Good morning, my name is Amara Harper and I am a senior at Kirkwood High School and one of three editors in chiefs for my high school newspaper, The Kirkwood Call. My responsibilities as Editor in Chief consist of helping run the class along with my other two editors, editing copy and finalizing designs and covers for each of our issues. I have been on staff for three years now and one of the pillars of our publication is allowing our staff the freedom to write on any topic they find important for our student body and community to learn about. We are lucky enough to have an administration that allows us to do just that. Our staff as a whole has a positive and productive relationship with our principal. Michael Havener and he continues year after year to trust us enough to write and publish articles that inform and educate our student body and Kirkwood community. Our principal will often even come into our class every few weeks to answer any questions we may have. Just as much as he is transparent with us, we are transparent with him and what we are printing, often giving him a fair notice if a bigger topic will be covered in our newest issue. The ability to be able to publish content that we want without having any prior review has allowed us to become widely recognized as a top tier journalism program within our own community, but also within other communities across the state. We often have various publications reach out to us for guidance and examples on how we run such a successful publication. We at TKC would not be able to provide this support without the privileges we have. Our publication finds this is especially important during major events that take place not only in our community but also in our country. For example, this summer, with the rise of the Black Lives Matter movement, we chose to dedicate our back to school issue to the important topics addressed in the Black Lives Matter movement. In some cases, this issue as a whole or even individual stories that were included, such as a column by one of our staffers' explaining their experience as a black student in our district, would not have been allowed to be published. However, as an editorial board we made the judgment call that these stories and first-hand experiences were essential to this issue and therefore must be published. The support we received from not only our community members but also our administration was overwhelmingly positive — we were praised for our fast and important coverage on the various topics. With the New Voices Act. other student publications would get to have the same opportunities and privileges that we have. They would be allowed to cover the topics that are vital in their community and, by connection, thrive as student journalists. Thank you for your time.

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Missouri NEA Testimony on HB 480 to the House Elementary and Secondary Education CommitteeApril 20, 2021The Association appreciates the opportunity to present written testimony regarding HB 480.
