Christian County Prosecuting Attorney Amy Fite, on behalf of Missouri Association of Prosecuting Attorneys (MAPA), provides this written testimony in favor of the concept contained in Blair's Law, HB99, HB722, and HB795. MAPA strongly supports legislation that prohibits acting with criminal negligence to discharge of a firearm into or in a municipality. Given the legislature's recent effort to enact a revised criminal code that streamlined offenses, MAPA respectfully suggests the legislation avoid creating a new offense when an existing offense can be modified to achieve the intended effect. HB722 avoids creating a new offense and is MAPA's preferred method of achieving the goal of Blair's Law.
