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Missouri HouseSpecial Committee on Small BusinessChair Representative SchroerThe Missouri AFL-CIO, the voice for working Missourians, respectfully opposes House Bill 354.Currently Missouri Unemployment laws allow an employer to dismiss an employee within the first 28 days of employment without having to pay any unemployment contributions. HB 354 would extend this probationary period to 90 days.The Missouri AFL-CIO is opposed to this legislation as it allows an employer to hire workers during a peak season, terminate that employee during the 90-day probationary period, and not be liable for any unemployment compensation to the dismissed employee. The employer would get a free ride during the peak season while not contributing to the unemployment in the state.Job security is one of the greatest assets to improving the workforce. Job security leads to a better economy and a better workforce. The 28-day probationary period has worked well and to change it to benefit a few employers while hurting Missouri workers does not make sense.The Missouri AFL-CIO respectfully urges a "No" vote on House Bill 354.
