. Make no mistake, this bill would end lives. We are demanding you stay out of the exam room and let doctors — the actual experts on trans youth — help our kids make correct decisions for themselves. Do not pass HB 33 and take away all hope from my daughter and transgender youth like her.

My name is Tom Jackson. My family lives in Kansas City, Missouri, and I am writing today in opposition of HB33. I am the father of a 13 year old transgender daughter. My daughter socially transitioned at the age of 4, meaning she began living her daily life as a female. When our daughter announced insistently, consistently, and persistently that she was a girl we took her to her pediatrician, who after consultation, sent us to an endocrinologist. As part of her care, we spoke to a child psychologist, who then referred us to a gender therapist. This multi-disciplinary approach is the standard of care when treating transgender children. Every health care profession has best practices for treating any and all conditions. These best practices are based on the most current research available on the subject matter, and reflect a consensus of the majority of clinicians in the profession. We supported our daughter in a social transition, because mental health and medical professionals have learned over the course of several decades that following an affirmative care model leads to positive outcomes for transgender youth. These standards of care are supported by the following health care and medical organizations: The American Medical Association, The American Psychiatric Association, The American Psychological Association, The American Academy of Pediatric and Child Psychology, The American Academy of Family Physicians, The American Academy of Pediatrics, The American Academy of Physician Assistants, The American College of Nurse Midwives, The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists, The American Public Health Association, The American Endocrine Society, The National Association of School Nurses, The National Association of Social Workers, and The World Professional Association for Transgender Health. As a practicing physician in the state of Missouri, I find it offensive that non-licensed lawmakers are trying to interfere in the personal relationship between a parent, their child, and their doctors. The relationship between a patient and their doctor is a sacred trust that has always been respected within our laws. By passing this bill, non-licensed individuals will be making decisions for parents and individual patients, rather than those decisions being made by the experts in their field. This is inappropriate and should have every licensed medical professional in the state alarmed at how easily their own medical practice could be affected should you decide next session that you don't personally agree with the services they offer. As a father, I find it reprehensible that a legislative body is attempting to determine how I parent my child, without knowing anything about me or my daughter, especially when so many of you also support bills to protect parental rights. You don't know the intense dysphoria my daughter has held for years. Dysphoria that has led to crippling depression and anxiety. You haven't sat through tear-filled conversations due to not being accepted by family and friends. And most importantly, you haven't been with us during our visits with her doctors who have given her age-appropriate affirming care. Since you haven't had the pleasure of meeting my daughter, or witnessing her struggles, I can tell you the one thing that has helped her become the happy, healthy, sassy, and spunky girl she is today is the acceptance from her family, and the health care she has received from a team of practitioners who

have sworn an oath to do no harm. This care is in many instances life saving, and you should be ashamed of yourselves for attempting to interfere with something that is literally keeping our kids alive. The State has no place in the exam room and has no place in restricting parents' rights to seek life-affirming supportive health care for their kids. This bill is trying to usurp the established standards of care without any rational knowledge of the subject matter. The state of Missouri should focus its efforts on the real adversity that faces its citizens; preventing transgender teens and adolescents to access best practice health care is not one of them. Hello. My name is Elizabeth Modde. I was born and raised in Missouri and currently reside in Columbia, MO. I am in my final year of medical school at Mizzou. I write to express my opposition to HB33 which would prohibit providing the standard of care to gender diverse patients (for reference, see WPATH Standards of Care, p. 18-21 or the Endocrine Society Clinical Practice Guideline). While puberty suppression (puberty blockers), hormonal therapies, and gender affirming surgeries are not typically needed among prepubertal children, once transgender and non-binary youth begin puberty the conversation surrounding healthcare must change. For example, evidence suggests that among those who desire puberty suppression as youth, those receiving such therapy have lower odds of suicidal ideation (Turban 2020). Puberty suppression is also associated with improved general functioning and decreased behavioral and emotional problems (de Vries, 2011). Puberty suppression is fully reversible; its potential benefits outweigh its potential harms in many cases. As a future pediatrician and child psychiatrist, I am concerned about the implications of HB33 on my patients. Data show that transgender and nonbinary youth have worse physical and mental health outcomes than their peers. I have seen this played out, for example with the disproportionate representation of gender diverse youth on my inpatient child psychiatry rotations. Every effort must be made to support these youth appropriately, firstly to improve their quality of life, but also to mitigate the cost burden to our health systems. HB33 will result in worsened health for Missouri youth and will inappropriately penalize physicians providing care consistent with national standards. Because of the clear harm posed to Missourians, I ask lawmakers to vote against HB33. Thank you for hearing my testimony.

I testify, as a 32 year old transgender woman, that this bill will have incredible negative impact upon the youth of the state of Missouri. My story is a cautionary tale. I was born in 1988. I struggled with my gender identity my entire life, from my earliest memories. I learned to repress these feelings, to pray, to be kind and devout. I was sure that God would wash away all the pain if I did such. However, these feelings did not fade. With puberty gender dysphoria only grew stronger. By 2006 I had admitted to myself I had suppressed these feelings, that their on-going reoccurring pattern was not likely to change. I began to plan a transition as these feelings were unable to be suppressed for any longer with out taking intense tolls on my mental health. In 2008, as an adult, I began transition. Social transition, to be exact. I would not receive medical intervention until 2011. My life was marked by repeated hardship, repeated discrimination, repeated trauma in large part because I stuck out like a sore thumb. I had endured a male puberty and during those three years of presenting full time as a young woman I endured. My life was made far more difficult because the bare minimum of respect was often eschewed. 2011 lead to medical intervention which changed my life. Over the coming years disdain directed at me lessened, the daily trauma I experienced reduced. Ten years later and I largely move through society with out hassles aside from most of the daily social challenges that women face in today's society. Had my gender dysphoria been addressed when I was young, had I been given puberty blockers and time to consider myself, had I then been given the chance to go through the correct puberty - a female one - I would have been far more successful in my 20s. I would not have been attending the University of Missouri while also enduring daily traumas specific to transgender people who are visibly transgender. My grades would have been better and working would have been less difficult. It is hard to service customers who are constantly denying your own humanity. I doubt I would have fell into the hole I did in my 20s - completely nonfunctional due to immense fear of my own community. Simply, my immense fortitude became overwhelmed, overburdened, and shattered. I would not be, now in my 30s, picking up the pieces of a life that shattered in my 20s. I am still recovering my ability to labor after years of being treated very poorly by those I worked with. For a period of time I was absolutely nonfunctional. I have pulled myself from inability to contribute at all to working three days a week. I now manage my household well enough to at least live in a clean environment and ensure bills are paid, that my family is saving money. I could be much farther along in life but I simply had to recover from things most others do not have to recover from. I can say, with out a single shred of doubt, if I had received the care HB33 seeks to block, a more productive and capable adult would exist in Columbia, MO. My male puberty marked me for life. To block medical care for transgender children - specifically in puberty blockers and eventually well regulated Hormone Replacement Therapy - would be to doom the transgender children in Missouri to the live I have lived and to be marked as I once was. Some will survive better than others, depending largely on familial support, but every single transgender kid who grows up will not achieve their full potential. Often I hear fears and

concerns for those who detransition. My counter argument is there exists therapies and care measures the minimizes this risk to extreme lows and will assist those who do indeed decide to detransition. These people should be cared for just as anyone who comes to regret other types of medically necessary intervention. I argue that putting a blanket ban on all transgender kids receiving puberty blockers and corrective hormone replacement therapy is devaluing their lives. This policy will ultimately harm many using a slim number of people as a justification, a slim number of people who *\*will\** receive care when and if they decide to detransition. Would a heart bypass be banned because a portion regret the procedure? Would this be true of chemo therapy? If not, why is it true of transition related care? I've seen claims that puberty blockers are risky and problematic. I respond by asking why, then, are transgender children only being blocked from using them? Should this not apply to all children? I've seen religious objections. Again I wonder, if this bill is to pass, why we are not making all blood transfusions for children illegal? Jehovah's Witnesses are impacted by the fact this procedure exists and they must deny this service for their children. I've seen objections claiming that transgender kids impact athletic competition, especially for girls. I argue that while a different issue, banning HRT for transgender children will simply exacerbate this issue. The crux of the athletic conflict is the fact transgender girls experience a male puberty. This will be addressed by medical intervention for transgender children who would otherwise experience a male puberty. I've seen claims that the science is still out. While science is always advancing there is extensive research on being transgender, puberty blockers, hormone replacement therapy, and the immense benefit of allowing transgender people to transition and live an authentic life. An intense plurality of scientific research validates and supports the care for transgender people - children and adults. I must ask what impact will this bill ultimately have? The only answer I can see is making the lives of transgender people harder in every way by forcing children to go through puberties that will forever mark them. It seems the end impact is to make living as transgender harder and force people to make a decision as to which kind of adversity they are willing to face - forever living alienated from your body and self but experience the safety of not being visibly transgender OR live openly as transgender with a higher likelihood of being seen as such? I urge the Missouri Legislature to vote against HB33 for the safety of transgender children and for the good of the state. We will live in a far more productive Missouri that spends less on caring for people who have to face adversity such as mine. (Re-submitting in order to get the Zoom link.) I am Joey Borrelli, and I am a 20-year-old transgender man from St. Louis, Missouri. I oppose HB 33. Gender-affirming healthcare is lifesaving healthcare. Transgender Missourians-- including minors-- exist, have always existed, and will continue to exist, despite any legislation to the contrary. Banning transgender minors from accessing necessary healthcare-- a decision in which the government should have no part-- will only succeed in further isolating and harming many of our children. I started taking testosterone just days before my 17th birthday on September 25th, 2017. It is a day that I will remember forever and celebrate every year because it saved my life. From the moment I knew that I needed to take testosterone to begin my medical transition, it took over a year before I had my first shot. I had to have six months of psychotherapy with a specialized gender therapist, a diagnosis of gender dysphoria, and two letters of recommendation from two separate doctors. On my first visit to the endocrinologist after spending months on a waiting list, the doctor barely looked at me, told me that I was not ready, and sent me home feeling empty. When that late September day finally came, my mom took photos of my first shot, and I danced around the room with the nurse. Finally, I could start my life as the real me. For most transgender people, gender-affirming medicine helps us to connect our bodies and our minds, which greatly improves our mental health and quality of life. Drawing from reports by transgender activist and Harvard graduate Schuyler Bailor, half of all transgender minors have attempted suicide, and this is largely due to having families who do not accept them, abuse and sexual harassment, bullying, and lack of access to affirming medical care. Importantly, transgender minors having access to gender-affirming medical care-- such as puberty blockers and hormones-- decreases their risk of suicide by 3.5 times. It is no overstatement to say that gender-affirming healthcare is lifesaving healthcare. I ask the representatives now: what mental toll would it have on you to be perceived as a different gender than you are all day, every day? Unfortunately-- as illustrated by my personal story--, access to this medical care in Missouri for any transgender person is extremely difficult, and this difficulty is astronomically heightened if that transgender person is a minor. I struggled through many dark days while the state withheld the medical care that I needed to vastly improve my day-to-day life. HB 33-- and similar propositions-- will be a death sentence for so many children in our community. Legislation such as HB 33 comes from largely misinformed perspectives on what gender-affirming medical care looks like for transgender minors. Not a single person is performing surgery on transgender minors: that is illegal. All puberty blockers do is delay puberty, allowing children and their families time to decide how best to proceed. Because they do not do anything, once puberty blockers are removed, puberty continues as normal. Hormones may only be administered after the age of 15 and after months of navigating the maze-like medical system. I ask that, before voting, all representatives look into what it is really like to be a transgender minor. Gender-affirming healthcare saved my life as a transgender minor in Missouri. Today, I look in the mirror and love my reflection. I also work with other



transgender kids to show them that they, too, have a future full of love waiting for them. Our children are our future, and without giving them our support, trust, and love, what will all of our futures look like? In order to promote a Missouri with a future, a Missouri that values its children, and a Missouri that values compassion, I am asking that representatives vote "no" on HB 33. Regarding the Transgender Youth Healthcare BanMy son is Transgender. Transitioning saved his life. He had to emancipate himself from his Mother at 16/17 just to be a Lesbian and save himself. But he knew he wasn't a Lesbian. He was coming out in stages. He was bringing us along. This is a regular pattern, as Transgender youth recognize that they won't be believed and they don't know anyone around who is like them. He was afraid to lose us. At 19 he started hrt and at 20 he had affirmation surgery. He's not a woman. He's a man. He's a very good man who is working on a career in criminal Justice. Over the last 6 years I've carefully listened to hundreds of Trans people and their parents. I've read the best peer reviewed studies, I've also read the worst studies by associations closely connected to organizations that push Conversion Therapy (proven not work and to cause extraordinarily high rates of suicide). The best practices are clear and outlined by the AMA and the American Academy of PediatricsBeing accepted and getting proper Transgender healthcare is essential for a full and productive life. It's often essential for survivalIt is an absolute evil lie that most Transgender people can resolve their identity back to that assigned at birth, Sex assigned at birth means virtually nothing as infants do not undergo extensive investigation into the many genetic and chromosomal variations and distinctions that make up the spectrum of gender and sex on which we all exist. Infants don't undergo brain spectrometry. Being Transgender is not a mental illness however, Stigmatization and lack of affirming healthcare can exacerbate and cause severe mental anguish leading to suicide and lives of suffering that often lead to self medication. A good portion of sex and most of gender is in the brain, not the genitals. Gender identity has a primal biological marker in the brain. Our genitals can't think. Genitals don't know their gender. Knowing our gender is the brains job. We can change superficial morphological features and secondary sex characteristics. We can't change the fundamental gender wiring of the brain. I watched a young depressed and suicidal Transgender female go from having to leave their Scout Troop and not doing well in school, to transitioning, changing their name, being accepted into a new school and the sport of their gender, and then blowing away their ACT's and being accepted into a prestigious Institute of Technology. They didn't ruin High school girl's sports. Their acceptance by their parents, school, and sports team likely saved their life and gave society a healthy human being who is going to make life better for all of us by what they are able to accomplish for a society that treats them well. It saved this child's life to not have to go through the wrong puberty. Transgender folks that are supported in their gender identity become Doctors, Lawyers, and a generally healthy part of society. Transgender people that aren't supported are targets of high rates of physical and mental anguish, violence, discrimination, and suicide. Acceptance of LGBTQ kids, as who they say they are, saves their lives and wins society healthy productive citizens. The attempted suicide rate of LGBTQ kids, when not accepted by parents and society, is as high as 74% for Black Transgender females. The rates for attempted suicide come down as we peel away multiple intersectional identities but at each drop it is the relationship of acceptance that the individual feels

that improves their life, their outcomes, and their benefit to society. 1. WHO WILL THIS BAN HURT?: A. I can guarantee you that this ban will cause suicide and enable misguided caretakers to abuse and bully some children to death, in schools, in divorce custody battles, and in our healthcare system. B. This ban will devastate Transgender youth that might never make it to adulthood without proper healthcare. This bill is abusive, monstrous, and deadly. C. This bill will criminalize Doctors and caretakers for saving and improving the lives of Transgender youth. It will criminalize Doctors for listening to their patients and following the best evidenced scientific studies available. D. This bill will hurt Intersex/Transgender boys that were given vagina-plastys in childhood because society was so hell bent on assigning them a gender right away. Doctors mistakenly turned these boy's micro penises into vaginas in childhood. We can't penalize the children again by keeping them from the restorative healthcare they deserve. 2. WHAT PROBLEM WILL THIS BAN SOLVE?: This ban is a remedy for a non-existent problem. Most Transgender youth aren't aware or courageous enough to be persistent, insistent, and consistent enough to understand their identity before 19. They have spent their whole life being told by their parents and peers that they are blue instead of red. It takes some time to unwind so much oppositional input even in the midst of overwhelming suffering and dysphoria. For the young children that understand their incongruity, being kept from proper healthcare is an excruciating Hell scape. To be forced to undergo the wrong puberty, when it could have been avoided is a living waking constant nightmare. 3. WHAT DOES SEX ASSIGNED AT BIRTH MEAN?: Where does a truly ambiguous Intersex person fit under the term 'sex assigned at birth'? They fit with their gender that they come to figure out as they grow and develop. A gender that is often different than many Doctors have wanted to assign and construct at birth. Through no fault of their own many Intersex boys with micro-penises and macro clitorises were given vagina-plastys because society was so eager to place people into a gender binary and because it was "easier to make a whole than a pole." Sex assigned at birth can't tell us about the XX males and XY females – a reversal of the usual chromosome expressions. It doesn't tell us about androgen insensitivity, aneuploidy, Turner's syndrome, or Klinefelter's syndrome. It doesn't tell us about males, by sex and gender, who will be mistaken throughout their lives as females and it doesn't tell us about females, by sex and gender, who will be mistaken throughout their lives as males. It doesn't tell us about the several ways someone can be Intersex and not even know it. It doesn't tell us about the high testosterone females and the low testosterone males. It doesn't tell us about the gender of brains, which through spectrometry, now show us greater similarity between Transgender females and Cis females than between Transgender females and Cis males. I find it uncanny that color blindness, a trait that effects more males than females, is prevalent among the many Trans men I know. For the purpose of self-segregating society by male and female traits we overwhelmingly use the overall genetic composition, as diverse as it is, of gender not sex. And the final recognition of gender is in the brain not the genitals. There is an enormous range of being Male and Female and Non-Binary, Transgender, and Intersex fall into that range. Especially with a little help from our healthcare specialists. 4. WHAT IS THE LAW FOR?: To deny some children equal access and rights to the best individualized healthcare, to limit instead of protect the health of already marginalized individuals, is a horrible misuse of the Law. My name is Ana, I use she/her pronouns, and I'm a transgender woman living in Sedalia. HB 33 inherently debases our state's transgender youth and strips them of their ability to act in accordance to what makes them the most comfortable in their own bodies, and it is for this reason that I am in opposition to the bill. As a kid, I knew there was a big incongruency with how I viewed myself and how others viewed me. After a church dinner, my family would help clean up the dining area. There are so many more examples like this in my life, but I think this one demonstrates well that adulthood is not a requirement to recognize when something doesn't fit with one's own sense of self. I realized I was trans when I was 17, and if HB 33 had been voted into law then, I would have been denied the ability to receive the hormone replacement therapy that has made my life so much better today. My name is James Thurow, from St. Louis, Missouri. I am here to testify in opposition to HB 33. I believe that while the sponsor of this bill might believe she is protecting young people, this bill does not accomplish that and instead discriminates against them unnecessarily, especially since there are currently medical standards in place that adequately address the issue. I am the proud stepfather of a 14 year old transgender boy that has flourished since receiving gender affirming healthcare. His grades improved. His attitude improved. He is undoubtedly happier. The thing he wants most is just to be seen as a kid; not just as a transgender kid, but just a kid. Most kids don't have to go to the legislature to discuss their healthcare. They don't have to ask the legislature to not outlaw their healthcare. In fact, there is a bill introduced this session that "[p]rovides for parents' exclusive right to control the upbringing of their children." (HJR1) But, for some reason, this doesn't apply to my family. The sponsor of that bill is also Suzie Pollock. Our family's decisions about our child's healthcare are not being made in a vacuum or against medical advice. His mother and I care for him deeply. It is why we came last week to testify and are happy we could do so remotely this time. The last thing we want is for any harm to come to him. Which is why it seems ridiculous that we would ever be reported to Child Protective Services. Especially, when you consider that it would be for allowing him to receive the healthcare we, as a family, have decided is the best for him in consultation with a team of healthcare providers, which are following best care practices. Not receiving this treatment would be very harmful to my stepson. Thank you for reading my testimony. Dear Honorable Committee Members, My name is Jamie Cayley and I am a transgender man living in Greene County. I would like to express my opposition to HB 33, which would be severely detrimental to young transgender people's wellbeing and punish medical professionals and parents who follow the standards of care and are supportive and accepting of their children. Transgender youth are a highly vulnerable population. The 2015 US Transgender Survey is the most comprehensive survey about US-based transgender people to date, including 27,715 respondents. Some notable statistics from this survey include: 39% of respondents were experiencing serious psychological distress, compared to 5% in the US population; 40% have attempted suicide at some point in their life compared to 4.6% in the US population, and 46% reported being verbally harassed in the prior year. Out of the respondents who reported suicide attempts, 34% reported their first suicide attempt was at age 13 or younger, and 39% reported their first attempt was when they were between 14 and 17 years old. Personally, I was lucky to be able to access medical care when I was underage. By the time I managed to make it through the minimum of 6 months of required therapy and openly living as a man to be allowed to see a provider, it was too late for blockers to be helpful. However, I did get to start testosterone when I was 17, and the impact on my mental and physical health was drastic and almost immediate, despite no physical changes occurring until I had been on testosterone for around 4 months. Ever since I can remember, I've always wanted to have top surgery. Well before I became aware that transgender people existed, I was exposed to family members and famous people having double mastectomies due to either breast cancer or breast cancer risk and I remember my 11 year old self wishing I had cancer so I could have surgery. Surgery was never an option on the table until I became 18, and I didn't have surgery until I was 20. In the meantime, I spent 5 years wearing a chest binder. I found it extremely distressing to take my binder off, but it's recommended to not wear a binder for long hours and to never wear them while exercising. I tried to do so despite the warnings, and I bruised my ribs several times as a result, eventually giving up on any kind of physical activity. When I was 18, I moved from the US to England, and I spent a few months off testosterone while I was trying to see a specialist there to continue my medical care. Those months were incredibly difficult for me, and my mental health deteriorated greatly. Later on, when I was 19, after a long wait I was finally on the surgeon's waitlist to receive top surgery, but I got a call saying I wouldn't be able to have surgery due to funding issues and that there was no timeline regarding when I may be able to have it. Suicide attempts are rarely the result of a single event, but that call was the last push that lead me to an almost successful suicide attempt which landed me in the Intensive Care Unit for 10 days. Unfortunately, my story isn't uncommon. For example, several transgender youths in the UK have self-harmed or attempted suicide following their medical care being halted due to a court case similar to HB 33. As a trans activist, and someone who is often in contact with transgender youth and their families, I have often heard people express concern about trans youth receiving medical care because they are scared of the impact it will

have on fertility and children not being old enough to grasp the consequences, and children receiving treatment and later realizing that they are not transgender, possibly after their bodies having undergone irreversible changes. Regarding fertility, all clinics I have encountered that provide treatment to transgender youth offer sperm and egg freezing before treatment, and there's a growing amount of evidence that both blockers and Hormone Replacement Therapy may not render people infertile. For example, the Trans Pregnancy Project has found several transgender people who have successfully become pregnant and given birth to healthy children after having been on testosterone for several years and pausing testosterone for around 6-12 months. Medical providers often have to warn people that testosterone is not a form of birth control, as people can sometimes conceive while taking testosterone, something I've personally experienced. As of right now I have been on testosterone for 5 years, I am planning on becoming pregnant in the future, and I have no concerns about my ability to do so. In terms of irreversible changes, puberty blockers do not cause irreversible changes, they just put a pause to puberty to give transgender children, their healthcare providers, and their families the time to figure out how to proceed on a case by case basis. If blockers are stopped, puberty proceeds as it would have if blockers hadn't been introduced, it just happens later, not unlike how blockers work when given to children who experience precocious puberty. If I had been able to access blockers, it would have prevented my body from going through changes that caused severe distress and required major surgery to reverse, with scars that will always remind me of what used to be there. By keeping blockers from transgender youth, we are putting them at risk of exactly what people are afraid of – their bodies undergoing unwanted permanent changes or unwanted changes that require surgical intervention. Studies have shown that having strongly supportive parents can lead to a significant reduction in suicide attempts, with one study showing a 93% reduction compared to transgender children with unsupportive, or reluctantly supportive parents. A meta-analysis of 56 studies regarding the effects of transition showed that around 0.3-3.8% of people regret transition and the regret is most likely the result of lack of social support after transitioning. Further, 52 studies (93%) showed a positive impact on wellbeing as a result of transition, while none showed adverse effects. That is strong evidence of the positive effects of transition, and medical transition is part of the standards of care, so doctors would be reprimanded for providing appropriate medical healthcare that has minimal risk even if children decide that they are not transgender and don't want to transition. I urge you to vote no on HB33, because not only does it put transgender youth at risk due to either denied or halted treatment, but it also unfairly punishes doctors and parents who are behaving in ways that to this date are the only scientifically proven ways to successfully treat gender identity dysphoria and either treat or prevent the severe mental health issues that often come alongside it. House Committee on Children and Families Chairwoman Coleman HB 33 March 10, 2020 Dear Honorable Committee Members, On behalf of the American Civil Liberties Union of Missouri our approximately 15,000 members and the approximately 25,000 trans & gnc people statewide, I would like to express our strong opposition to HB 33—legislation that criminalizes providing necessary health care to transgender youth. HB 33 restricts healthcare for youth by revoking the licenses of doctors, nurses, and other medical professionals who provide gender-affirming care. Denying scientific and evidence-based care for trans individuals by punishing those practitioners who provide gender affirming care is cruel, the care they give allows children to be true to themselves and thrive. This bill would unnecessarily codify serious government intrusion into the patient-physician relationship that would restrict discussions and information on the best health care available for a transgender child. The bill is providing a solution to a problem Missouri does not have. Many of the care options listed in the bill are not actually available or offered to young people. Still, regardless of the medical intervention a family seeks, we affirm that these decisions should be left to families to privately address. One size never fits all. The medical necessity of transition-related care for transgender individuals is recognized by nearly every major medical association in the United States, from the American Medical Association to the American Academy of Pediatrics to the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists. All agree that state-based intrusions into treatment of trans youth blocks access to gender-affirming care that in study after study, improves the physical and mental health of transgender individuals. These measures are incredibly unnecessary legislative overreach. This bill is discriminatory yet disguised as being savior-minded. Sometimes she had to speak up to make sure our concerns were being heard and, thankfully, our doctors listened to her. But she never had to argue with politicians about what was best for her children. HB 33 will change that for many Missouri families. Instead of children, parents and doctors working together to follow best practices, the state government will prohibit — and criminalize — those best practices and make decisions for Missourians. I am a father to five incredible children. Two of them received diagnoses of Autism Spectrum Disorder and Language Disorder. We have had the help of medical professionals every step of the way, and they have been incredible. Not once have we been refused any medical best practices because politicians decided it wasn't acceptable. I am so thankful for that. I'm also a friend to people who have trans children. I have watched them do everything they can to give their children the best healthcare possible. Research shows that transgender youth whose families support their gender identity, as my friends do, have a 52% decrease in suicidal thoughts, a 48% decrease in suicide attempts and significant increases in self-esteem and physical and mental health. Denying healthcare options to families like these would put the lives of their children at risk. Transgender youth who do not receive proper care are at increased risk of depression, social isolation, self-hatred and risk of self-harm and suicidal behavior. The care that HB 33 will prohibit is supported by the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American Medical Association, among other organizations, and can be life-saving for trans kids. It is supported by research and science. Taking these options away takes choice away from families who are simply doing the best they can to care for their children and give them care that is both necessary and recommended. Hi, I'm Jennifer Goldring. I live in St. Louis County. HB33 will directly and negatively impact my family. I urge you to vote no on HB33. My 14 year-old son is creative, funny, a dreamer, ambitious, a kind and compassionate human being, a leader at school, and a great friend. He's a great kid and every day I'm so proud of the young-adult he is becoming. He's also transgender and him having access to proper medical care has been life changing and actually helped lift him out of a deep depression. In the summer of 2018 when he was 12 he came out as transgender. Before he came out he had been struggling with a long and sever depression. No one in our family was sure what to make of the sadness, anger, and frustration that engulfed him. He wasn't even sure exactly what was going on he just knew he had little to no joy or happiness. The summer of 2018 as we explored what was causing his depression he shared things with me like, "I feel trapped in the wrong body." "I feel like I was born the wrong gender." "I feel more like a boy than a girl." So we had countless conversations about gender and gender identity and what felt right and true to him at his very core. And it turns out that identifying as male was what felt true and right for him. We as parents did an abundance of research and reached out to professionals and educated ourselves about what our son was going through. Him talking about his gender identity to me and his father and other family felt like a huge burden had been lifted from his shoulders. He came out of his depression. He started to smile again. He cut his hair short. He wore the clothes he wanted. He started fitting in with his peers. He had a huge sense of relief that he could be exactly who he wanted to be and that he didn't have to hide. He had a huge sense of relief that he would be loved unconditionally no matter how he identified because at the core he was still the same kid. Just like all parents we just want the best for our child. We want him to feel good about himself, to feel like he fits in and is part of his community and we want him to be happy. As the weeks progressed he started therapy and started working with a doctor at the St. Louis Children's Hospital Gender Clinic. These were all very helpful things because even though my son was able to be who he wanted he was still struggling with gender dysphoria and we needed to get him some help to treat these things. His gender dysphoria was giving him major panic attacks and making him consider self harm. This sense that he was trapped in the wrong body and that his body didn't belong to him was overwhelming. He was terrified about starting puberty as a girl. He absolutely did not want to develop breasts or have a period. These changes felt so overwhelming and wrong that he felt he might not be able to live in that body. We were very fortunate that there was a medical option to help combat this and to at least press the pause button until he had more time figure things out and until we had more time to research and educate ourselves. With the help of our son's therapist and doctor we were able to get medical intervention in the form of a puberty blocker that essentially pushed the pause button on puberty for him. This treatment was essential for the overall health and wellbeing of my son and in turn for our family. In a way this puberty blocker saved my son's life. He could have a little solace about everything he was worried about. He could focus on just being a kid and enjoying

himself. These early medical interventions are incredibly important for youth that are questioning their gender identity and these medical treatments literally save children's lives. Sadly, the other side of the coin when children don't get the resources they so desperately need is that these kids attempt suicide or self harm. Research shows that transgender youth whose families support their gender identity have a 52% decrease in suicidal thoughts, a 48% decrease in suicide attempts, and significant increases in self-esteem and physical and mental health. The negative outcomes are avoidable by giving families and medical providers control of their own decisions so they can give the children the support they need. We are just one of thousands of families and children who will be impacted negatively by this legislation. Additionally, we just want our children to be able to have care that is backed by the American Academy of Pediatrics and that is backed by other leading professionals. Following AAP best practices should not be a criminal act. I urge you to vote no on HB33 and to leave these life changing and life saving decisions in the hands of families and doctors. You can't possibly know how damaging this bill is to transgender youth and their families, and what a slippery slope it is to let law makers make medical decisions that should be left up to individuals. Medical care and treatment are essential for the health, safety, and wellbeing of transgender and gender questioning youth and denying them treatment is unconscionable. Please vote no on HB33. I am Rev. Jessica Foster, the pastor of First and Park United Methodist Churches in Hannibal, Missouri, and I oppose HB 33. I testify as a straight, cisgender, and affirming Christian pastor. I know many of you are Christians, and some of you may assume Christians do not affirm transgender people and therefore all true Christians would support this bill. I am here to tell you that's incorrect and to encourage anyone here whose motivations for denying trans kids healthcare are biblical in nature to think more deeply.

"In the image of God, God created them; male and female he created them" (Genesis 1:27). Yet this can't mean nonbinary and transgender people are evil or beyond God's love. Genesis also says God made light and dark— but we have dawn and dusk. Genesis says God made land and sea— but we have swamps and marshes. God's creative power transcends "male" and "female." Jacob is said to be "quiet," to stay inside, to cook, to stick close to his mother (Genesis 25:27-29). This transgressor of gender boundaries is one of the Old Testament's great heroes.

God is said to be "Father" (Matthew 5:16) and to give birth nursing mother (Isaiah 49:15; Psalm 131). The Old Testament occasionally uses plural. they/them pronouns for God (Matthew Oseka, "A Textual Study of the Passages Containing Plural Forms Related to the Generic Name of God" in Vox Scriptura). Gender fluidity is at the heart of the being of the Judeo-Christian God. "Eunuch" is a word used for men in the ancient world whose genitals, sexual characteristics, and gender presentation were nonstandard. In Isaiah 56:3-4, God tells eunuchs not to say, "I'm a dry tree," and to remember God wants to give them "a monument and a name." Jesus himself says, "There are eunuchs who have been eunuchs by birth... Those who can accept it should accept it," (Matthew 19:13) recognizing and tacitly affirming gender fluidity. And in Acts 8:27-39, a eunuch is baptized without ever being told his gender status is a problem.

In Matthew 25:35, Jesus says, "I was a stranger and you welcomed me." People who fall outside the mainstream, in a unique way, reflect the presence of Jesus. This has certainly been my experience interacting with trans and nonbinary people in the Hannibal area. Bravely, they listened to the inner voice telling them their real truth even though the world often did not understand. Courageously, in the face of many obstacles— ranging from parental rejection to bullying at school so intense they considered suicide— they fight to become who they are. They model for me what strength looks like. They reflect the image of the God too big and creative to be stuffed into a narrow box. They incarnate the presence of Jesus who listened to the voice of the Spirit despite the noise of the critics around him. Please, listen to the doctors, parents, and trans folks testifying today who will tell you why medical care for trans teens is critical and lifesaving. Please, don't let anyone tell you that you must choose between listening to them or to Judeo-Christian values. Please, let Missouri trans youth medically transition into all God calls them to become.

My name is Julia Unangst, and I live in Chesterfield, Missouri. I strongly oppose HB33. By criminalizing medical practices, HB33 will directly harm Missouri's youth. This legislation sends a signal to transgender or gender-diverse children that their identities do not matter and that their identity is illegal in the eyes of the state. Preventing access to care will cause devastating harm to our children, our families, and our community - these kids need our support to simply be themselves. The medical practices being attacked by this bill provide lifesaving treatment that improves the lives of so many children. Without these practices, children's physical and mental well-being will suffer. Just last year I lost a friend to suicide. He was unable to receive the help he needed to fully transition due to lack of state resources & support. This prevented him from having the chance to live as the person he knew he was inside. Already, the stigma and discrimination faced by people who are transgender is prominent in Missouri. HB33 will perpetuate this. If my friend had been able to access the medical care he needed, he would still be here today. Instead, he had to grow up in a body that he did not identify as his own. The only way of escape was to die. He had just turned 22. Unfortunately this all too common - more than 40% of adults who were not affirmed in their trans identity have attempted suicide (2015 U.S. Transgender Survey). Access to gender-affirming medical care is linked to lower rates of suicidal ideation and suicide attempts. Getting rid of this access, which HB33 will do, will increase suicidal behaviors and attempts among our youth. Transgender children, like all children, are only able to thrive when they receive the healthcare that they need. Best medical practices for transgender children involve delaying puberty until they are old enough to make their own decisions about their lived gender. It's very simple, but without it, can cause devastating harm to the child and the community. We should be able to provide our children with the care that they need to survive. HB33 will harm Missouri's children. Please oppose this bill so Missouri can be a safe and supportive place for ALL children.

ADL Heartland (Anti-Defamation League) Written Testimony for House Committee on Children and Families March 3, 2021 On behalf of ADL (the Anti-Defamation League) and the Heartland region, I write to express our concern and opposition to HB 33. Founded in 1913, ADL is the nation's leading civil rights and human relations organization, combating antisemitism and all forms of bigotry, as well as promoting understanding and diversity throughout the United States and abroad. Anti-trans bias is the marginalization and/or oppression of people who are transgender and/or non-binary based on the belief that cisgender identity is the norm. No person should be subject to discrimination because of who they are, including for their sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression. Yet, HB 33 places oppressive restrictions on transgender youth by restricting healthcare access for some of the most vulnerable children in our state. Not only does it deny young people access to life-saving medical care, but it also sends all TGNC people the message that their government believes that who they are is inherently unworthy of care. This is particularly toxic in a world where anti-trans hate and bias remains. We have a duty to work to dismantle this hate, bias, and violence, not contribute to it. Our goal for all young people should be that they not only survive but thrive. Accessing gender-affirming care empowers TGNC youth to do both. The harms of failing to meet the healthcare needs of TGNC youth are dire, up to and including death. The benefits of meeting these needs, however, are substantial. Claims that this law protects our young people are misinformed at best – this law does quite the opposite, endangering them by stopping them from being able to access vital health care. The harms of inadequate access to gender-affirming medical care for TGNC people are well-documented. Both adolescents and adults who are transgender have high rates of depression, anxiety, eating disorders, self-harm, and suicide – not inherently due to their transgender identity but due to a confluence of factors including “an internal conflict between one's appearance and identity, limited availability of mental health services, low access to health care providers with expertise in caring for youth who identify as [transgender and gender diverse], discrimination, stigma, and social rejection.” The American Psychiatric Association finds a direct connection between discrimination against transgender and gender diverse people, lack of equal civil rights, and the harm that these realities do to the mental health of transgender and gender diverse people. Gender-affirming care, including social, medical, and legal aspects, has been shown to improve the mental health of TGNC people. It bears reiterating, as many others have said, that gender-affirming care saves young people's lives. Even the simple act of consistently using a TGNC youth's chosen name directly results in lower suicidal ideation and lower suicidal behavior, with the effect growing stronger with each additional context where their name is used (home, school, work, and friends). Similarly, gender-affirming hormone therapy (GAHT) has been shown to significantly decrease suicidality among transgender youth. More than just increasing their chances of surviving adolescence, however, gender-affirming



care empowers TGNC youth to explore and affirm their gender identity. Additionally, pubertal suppression is associated with a decrease in clinically significant behavioral and emotional problems and an improvement in overall psychological functioning. Young people thrive when their essential needs are met, and gender-affirming care is an essential need for TGNC youth. HB 33 also raises significant legal and constitutional concerns that, if the bill is enacted, will be closely scrutinized in the courts. There is a strong case to be made that this legislation is unconstitutional and, if enacted, will be setting Missouri up for costly and extensive legal challenges. At a time when Missouri is challenged by COVID-19, this bill is a distraction from efforts to ensure that residents' health and other needs are addressed. Moreover, we can little afford to entertain costly legal challenges to harmful bills while our economy continues to struggle through this pandemic. ADL asks you to commit to promoting Missouri as welcoming of all people and as a safe, nurturing place for our youth, and strongly urges you to oppose this legislation. I am a private practice therapist, licensed in the state of MO, who specializes in working with the transgender community and provides training to other professionals on the needs of this population and international standards of care. This bill is potentially catastrophic for transgender youth in our state. First, the internationally applicable WPATH standard of care already excludes those under the age of majority from genital surgery. Youths in Missouri are not having those surgeries, and this bill accomplishes nothing in that regard. What it would almost certainly accomplish would be an increase in youth suicides. Studies show that providing transgender youth with age appropriate interventions, including puberty blocking for younger adolescents and hormone therapy for older adolescents, reduces the otherwise high rate of suicide in this population. The WPATH standard of care already has a high bar for qualification for these interventions. The Trevor Project reports that 40% of transgender adults report having made a suicide attempt, and 92% of those attempts were made before the age of 25. What I see reported in my practice is in line with this statistic. The Missouri legislature should be focusing on how it can protect this population from the astronomically high rate of discrimination and violence that lead to these suicide attempts and leave the healthcare decisions up to the experts, in this case, those who have crafted the evidence-based and internationally applicable standard of care, the doctors, the mental health experts, the parents, and the transgender youths in our community.

My name is Dr. Kerri Schafer and I live in Columbia, MO. I am a licensed psychologist, working with college students at the MU Counseling Center, and a board member at The Center Project, Mid-Missouri's first and only LGBTQ community center. I spend a good deal of my time listening to the stories of transgender folks and educating others in an effort to make the world a safer and more hospitable place for our transgender community members. I oppose HB33. According to the American Academy for Pediatrics and all other major healthcare associations, caring for a transgender child or adolescent must include affirming their gender. This is rooted in empirical evidence that doing so results in improved mental health, improved quality of life, and perhaps most importantly, reduced suicide risk in the short- and long-term. Research demonstrating that gender-affirming healthcare decreases suicide risk is especially important because transgender individuals are at significantly increased risk for attempted and completed suicide compared to cisgender (non-transgender) individuals. This increased suicide risk is due to the effects of discrimination and oppression (for example, being at risk of losing basic human rights such as the right to appropriate healthcare, having their identities debated in public forums). The same people who want to ban healthcare for trans children and adolescents are also citing essential biological differences between genders as reasons to ban trans youth from participating in sports teams in accordance with the gender they know themselves to be. These politicians want to force transgender adolescents to go through a traumatic puberty and then point to the characteristics developed during puberty as reasons they are a threat to cisgender youth. It seems to amount to an effort to erase and exclude trans youth altogether. For those who are truly concerned about the welfare of transgender youth, please know that gender-affirming medical treatment for a minor involves thoughtful, watchful care from doctors and parents. There are already existing, evidence-based medical standards that require insistent, persistent, and consistent assertions from a child about their gender before initiating puberty blockers, which temporarily prevent puberty. Many youth have been sharing what they know about their gender for over a decade before initiating hormone therapy that would involve permanent bodily changes. Gender-affirming medical care is a medically necessary treatment for gender dysphoria for many youth. Anyone who was at the hearing one year ago can easily recall the pleading from parents who were terrified at the thought of their child's medical care being taken away. This bill would take choices away from transgender youth and prevent them from living as the person they know they are inside. It would punish healthcare providers and parents who care deeply for transgender youth and just want to take good care of them. It is no exaggeration to say that gender-affirming medical care is suicide prevention, and that if this bill passes the effects would be catastrophic. When it comes to private medical decisions, all of us want the dignity to be able to make those decisions for ourselves and our children, in consultation with a trusted healthcare provider. Please vote in opposition of this extremely harmful bill.

Hello, my name is Kit Steitz and I'm writing to you as a Missourian, a step-parent, and a concerned citizen. I'm writing to you in firm opposition to HB33. I want to talk to you about several trans family members of mine and how legislation like this harms them, but there is such a stigma in Missouri that to out my family and loved ones in such a way is equally dangerous. If you've grown up with a trans family member or had trans people in your life, you've watched how they struggle to find their authentic selves, to share that with others, how much hiding who they are hurts them. You've watched them slowly stop going out, exercising, swimming, because they don't feel safe or like themselves in unsafe public places. You've driven them to unisex bathrooms 30 minutes away from a wedding reception because they don't feel safe peeing at a family function because there were no unisex bathrooms available. You go to the bathroom with with your trans fam/friends at gas stations because there is safety in numbers and you don't want them to be assaulted again for just going pee. You've watched the people you love jump through every hoop to get healthcare, and still be denied. You've watched as they had to go to another city to get gender affirming surgery that was paid for out of pocket because no insurance would cover this life saving procedure. I have known and loved trans people in my life for over 30 years. Let me tell you, Missouri is a terrifying place to be different. As a queer born & bred Missourian, I've seen this, and know it in my bones. Trans kids know, just as cis kids know, their gender when they are very young. Unlike cis children, trans kids aren't affirmed. They learn from a young age that who they are is something other people don't like, don't support, don't love. 90% of homeless kids are trans youth, because they are kicked out of their homes for coming out as who they are. Our biggest struggles as parents is to keep our kids alive, to give them opportunity and hope that they can thrive, but trans kids are statistically more likely to die by suicide. According to the HRC, "More than half of transgender male teens who participated in the survey reported attempting suicide in their lifetime, while 29.9 percent of transgender female teens said they attempted suicide. Among non-binary youth, 41.8 percent of respondents stated that they had attempted suicide at some point in their lives." How can we keep our babies alive, if we can't even get them the healthcare they need to survive? We can't keep our children alive if we don't believe them and support them. I am a psychologist living and practicing in St. Louis. I regularly see transgender teenagers and can testify to the tremendous harm this bill would inflict upon them. Trans children already struggle to get healthcare that reflects their gender identity, resulting in internalized transphobia and actual physical harm related to lack of healthcare. This bill sends a clear message that Missouri does not recognize their humanity, and the damage this does to the mental health of trans kids cannot be overstated. The suicide rate for trans kids is already so much higher than cis kids because of messaging like this, and the passing of this bill will directly harm the health of children because their access to care will be restricted, and indirectly harm the health of children because of this impact to mental health, suffering, and loss of dignity. Suicidality increases for transgender individuals who are unable to access treatment. This bill would charge medical professionals for following the ethics of their profession. By not allowing transgender individuals to receive puberty blockers or hormone therapy until 18 years old, this person will most likely have already reached Tanner Stage 5. This means the individual was forced to go through puberty although it may have created great dysphoria. It also means that the individual may have gone through body changes, such as a deepening of the voice or an Adam's apple or large breasts, that then have to be treated through other options later when they could have avoided developing these physical changes in the first place. It is wholly unconscionable to think you should charge parents with child abuse for complying with doctor's recommendations following Standard of Care. Additionally, this bill is fear-mongering as medical standards of care do not allow for children to have genital surgical interventions mentioned in the bill unless they are intersex. Puberty blockers are reversible and have no known long term harm. Hormone therapy for gender affirmation is not prescribed until adolescence. These treatments are also only prescribed after assessing youth for persistence of gender dysphoria and/or gender incongruence. HB 33 - Denies trans youth access to gender affirming, and live saving careChairwoman Coleman, Vice -Chairwoman Bailey, members of the committee; thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony in opposition to HB 33.NARAL Pro-Choice Missouri, representing 70,000 Missourians across the state, works to protect and expand every Missourians's right to decide if, when, how and with whom to start and grow their family and to parent in safety and dignity. Moreover, we work to ensure reproductive justice for all Missourians, which involves advocating to reduce health disparities based on race, socioeconomic status, insurance coverage status, gender identity, and other factors.Last week, the U.S. House of Representatives passed the The Equality Act, banning discrimination based on being transgender, when someone's gender identity is different from the gender assigned to at birth. Transgender students are more susceptible to bullying, sexual assault, and drug use, than cisgender students, causing transgender youth to be more than 3 times more likely to attempt suicide. Gender discrimination is present in their everyday lives. HB 33 would be a violation of the tenets included in The Equality Act, and if passed would amount to state-sanctioned bullying of transgender youth. In addition to perpetuating harm against Missouri youth, HB 33 criminalizes medical best practices for caring for transgender youth, which have been endorsed by organizations including the American Academy of Pediatrics, adding additional societal and medical barriers to accessing healthcare. These restrictions are associated with the increased risk of violence, suicide, and sexually transmitted diseases. Members of the Children and Families committee, As with any issue that concerns medical care, I ask that you look to the experts in the field. The Endocrine Society, WPATH, American Academy of Pediatrics, and others view puberty blockers, and hormone therapy later in their teens, as the appropriate treatment for transgender youth when they meet the appropriate criteria. Studies show that this treatment has a significant impact to the mental health of minors who need it, and a very high rate of satisfaction with effects of the treatment. Puberty blockers give kids a chance to make a decision that will have long lasting effects. And the vast majority of youth who start this treatment will continue to identify as transgender into adulthood, despite the narrative that has been pushed across many media outlets. There is a perception that withholding puberty blockers or hormone therapy is a neutral stance, and that transgender individuals can simply choose to begin taking these medications when they turn 18. I want to make it clear that it is not this simple, and withholding medication is just as direct of a stance as providing care. I am a transgender Missourian. Because I only started transgender medical care as an adult, a "male" puberty made permanent changes that will impact me day-to-day for the rest of my life. The wrong puberty has irreversibly changed my voice and the shape of my body, which can immediately out me as trans to people around me, placing me in dangerous situations if I am in certain anti-LGBT parts of this state. HB 33 will cause real harm to thousands of Missourians. I ask you that you voice your support for young people in Missouri by voting against HB 33. Listen to the experts in the field, and see that they support providing this treatment for minors. And do not withhold this truly life saving medical intervention from people who need it.

We strongly oppose HB 33 as dangerous, ill-advised, and antithetical to our professional and ethical obligations as health-care providers. HB 33 penalizes physicians for providing evidence-based, consensus-driven health care. There is no uniform transgender experience. Some transgender individuals may choose to undergo surgery or take hormones; others may not. As with all care, health care for transgender youth should be individualized, confidential, and evidence-based, free from ill-advised, discriminatory political mandates. A number of medical societies, including the World Professional Association for Transgender Health, the Endocrine Society, and the Pediatric Endocrine Society, have published guidelines on how best to care for transgender adolescents. As with all medical treatment, transgender patients undergo the informed consent process, demonstrating an understanding of the diagnosis, treatments, and risks and benefits of treatment. HB 33 penalizes clinicians for providing this evidence-based, high-quality, patient-centered care: Inappropriately regulating the practice of medicine, as this legislation does, will irreparably compromise our professional and ethical obligations to respect our patients as people with moral rights to bodily integrity, autonomy, and self-determination. HB 33 threatens adolescent health: This discriminatory legislation represents a fundamental lack of compassion for our state's transgender youth. Transgender adolescents are a vulnerable population, facing harassment, discrimination, societal and familial rejection, and ostracism from their communities. One of the most important aspects of caring for transgender adolescents is providing a safe, supportive, and sensitive clinical environment. HB 33 denies these patients evidence-based care and information that affirms their transgender identity, and will only serve to further marginalize and alienate transgender adolescents from the societal support and acceptance they need and deserve to live full and healthy lives. The consequences of limited or inadequate treatment can be staggering. Studies have revealed that nearly 25 percent to 30 percent of transgender adolescents report attempting suicide during their lifetimes. Furthermore, findings from the 2008 National Transgender Discrimination Study revealed that 45 percent of 18- to 24-year-old transgender individuals had attempted suicide in their lifetimes. Access to gender-affirming care is also associated with mental health: transgender individuals who have not received gender-affirming care

experience higher rates of depression and anxiety. Transgender individuals concerned about the way they may be treated by a health care professional are more likely to obtain hormones from friends or unlicensed sources, putting them at risk of inappropriate dosing and the subsequent sequelae. ACOG not only opposes this harmful ban, but supports coverage for all evidence-based treatments for transgender patients under public and private health insurance plans. Already, transgender patients are an at-risk population, and preventive medicine is imperative to their health. They face high rates of physical violence and substance use disorder, and are at an increased risk of STIs. The rate of those living with HIV among respondents to the Transgender Discrimination Survey was five times higher than the rate of the general U.S. population. Transgender individuals also face inadequate access to, underutilization of, the health care system across the spectrum of services, including proper screening for sexually transmitted infections, screening for suicidal thoughts and mental health issues, and appropriate vaccination. This legislation threatens to exacerbate these inequities. Transgender individuals already face substantial barriers to and underutilization of the health care system across the spectrum of services, including health care professionals' bias and lack of general knowledge about best practices, as well as the failure of many health insurance plans to cover the cost of hormone therapy and supplies, mental health services, or gender affirmation surgery and restrictions on care imposed by prohibitive health care systems. . HB 33 may further alienate patients and serve as an additional deterrent to seeking future medical care, including preventive care. HB 33 dangerously interferes in the patient-physician relationship: ACOG strongly opposes any governmental interference that causes a physician to compromise his or her medical judgment about what information or treatment is in the best interest of the patient. Politicians must never interfere with the ability of physicians to have open, honest, and confidential communications with their patients. Nor should political mandates block a patient's right to be counseled and treated by a physician according to the best currently available medical evidence and the physician's professional medical judgment. HB 33 runs counter to these fundamental bedrocks of the patient-physician relationship. Adolescents presenting to a gynecologist often discuss confidential issues, and our specialty can play a pivotal role in not just facilitating successful gender transitions for transgender adolescents, but also supporting patients' disclosure of gender identity to their families and communities and connecting them and their families to community resources. Even for those too young to consider hormone therapy, early behavioral health support can be vital. This cruel bill will only serve to drive a wedge between a patient and their physician, at a time when they need the confidentiality, support, and counsel of their health care provider the most. Lawmakers must support health policies based on sound science and evidence. Politicians must seek to improve access to care, not restrict it. ACOG believes that we share a common goal with this legislative body—improving the health and well-being of adolescent patients. We urge you to recognize that this legislation would have the opposite effect, threatening the health of young people, pushing at-risk transgender adolescents further into the shadows, and undermining their ability to live happy and healthy lives.

HB 33Dear Committee members,Today I offer written testimony to you as a resident of Missouri since 1984. Our family lives in St Louis (63105). I work at the Washington University School of Medicine where I am a Professor in the Department of Neuroscience. So by profession, I am a scientist, administrator and teacher. More importantly I am a parent with a daughter and son, here sharing my deep-felt conviction concerning HB 33, a bill today under discussion by the Children and Families Committee of the Missouri House that seeks to prohibit and criminalize accepted medical care for transgender youth. Everything we know about the complex issues surrounding the transgender community indicates clearly that transgender definitions involves biology, not psychology: transgender issues do not involve matters of choice. I urge you to oppose it because HB 33 works against the fundamental interests of Missouri Children and Families. I emphasize that passage of this bill would criminalize medical best practices for transgender youth. Such care is backed by the American Academy of Pediatrics and other leading medical authorities. Transgender children in Missouri, like all children, have the best chance to thrive when they are supported and can receive the health care they need to mature and persevere. Health care is a right due to all individuals, and a point of strength for a community that advocates support and consideration for its families. Providing proper medical care for transgender youth is a national movement in its ascendancy because it affirms and supports their right to live in proper alignment with their self-definition. As a state, Missouri should be – and can be - in that national vanguard.As a teenager, our transgender daughter was in a vulnerable position and our family had great concerns about the future. Fortunately, she received excellent and deliberate services from a superb medical team. They assessed the situation carefully, always proceeded with respect, and worked with our family to provide the support our daughter needed to carefully consider her way forward. I remind you it is well-established that denying best practice health care and support to transgender youth is life-threatening. It contributes to depression, social isolation, self-hatred, and risk of self-harm and suicidal behavior. Research shows that transgender youth whose families support their gender identity have a 52% decrease in suicidal thoughts, a 48% decrease in suicide attempts, and significant increases in self-esteem and physical and mental health. Our family's experience affirms these research conclusions that transgender youth need the medical support currently available – support built upon a broad consensus of medical best practices.Putting these proposed restrictions in statute would be incredibly harmful to the very children most in need of clear and simple affirmation. That affirmation includes the best possible medical support. Doctors would be forced to violate existing standards—standards that are endorsed by the American Academy of Pediatrics. This proposal could throw parents – people like me - in jail for trying to protect their family and to do what's best for their child. That is to say, this bill threatens parents with prosecution if they help their child receive best practice medical care, recommended by the child's doctor and supported by organizations like the American Medical Association. As a parent

who has faced exactly these considerations, and as an American who cherishes our nation's commitment to support family values, I direct you my representatives to work against this discriminatory and harmful legislation. Therefore, I speak out now most strongly against HB 33, and I urge you to vote against this measure. Thank you very much for your consideration. Paul H. My name is Paula Brookshier. I am a resident of Manchester, MO, and a parent of a son who is transgender. I am writing to voice my strong opposition to bill HB 33. My faith is very important to me and to my family. I have been deeply involved with my church and raised our child in the faith. One of the strongest tenets of my Christian faith is the sure belief that we are all children of God, each of us uniquely made. All of us worthy and loved unconditionally by our creator. My son Chris, who was identified as female at birth, knew deep down that he wasn't really a girl from a young age but did not know how to communicate his distress. He struggled with crippling anxiety and depression and as he entered adolescence, his emotional pain became so severe that he began cutting himself because the physical pain of the lacerations would momentarily alleviate his emotional pain. His father and I were worried sick and even though we worked closely with his pediatrician, school counselor, and therapist, nothing seemed to help. At age 16, he attempted suicide and was hospitalized. One night soon after his release from the hospital, he came to my room in the middle of the night and through a torrent of tears, told me that he was transgender. With the weight of that secret information alleviated, he felt a bit better. His father and I, on the other hand, felt woefully inadequate to deal with this information but we set out to educate ourselves so that we could get help for our hurting child. We immediately told this news to our pediatrician, who recommended a therapist who specialized in gender identity issues and he began to see her regularly. After many sessions, she recommended a pediatric endocrinologist. The endocrinologist talked to Chris at length on several occasions, going over the pros and cons, the side effects, and long term effects of hormone treatment, and after several visits, recommended hormone therapy. This doctor did not make this recommendation quickly or easily. Chris' father and I did not make our decision easily either. We agonized over what to do. We saw first hand the unbearable pain that our child was in and, after much prayer, research, and more consultations with Chris' pediatrician, therapist, and pediatric endocrinologist, made the decision to allow Chris to begin hormone treatment so that he could live his life authentically as a male. While a student at Parkway South High School, a very large school, Chris, a 16 year old, known to everyone as a female, changed his name, and began dressing and living as a male. His bravery makes my heart stop. Think about the taunts and the stress he endured simply by being who he knew he was born to be. But taunts and embarrassment are but a few of the indignities that transgender people face daily as they live authentically. Chris is now 23. He has friends, a job, and his own place. His father and I know that we made the right decisions about his healthcare. I am horrified to think what would have happened if the state of Missouri had taken this decision from us and cannot understand why state lawmakers believe that the government has the right to overrule medical decisions that parents make for their children. Would the state take away the ability of parents to provide life saving treatments for their children who have heart disease, cancer, or diabetes? Of course not. The very idea is preposterous. So, I have to wonder why these particular

decisions are any different. If this bill passes, children will suffer enormous harm. Parents such as myself and my husband would face criminal prosecution simply for providing our child life-saving treatment. Pediatricians, endocrinologists, and therapists would have their licenses revoked for following the recommendations of the American Medical Association and the American Academy of Pediatrics and doing their best to take care of their patients. Chris is a child of God, made in God's image. I have heard people of faith say that since God gave Chris physical characteristics of a female that it is disrespectful to God or unfaithful to make changes to God's creation. And yet, the same people celebrate the miracles of heart surgeries and cancer treatments that save children's lives. Hormone treatment saved our son's life and I give thanks to God for that. I thank you for the opportunity to share my family's story and implore you to vote NO on this harmful, dangerous bill.

To the Children and Families Committee, My name is Ramya Ramadas and I am a 4th year medical student and future pediatrician at the University of Missouri, Columbia. I am writing this testimony in strong opposition of HB 33. This bill does not consider the independent healthcare decision making capacity of children who are transgender and their families, does not align with best evidence-based practices recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics, would put the mental and physical health of transgender youth at risk, and would criminalize healthcare professionals and parents for doing their jobs. During medical school, I have been privileged to work with people and children who identify as transgender in a healthcare setting. Working with physicians and youth who seek gender-affirming care, I have seen the extremely nuanced best practices used to make sure these youth have equitable healthcare like their cisgender friends. Traditionally, the medical institution has been extremely discriminatory against these individuals, putting up barriers to access and receive evidence-based, quality healthcare. This bill and others currently in the Senate would reinforce those discriminatory practices and deny basic human rights to children who identify as transgender. In addition, we know that these barriers are compounded for transgender individuals who are Black and Brown. For example, we know that Black transgender women and femmes experience higher rates of violence, unemployment, and housing insecurity, this bill would perpetuate systemic/individual racism in the medical institution against children and their families that are trying to seek evidence-based care. Finally, this bill takes away parent and children autonomy to make decisions about their own health with their healthcare professionals. This legislation would put the lives of transgender youth at risk, as denying healthcare and support has been shown to increase rates of depression, social isolation, self-hatred, and self-harm. Thank you for your time and consideration. Again, I strongly oppose HB 33 as it is not evidence-based; it is discriminatory; and it does not allow basic human rights and freedom to children, families, and their healthcare professionals making decisions about their own health.

My name is Rebecca Easton. I live in Columbia, Missouri and I am submitting this written testimony in opposition to HB 33. I am a mother to two wonderful teenage daughters - one of whom is transgender. I have been the parent that has seen the pain in their child's eyes as they struggle with gender dysphoria. I have also been the parent that has seen a light in their child's eye when they feel heard, recognized and when they finally feel more like themselves after receiving inclusive healthcare that included hormone blockers and later hormone replacement therapy. Gender-affirming therapies have been so important for my daughter. She is happier and less withdrawn. I am very grateful that she has had access to such inclusive medical care. I often wonder if she would still be with us without them because she was so very unhappy prior to receiving treatment. One of the hardest things you can ever hear as a parent is that your child is struggling so much that they have considered taking their own life. No parent should ever have to hear that fear and pain. No child should have to live with that fear and pain when there are treatments available that can help them. Being the parent of a transgender child is often a challenge. There is so much worry - worry about their future, worry about discrimination, worry that others will not accept them for who they are. I am asking you to not make the lives of transgender children and their parents harder by causing them additional worries that they will no longer be able to access necessary and medically recommended gender-affirming healthcare. Parents and healthcare providers are doing our best to support our transgender kids. The medical decisions being made are not being made without a great deal of research and careful consideration. There are standards of care provided by the American Medical Association and the American Academy of Pediatrics that are used to help guide parents and providers through decisions that are never easy. These are private healthcare decisions that are best left made by those involved and not politicians. Criminalizing parents and healthcare providers for providing often life-saving care goes against the values we should all uphold as Missourians. Denying best practice health care and support to transgender youth can be life-threatening. It has been shown to contribute to depression, social isolation, and risk of self-harm and suicidal behavior. There are serious risks to our children should HB 33 be passed. One of the most effective ways to decrease both lethal and non-lethal suicide attempts in trans children is to accept them for who they are, use proper pronouns, and affirm their gender, which includes gender affirming medical treatment. When trans youth are accepted and have access to what they need, they flourish, making their communities healthier and happier places to live for everyone. When medical treatment is withheld, trans youth struggle to imagine themselves in their own future. My own daughter has told me that she would be distraught if she were to start growing facial hair or hear her voice deepen. If she will go through male puberty, I fear the mental health repercussions would be so great, that we would leave the state before subjecting her to face them. Together, these two forces have resulted in poor decisions being made that brought harm to individuals and societies throughout history. This bill would create a similarly harmful, damaging policy for transgender youth. Decisions related to gender reassignment belong with kids and their caretakers, not the State. This bill would be infringing on their rights to make those decisions, and to seek out medical services as a result of their decisions. As a genetic counselor I have cared for many children who are born with ambiguous genitalia or who is genitalia do not match their "genetic sex." These conditions are emotionally fraught for parents and many times a clear path to treatment is not known in the first days, weeks or even months of life. My name is Rori Picker Neiss and I work as a Rabbi, serve as Executive Director of the Jewish Community Relations Council, and speak as a representative of our Jewish community that voted just last November to affirm its full commitment to promote and implement complete equality, inclusion and acceptance of people regardless of gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation. Much more than that, though, I speak as a mother of a 9-year-old boy who was identified female at birth. I have to believe with my whole heart that members of this Committee care deeply about families. The work that you do is not easy, it is often thankless, and you do it out of a profound sense of service to the people of your communities and this state. Perhaps even a sense of love and devotion. The knowledge that through this work, you can make people's lives better. And so I hope you hear me when I say, without exaggeration, that if the Missouri legislature passes this bill, my son could die. From the moment my son first told his first grade teacher that he was a boy, my son has been embraced, supported, and loved; until we arrived in Jefferson City. It is from this very body that he has had to learn that there are people in this world who do not like him simply because of the person he knows himself to be, people who are scared of him, people who want to discriminate against him, people who want to stop him from being able to live his life fully as the third grade boy that he is. And that alone should be enough to break all of our hearts. Though we have worked hard to support our son, this journey has not been an easy one for my husband and I. As you might imagine, there has been a lot of anxiety, a lot of fear, and a lot of sleepless nights. We wonder how our young child can truly know something as massive as choosing his own gender. We are terrified about making the wrong choice. It is for that very reason that we work so closely with a team of people who are supporting us. We have a pediatrician who knows about our journey and who is discussing with us all of our options. We have a therapist who meets with our son every other week, and who gives me comfort in knowing that there is an objective third-party who can evaluate his understanding and his emotional well-being. My husband and I each have our own individual therapists who provide us with support. We are heavily involved in our faith community and look to numerous rabbis for their guidance. My son is too young for any of the interventions that these bills discuss. But when he does reach that age, I know with confidence that any decisions that we make will be made with consultation of a team of qualified, caring, and compassionate individuals who are on this journey alongside us. These bills take that choice away from my family. They place the government into the role of making the decisions of vital healthcare for a boy it has never met. I understand the concerns that arise from the thought of minors under 18 making these life-altering decisions for themselves before they are legally allowed to vote and even drive. I share those same concerns. Which is why this medical care is more important than ever. Hormone blockers allow us to postpone puberty so that my son does not have to make the choice to start on testosterone to avoid menstruation at the age of 10 or 11, but can wait until 15 or 16 before he has to make that choice-- which gives me far more peace of mind. Hormone blockers are proven to be

safe and reversible. If he should decide that he does not want to go through male puberty, he can stop taking the hormone blockers and his body will create a natural female puberty. Hormone replacement therapy is also reversible. Even once he begins the testosterone treatments, he can choose to stop the treatments and reverse the effects. These treatments prevent him from having to go through a menstrual cycle which can lead to gender dysphoria that can cause self-harm including cutting and even attempts at suicide. These treatments also prevent him from growing breasts, which is an awkward enough experience for a young girl and I can only imagine a debilitatingly traumatic one for a young boy. And not growing breasts prevents him from needing to choose to undergo therapy after the age of 18-- a far more invasive and dangerous procedure than the hormone therapies. I believe that these life-altering procedures should be regulated-- and they are. No family is accessing hormone blockers, hormone replacement treatment, or surgery without intense consultations with highly qualified medical professionals. This bill not only does not protect our children, but they further endanger their lives. I urge you to vote no on HB 33.

My name is Sam Martin, and I'm a transgender woman living in Columbia, Missouri. I'm writing this testimony in opposition of HB 33. In the weeks preceding the rise of COVID in the United States last year, I attended the readings of HB 1721 and 2051, representing Mizzou Oasis as its then-vice-president. These bills attempted to bring about the same effect as HB 33: criminalize the parents and providers of transgender children looking to begin their transition before age 18. According to the house.mo.gov site that has archived these bills, HB 1721 has identical wording to 33, and was sponsored by the same person, Suzie Pollock, who sponsored 2051. With this repetition of purpose and involved parties in mind, I will direct my testimony in a summary rebuttal of the points provided in HB 33, as I and many transgender people and allies did a year ago. In order of appearance in the wording of the bill: it would seem Suzie Pollock has forgotten the points that were raised regarding the type of medical care for transgender children supported by representatives of the American Academy of Pediatrics, so I will reiterate them. Puberty blockers are harmless to children under 18, the veracity of which is supported by both The Endocrine Society and the World Professional Association for Transgender Health and U.S. Food and Drug Administration. Puberty blockers, as is suggested in the name, simply put a pause on a child's natural progression of puberty, and can be maintained up until 18, when they are eligible for hormone replacement therapy (HRT). This process is fully reversible, should the child decide to halt the administration of their blockers. There is no extant evidence that would suggest that the administration of puberty blockers has any long term, negative side effects, and I would conclude that there is no need to restrict puberty blocker access to transgender children, outside of the apparent desire to restrict the agency of transgender children and impede their quality of life. In regards to the "... surgical treatment" listed in HB 33, there simply are no recorded gender-affirming surgeries (GAS) being carried out for transgender children. The St. Louis Children's Hospital, for instance, not only restricts applicants for these surgeries to people over 18, but also lists on their web page discussing gender-affirming surgeries that most insurance companies within the state that do cover GAS will not allow coverage for minors. I will conclude, in the deficiency of data to the contrary, that there is no risk of transgender children or their families pursuing GAS. During the hearings for HBs 1721 and 2051, during the extensive oppositional testimonies from transgender Missourians and their allies from all corners of our state, I still remember the pain and vulnerability that was on display in that meeting room. Scores of residents -- some parents of transgender children, some with transgender individuals in their close circles, some transgender themselves -- told the committee about the impact that early availability of gender-affirming medical options would have, or would have had, in their lives. Some told the committee about how their children are thriving as a direct result of the access they have to puberty blockers as they grew into adults, while others opened up about how, if this sort of access was available to them when they were children, that they would have grown up without having tried to kill themselves. I remember these

testimonies well; dear members of the committee, do you remember? Were you there that night, after making us wait for seven hours beyond our scheduled time to testify, steeping in the collective trauma of a demographic of people having to sit and watch as their livelihoods be debated away by individuals in our state? I was. I will conclude with my direct feelings on the matter, without rationalizing my position with references. The fact alone that HB 33, a bill identical to one submitted for hearing exactly a year ago, is already insulting. It's insulting that anyone, let alone me as a transgender woman, should have to allow malicious, paranoid, and misinformed people space to tell anyone about how what little legal security they have is a danger to society. That decorum for those who wish to tear down the meager safety minorities have in legislature should be maintained in the presence of bald-faced oppression physically sickens me. The fact, however, that Suzie Pollock has returned from last year to draft an identical bill to HB 1721, which was heard directly alongside her own, is simply a disappointment. She learned nothing after a year of contemplation over the events of March 3rd, 2020, and has resurfaced this same trauma for all transgender people in our state in the pursuit of furthering her agenda. It's times like these where I reflect on the wisdom of a trans elder in my life: justice doesn't feel good. Justice isn't one particular outcome, or one particular action taken against an oppressive system. Justice is a constant, conscious series of actions, undertaken with the knowledge that progress today is liable to be revoked tomorrow and that more work is always on the horizon. Seeking justice isn't fun; it's just the right thing to do. It's a lifelong pursuit that wears us down and disillusion us. Members of the committee, I am exhausted. So yes, dear members of the committee, as a representative of myself and my loved ones, I do call for HB 33 to be opposed, and I will return to do for any bills similar or adjacent to it. I submit my opposition for HB 33 so that the next time I am called to oppose anti-trans legislation in the future, that it won't be the same threats resurfacing year after year in the name of partisan antagonism. I write to oppose HB 33, the bill that would deny life-saving best practice medical treatment to certain vulnerable children. There is a widespread belief that gender identity is a choice. If it's a choice, then a choice disfavored by the state may be discouraged or punished. Furthermore, the sex recorded on my birth certificate is "biological," because it's based on obvious anatomical markers. Gender identity as I report it isn't "biological" at all: it's subjective, it's psychological, it's all in my head. If my birth certificate and my gender identity disagree, then my birth certificate is right, and I'm wrong. Those beliefs are false. Gender identity is just as biological as genital anatomy. In fact it is reflected in anatomy, but the relevant anatomy isn't as visible as the genitalia. It is indeed all in the head, literally, because it is in the brain. There are anatomical differences between the brains of people who are transgender and those who are not. I discuss these findings at greater length in an attachment that I am emailing to you, delving into some of the biological roots of sexuality, including neuroanatomy. I am sending it as a separate document because it includes hyperlinks that your online submission form appears not to accommodate. Please retain this document in the record as a supplement to my written testimony, if your system and procedures can do so. I am also sending another, more personal document about the experience of someone close to me. I don't want to place this information in the public record because it's not about me, and I don't have permission to disclose it publicly. I am qualified to evaluate this science. I hold an earned doctorate in Neuroscience from Washington University, and I have published multiple papers in the peer-reviewed literature, mostly in the realm of neuroanatomy. I have tried to make this material as accessible as possible to an audience of intelligent non-scientists, but it still won't be an easy read. While being transgender apparently has a biological basis, we can't see that basis in a living subject. We can't see the anatomical differences with a CAT scan or an MRI scan because the relevant nuclei are too small and the differences too subtle. The studies are based on autopsy material. As a result, there is no lab test, no blood test, no urine test that can definitely tell anyone: yeah, you're transgender. That determination must be based on behavior and subjective reporting. It's fuzzy. In children especially, sexuality can be fluid. It is precisely because of that fuzziness that puberty blockers in particular are so useful. They allow children, their families, and their physicians to defer the irreversible changes of puberty until everyone involved has had more time to make an informed and carefully considered decision. A recent study found that, among children who wanted puberty blockers, the children who received them experienced fewer suicidal thoughts and made fewer suicide attempts than the children who didn't. Because it was a retrospective study, the ones who successfully committed suicide could not be included. The treatment of putatively transgender children is not a simple matter. Such medical decisions should be made by the patients, their families, and their physicians according to individual circumstances and accepted best practice. HB 33 would impose a single, rigid, one-size-fits-all decision regardless of patient preference, medical judgment, individual circumstance, or standards of best practice. That decision would have

been made by a remote body of legislators, few of them with any medical or scientific training, probably none of them transgender themselves or otherwise knowledgeable about transgender issues, on behalf of patients they will never meet or know anything about, many of them yet unborn. Such a result would be ludicrous if the consequences weren't certain to be tragic.

Committee Members, I am a School Psychologist who served students enrolled in K-12th in St. Louis and Jefferson Counties for seven years. I am also a member of the National Association of School Psychologist (NASP). I am submitting my statement in opposition to HB 33 and am especially upset by the lies being told by the authors of this amendment. I strongly encourage you to listen to the education professionals and the mental and medical health care providers who know these kids. The testimony thus far has included the accusations that doctors are simply trying to scare parents with the threat of their child committing suicide if they do not have access to gender-affirming care. The doctors are just stating the facts. The Missouri Institute of Health reports that LGBTQ+ students in Missouri are 5 times more likely to have a suicide attempt. This rate is higher for children who are transgender. While the physicians know the data on the rates of self-harm and suicide among transgender students, it is school counselors and teachers and school psychologist who are on the front lines and live this truth. There is a reason education organizations like the NEA and NASP have policies in support of gender affirming practices. Gender affirming practices, which include supports for social and medical transitions, do save lives, but they also impact academic achievement, truancy, and graduation rates. Anything else does harm. This legislation is not only based on lies about gender-affirming care and harmful to the children who are seeking medical care, but it is especially harmful to the many children who have not told anyone yet that they are transgender. My name is Stephanie Ross and I live in Lebanon, the home of the sponsor of this bill, Rep. Pollock. I wish to thank all of the committee members here for allowing me the opportunity to speak with you. This topic is one that is near and dear to my heart. And so I humbly come before you seeking to reason together with you, not as someone who has a vast amount of knowledge, as I am sure that some of those who have or will speak to you today have. Rather, all I can do is to relate my hard earned wisdom as one who walked in both your shoes, as well as in the shoes of these youth to which you will be the arbiter of their lives. Please allow me to explain why I am opposed to HB 33. Let me be straightforward and blunt for just a moment: being Transgender is not something that is "popular", "chic", or "glamorous". This is not some sort of fad that is here today and will be gone tomorrow. For many Transgender people, both adults and youth, this is downright terrifying; a living nightmare that we can never wake up from. It is worrying if you will come back unharmed, or even alive, once you leave the safety of your home. And for many Transgender people, even our homes are not safe places. As the Psalmist wrote, "They that hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of my head; they that would cut me off, being mine enemies wrongfully, are many". Living in Lebanon, I have had people physically threaten me over the internet, spit at me, hurl all sorts of insults and curses at me, and throw things at me in public. I routinely am stared at, and even misgendered, whether purposely or not. Some people will avoid me like the plague, even covering the eyes of their children or pulling them close to themselves. Being Transgender is like walking around with the Scarlet letter, the plague, or even leprosy. Although we are human beings, we are treated by some as not even human, to be mocked, and to be driven away one way or the other. Now for a little background on myself. My father and several uncles were preachers. My grandfather, several uncles, and many cousins were elders, and several of my cousins were missionaries, pastors, evangelists, and Bible teachers. One of my cousins is a Church Historian at the Headquarters of the Assembly of God in Springfield right now, while other cousins helped found Baptist Bible College in Springfield, where many still attend today. I myself was a Preacher, Pastor, and a Messianic Jewish Rabbi. I have cousins who are also Jewish Rabbi's. To the best of my knowledge, with the exception of my paternal grandfather and a few cousins, everyone else in my family are staunch Republicans. I knew from as far back as I can remember that I was a girl. However, my father expected me to follow in the family business and become a minister. I did not even know what Gender Reassignment Surgery was until I was 14 years old and learned about it on a daytime talk show. By that age, I had been saved and baptized, on December 26, 1982, began preaching, song/worship leader, and youth minister. I was old enough to be passed the age of accountability and to accept the Lord Jesus Christ as my personal Lord and Savior. So when I asked to have the gender reassignment surgery at the age of 14, I was told that I was too young, my brain had not developed enough yet, and that since I was born into a male's body, then God

wanted me to be that way because God does not make mistakes. I believed in Jesus just as much as I believed that I was a girl. To make things simple and easy to understand, the definition of believe, the word I just used twice, is not the one found in Webster's or the Oxford Dictionary, but is this: "Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." Now that comes from Hebrews 11:1 out of my beloved King James Version. Now instead of the word substance, I could have used assurance, confidence, or reality because the Biblical Greek word *Hupostasis*, means under legal-standing. My father mixed politics and religion all the way back to 1980 and Ronald Reagan's presidential run. So if my father preached it, then I was preaching it. My identity, however, was a source of great consternation for me, as, like I said previously, I believed in both Jesus and my being a girl, but to preach, only male's could do that, and not only was my father preaching that homosexuality and transgenderism were abominations and those who practiced wickedness were abominations, but my whole family preached and taught that, my religious teachers and mentors taught that, and I taught that. Now, granted, most Transgender youth are not preachers kids nor do they become preachers themselves, but even I tried to commit suicide multiple times. I never could completely follow through with it because of my fear of hellfire. But I knew from a young age that I was not loved for who I was, but rather for being a legacy child and a Preacher. I understood that I really was hated by not only my parents but also by family members. I cannot stress hard enough that children, even 5 year olds and younger, know what love is and know when they are not loved. Now I want to stop here and discuss something with you. Gender dysphoria is defined as "clinically significant distress or impairment related to a strong desire to be of another gender, which may include desire to change primary and/or secondary sex characteristics. Not all transgender or gender diverse people experience dysphoria." Here in the State of Missouri, according to the National Institutes of Health, "close to 223,000 adults live with serious mental illnesses and about 65,000 children live with serious mental health conditions. Missouri ranks forty-fourth on a mental health quality-of-life indicator." Further, we also have a skyrocketing problem with homelessness, and for far too many Transgender Youth, they end up on the streets, homeless, and unwanted. Since those that are homeless, be their adults or youth, are more likely to have substance abuse problems as well as mental health issues, this bill seems counterintuitive. We are failing already to meet the needs of the population that we know have a mental illness. Gender dysphoria is a mental illness, but, just as many other mental illnesses, it is treatable, both with behavioural therapy as well as with medical treatment. By stigmatizing Transgender youth, and taking away access to medical care and even to outlets such as athletics, what you are doing is trying to pretend like transgender youths do not exist and thus either attempting to sweep them under the rug or push them back in the closet, and this does nothing but increases the risk of suicide. As my own therapist, Charlotte Moore, who could not be here today to speak with you, said, "Adolescent years is the time we try to find our identity. Having our authentic identity accepted is a step in healthy mental and emotional development. Not being accepted for the person we are can lead to homelessness, substance abuse and suicide." In my case, I felt damned if I did and damned if I did not. If I committed suicide, I would go to hell; however, if I continued to live a lie of being a male, then I would go to hell. Also, according to my own religious teachings, if I changed my gender and lived as the person I believed I was, then I would go to hell. It is, to use a term from Star Trek, a Kobayashi Maru situation, or a lose-lose situation. No matter what I did, I was going to lose. So I began to hate myself and everyone else around me, which led to both self destructive lifestyles and violent bursts of rage towards others. Before I even knew that there was a surgery and other forms of medical treatments to help me, I had already been put in a psychiatric ward 3 times. Because of my strong religious beliefs, I did not turn to alcohol or illicit drugs in order to cope. I have been homeless before, even on the streets of Springfield. Sadly, I took it out on myself and others, leaving a trail of destruction behind in my path. But some Transgender youth will turn to alcohol or illicit drugs to soothe the pain. We have not fixed our opioid crisis, and yet what we are talking about will push Transgender youth into illicit drugs. We also, in this state, have a problem with Meth addiction. With opioids and Meth so readily available within our state's borders right now, why do we think that taking away legal and legitimate medical treatment will not cause our other problems to skyrocket? If you want to say that Jesus can save you, well, here I stand before you, offering myself up as a cautionary tale. I will admit that a Jewish man did in fact save me from much of the pain that I was going through. That Jewish man, a very observant Jew, was Dr. Loren Shechter, who performed my Gender Reassignment Surgery. Not only did I have to suffer for over 40 years, but those around me had to suffer for over 40 years. Knowing Jesus and having a personal relationship with Him did not make my life any easier and never delivered me from my Gender Dysphoria. I ended up splitting into two different people because I had who I really was, and who I had to pretend to be to everyone around me. So I did not love myself but rather I hated myself, because the pretend personality hated the real me and the real me hated the pretend personality. After so long, you just lose track of who is who. But Jesus said in Mark 12:31 to "Love your neighbor as yourself." My problem was that I didn't love myself. How can I love anyone else if I do not love myself? How can I love my Country if I do not love myself? Jesus told the parable

of the Good Samaritan and in that parable He explained who our neighbor is. The neighbor, in that case, was somebody that was hated and disliked and considered less of a human. That person was someone who was denigrated, put down, and not allowed to do things because they were not the accepted class. They were a group of people who did not keep the full Law, and who lived their life in a way to where others feared that others would follow them and society would crumble. And because of this, in the parable, Jesus showed that Godly love is to love everybody whether or not they believe as you do, act as you do, or even dress or love like you do. So Jesus said this is a requirement to get into heaven and he also said that each and every one of his followers was to love their neighbor as themselves. Thus, if you would take your child and have your child's medical needs, whether it be mental or physical, taken care of, you are to do the same for other children whether or not they believe the same as you or whether or not their lifestyle is the same as you. If you wish to deny the latter medical care that both physicians and psychiatrists have deemed medically necessary, then do you also deny your own children medical treatment deemed necessary by doctors? Let us not be blinded to the realities of the world around us. There are people who do not love this country, because they have been forced by leaders in the churches, local communities, state, and even Federal governments to be who they are not just to keep others happy. This causes hatred of themselves, all those around them, politicians, and even every form of the government itself. You cannot legislate people to love themselves or others, just as you cannot legislate how one feels about themselves. What you can do by way of legislating is to either cause hatred and discord by oppressing people whom you do not like, or you can free people to be themselves. The conservative movement is partially predicated on self-determination and government being kept out of the lives of individuals and families. President Reagan said in his inaugural address, "In this present crisis, government is not the solution to our problem, government IS the problem." These proposed laws, banning transgender children from medically necessary treatments to playing sports, is government sticking its head into the lives of parents and children, telling them how to live their lives and how to behave. This is anathema to core conservative principles. Limited governmental intrusion into our daily lives is not getting between a Physician and their patient, regardless of the age of the patient. As my father would have said, "That sounds just like Obamacare." He sadly passed away just days before the inauguration of President Trump, whom he looked forward to being President. Conservatism is all about deregulation; not more regulations. It is about each person or family choosing what is best for their own selves and not having the government dictate it to them. So if this is not about fiscal responsibility and governmental deregulation, then what we are talking about here is just what Conservatives accuse the left of doing. But when the left does it, Conservatives decry them doing it in the name of their religion of secular humanism. But why are we talking about doing this then? For the religion of Christianity? There is also a loud chorus on by Conservatives about the current state of Cancel Culture. But what these bills are trying to do is cancel out a group of people who you don't agree with nor care for. Jesus said to: "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." If you do not want to have others try to cancel you, because you truly believe that Cancel Culture is wrong, then don't do it to people who you wish to get rid of. Are transgender youth committing crimes just by feeling like they are in the wrong physical body? Let us pray that we never say yes to that question. As a transgender youth and adult, I never wanted to force anyone to be like I was. I actually wanted, and still desire to this day, no one to feel like I did, or to go through the things that I went through. I am not trying to force any of you to be someone whom you are not. My father had a specific term he used in regards to liberals. They were "knee-jerkers". What he meant when he called them this was that whenever something happened, they always had a "knee-jerk" reaction and proposed new legislation to counter what had just happened. Just to give you an example, because he was a marksman in the US Army, he always decried when school shootings would occur because he knew that the liberal "knee-jerk" reaction would be to push through some form of gun control legislation. That is why I am here before you today, begging you to not have a "knee-jerk" reaction and add more regulations by forcing people and their physicians to have to abide by what the government deems best instead of what the people and their physicians deem best for them. Please do not cause more mental anguish for children as that can push them to alcohol or illicit drug abuse, or worse, suicide. Please do not put more stress on our already broken mental health system. And please, in Jesus' name, treat all children, regardless of if they are heterosexual, homosexual, transgender, or anything else, the way that you would want to be treated or even how you would want your children, grandchildren, or great grand children treated. We have wonderful doctors and counsellors, knowledgeable in this field, who are not rushing to just push people into a different body. This is a process that takes years, and is done with much forethought and patient deliberations. For myself, this is something that, from the time I was first diagnosed with Gender Dysphoria to the time I had my surgery, took over two decades. And that was for the first surgery, so there is one more surgery for me to go through. Please do not handcuff these doctors and counsellors, and get in between them and their patients. The process is not an easy one to begin with, and what you are proposing would only make things more difficult. Transgender people are not asking

for any special status, or to be treated better than anyone else. Rather, what we are asking is to not be persecuted and to be treated equal to everyone else around us. There are too many of us that lose our lives each year due to people that use your words and actions to justify their hatred of us. And then, when the police and District Attorney's refuse to call these murders hate crimes, because then they have to admit that we are hated, it gives those that hate us more justification for hating and even attacking us. I will finish with this statement: forcing me to wait until I was an adult in order to give me time to think about it and change my mind because you didn't want me to make a decision that would be life altering did not change my mind. For every one that you do get to change their minds, I would be willing to guess that there are dozens if not hundreds or thousands who never do. And of those dozens to thousands, some will never make it all the way. I was blessed to have the bottom surgery done, however, because of laws and regulations, I cannot get my face done or my voice changed. So my torment is not over. Even when I do get a court ruling here in the state of Missouri, the state where I was born, Texas, will not even recognize it. I thus offer myself up as a tale of what forcing children to wait does to you, and even with that, I must say that I am in a better place than many, with "better place" being relative. Thank you for taking the time to listen to me, and I hope that I have been able to communicate my thoughts to you in a way that you can easily understand. Please vote down HB 33.

Madam Chair and Representatives of the Children and Families Committee, We are a group of healthcare professionals writing to express our opposition to House Bill 33 criminalizing life-saving medical treatment for transgender youth. In our daily work with transgender youth in the Kansas City area, we see the benefits for gender affirming therapy for youth with gender dysphoria, and the emotional distress and potential harm that can come from delaying or denying this care. Based on our experience and review of the scientific evidence we concur with the position statements from the American Academy of Pediatrics "Supporting & Caring for Transgender Children" and American Psychological Association "Resolution on Transgender, Gender Identity, and Gender Expression Non-Discrimination" in support of offering evidence-based medical and behavioral healthcare to transgender children, adolescents, and young adults. Guidelines for Treatment of Children and Adolescents with Gender Dysphoria We support treatment of transgender children, in consultation and collaboration with their parents, as described in the Endocrine Society Clinical Practice Guideline for Transgender Care. We believe this guideline reflects the standard of care for children and adolescents with gender dysphoria. Behavioral Health Treatment for Children and Adolescents with Gender Dysphoria: The Endocrine Society Guideline recommends support from mental health professionals and caring adults, including social transition if desired by the child, for all children with gender dysphoria. This is the foundation of treatment for children with gender concerns, allowing the child to explore gender concerns with the support of their parents and mental health before any medical interventions. Pubertal Suppression for Adolescents with Gender Dysphoria: The Endocrine Society Guideline recommends against any hormonal therapy in pre-pubertal children. If a child expresses emotional distress with the physical changes after puberty begins, that child should be referred to an experienced mental health provider for evaluation and treatment. If the child has a diagnosis of gender dysphoria, the guideline recommends obtaining permission from the parents and patient to temporarily halt further pubertal development while the child works with his or her parents and mental health provider to address their distress. Research has demonstrated that halting puberty in this setting is reversible and has mental and physical health benefits for children. Hormonal Therapy for Adolescents with Gender Dysphoria: According to the Endocrine Society Guideline, all hormonal therapies with non-reversible effects, such as treatment with estrogen or testosterone, should be delayed until the patient's mental health provider determines that hormonal therapy is in the patient's best interest, the parents provide permission, and the parents and providers agree the child has sufficient cognitive maturity to provide meaningful informed assent, including understanding the long-term consequences of hormonal treatment. Genital Surgery: The Endocrine Society Guideline recommends restricting surgeries with a permanent effect on fertility (genital surgery) to legal adults, who have completed a

satisfactory social role change, and have obtained a recommendation for surgical treatment from their physician and two experienced behavioral health providers. No surgeon at Children's Mercy Kansas City is providing gender confirmation surgeries to transgender patients. Conclusion: We feel that the Endocrine Society Guideline for Transgender Care provides a balanced, evidence-based approach to treatment of children with gender dysphoria that avoids potential harms of side effects and unneeded treatment while offering the positive benefits of treatment to transgender individuals. There are legal mechanisms currently in place to address medical or surgical care that does not meet the national standard of care. A new law criminalizing all medical treatment for transgender children and adolescents is unnecessary, would be stigmatizing the transgender community, unnecessarily prevent parents from acting in the best interests of their child, and would increase the already high rates of depression and suicide among patients with gender dysphoria. We urge you to look to the empirical scientific evidence, and vote "NO" on House Bill 33. As a professional community, we practice evidence-based medicine and psychology for the health of our children and adolescents. The evidence tells us that restricting medical and mental health care for our transgender youth will harm them, and we call on you to help us stop that. We have spiritual advisors who support transgender individuals. Honorable members of the committee, My name is William Moritz, and I am a fourth-year medical student living in Springfield, Missouri. I will obtain my Doctorate of Medicine in May of 2021. I am writing to you in opposition of HB33. Like many members of the committee, I grew up in a Christian and conservative household. I went to Sunday school and attended a Catholic, all-boys high school in St. Louis. I played baseball, rode my bike with neighborhood boys and spent my summers camping with my local scout troop. I even achieved the rank of Eagle Scout. In short, I had what could be called a traditional childhood for an American boy. This is the world that many members of this committee might be familiar with. But this is not everyone's experience. While some children might want this childhood, they cannot simply because they were born into the wrong gender. In its simplest form, being transgender is a frustration with one's body. While questioning one's gender might seem foreign to many who have not experienced it, you might find that similar frustrations are shared among some of our most vulnerable populations. When soldiers come home from Iraq or Afghanistan with missing arms or legs, life becomes difficult for many of the same reasons. Not only is it harder for them to go about their normal daily routines - such as putting on clothes or taking the bus - but the way people see them also changes. In a society where the disabled still are not always treated with dignity, this soldier could face humiliation or degradation at the hands of cruel and inhumane strangers. Because of this, many disabled veterans suffer from depression, anxiety and substance abuse. Through no fault of their own, these soldiers are stripped of their identity. And through medicine, we have the opportunity to give them their identities back. Rather than being forced to bear through lives pushed on them by twists of fate, surgery and prosthetics will allow them to reclaim their dignity and sense of self. This is humane medicine. The goal of gender-affirming care is to give transgender patients the freedom to choose how they look on the outside. Through no fault of their own, these children were born into the wrong bodies. They encounter the same cruel and inhumane world as the disabled veterans, bullied and victimized by their peers for looking or sounding different. Sadly, many develop severe depression and anxiety from a very young age. Unable to live in the bodies they so desperately want, many of these children turn to suicide. The happy, All-American childhood I had - baseball, boy scouts and learning to shave - are out of reach to them not because these transgender youths do not want it, but because they happened to be born with the wrong body parts. Advances in gender affirming care allow us to help these kids achieve the adulthood they very much deserve - one where they can enjoy the dignity of living in a body that they can truly call their own. Far from dangerous, hormone therapy allows a child who is questioning their gender to delay puberty until they are old enough to make informed choices on whether to receive further gender-affirming care, like hormones or surgery. Not only is this delaying therapy safe (endorsed by the American Academy of Pediatrics and American Medical Association), but it is also reversible. If a child decides that they do, in fact, fit into the gender they were assigned at birth, they can discontinue the medications and they will return

to puberty without any lasting damage. However, if prevented from receiving this critical therapy during childhood, a transgender youth will begin to go through near permanent changes during puberty, taking them further from their desired body goals and causing great psychological and emotional harm. Barring physicians from providing this safe and proven therapy will harm children, not help them. Just as we would not prevent a wounded veteran from seeking reconstructive surgery, we should not limit access to care in this instance. This is also a question of humane medicine. The world can be unfair, and we do not always get to enjoy the lives that we believe we are meant to have. However, medicine now allows us to give everyone – from transgender children to wounded soldiers – a chance at better, more fulfilling lives. Preventing access to this care does not make these patients disappear, it only imprisons them in bodies not their own. I ask that you please refrain from restricting access to this important medical treatment for future Missouri children and vote against HB33. The happiness and fulfillment of these children depend on it. Thank you very much for your time and consideration.

Hello! My name is Zora Serfozo. I have lived in Columbia, Missouri for 30 years. I am testifying in opposition to HB 33. I am asking the committee to please consider the long lasting harm being done to trans youth in denying them the medical care they need. As a trans person, I can personally testify to the ways in which transition-related medical care helped save my life. Before going on testosterone, I would spend most mornings crying, trying on most of my clothes to find something I could feel comfortable in. I walked with my shoulders hunched, head down, arms across my chest, feeling like I wanted to end my life because I felt so uncomfortable in my body. Going on testosterone changed all of that for me. I was finally able to feel freer in my body, freer to move around because of the physical changes that helped me feel whole. I work with queer and trans youth at the Center Project here in Columbia. Many of the trans youth express a desire to go on hormones or puberty blockers and to have surgery. Not all trans youth need access to this care, but those who do have spent a lot of time researching and know that it is right for them. I've seen first hand how access to hormones has helped trans youth become more confident and improved their emotional well-being, which in turn positively impacts their participation in school. I've seen trans youth struggle with eating disorders, suicidal ideation, self-harm, depression, and severe anxiety that impacts their ability to even go to school because they are not receiving the medical care they need to be able to feel whole in their bodies and minds. In fact, doctors know this, which is why medical best practice health care for trans youth is backed by the American Academy of Pediatrics and other leading medical authorities. These decisions should be between youth, their parents and doctors. The government should have no say in the matter. The medications attempting to be banned and criminalized by the government are regularly given to cisgender youth with no similar government intervention or ban. Please listen to trans youth, their families, and the doctors who care for them. They know what's best. I urge you all on the committee to please oppose this bill as it would have long lasting harmful and even potentially deadly effects. Thank you for your time, and I hope y'all have a nice day!
