I know a woman who lost her job because someone who didn't like her reported to the boss that there was a gun in this woman's car. The person didn't see the gun; she was just guessing that there probably could be one since the woman was known to take her safety and protection seriously. She was a fine employee and the pistol in her vehicle hadn't been a threat or danger to anyone. The only one to gain from this event was the vindictive busy body who used a misguided company policy to get someone she didn't like fired.My testimony to this committee has included the following on more than one occasion.
