As an Information Security professional (CISSP, CISA), I am categorically opposed to the use of electronic voting and tabulating equipment in lieu of good old-fashioned reliable paper ballots. No computing system is impervious to design faults or tampering - with or without malicious intent. We need reliable, tightly controlled voting procedures to guarantee a fully reliable, accountable and auditable result and paper ballots issued personally to registered voters who have proven their identity and eligibility to vote in any given election. The chain of custody for ballots is critical and requires that ballots be transported under seal with validation of quantities and serialization at both ends. Open ballot processing with plenty of public visibility and oversight is absolutely necessary to maintain confidence in the election process. This bill covers many of these issues and others and represents an excellent step forward towards assuring electoral integrity.

RE: Testimony in Opposition to H.B. 738Dear Chairman Shaul and members of the House Elections and Elected Officials Committee: I write in opposition to H.B. 738, being heard before the Committee on March 3, 2021. In addition to mandating hand-counted paper ballots only, which could impede access for voters with disabilities, H.B. 738 impedes efficient election administration by delaying the ability of local election authorities to count absentee ballots and imposes unconstitutional photo ID requirements to vote. The Missouri Voter Protection Coalition, a nonpartisan network of voter advocates in Missouri, supports giving local election authorities more lead time to process and count absentee ballots, and opposes strict photo ID requirements to vote. H.B. 738 would: Prohibit any election changes within six months of an election. This would have prevented the implementation of COVID-19 voting provisions passed by the Missouri General Assembly in response to concerns posed by the COVID-19 pandemic because the measure passed less than six months before the 2020 primary and general elections. Prohibit counting of absentee ballots until after all votes cast on Election Day have been counted, needlessly impeding election administration and delaying results. Missouri already prohibits tabulation of absentee ballots until Election Day. Election authorities need more lead time, not less.Mandate hand-counted paper ballots, further delaying results, and eliminating options for voters with disabilities to cast a secret ballot. Require all in-person voters (including in-person absentee voters) to provide non-expired state issued photo ID issued by the state of Missouri or federal government to vote. The bill eliminates non-photo ID options currently allowed to vote, including a voter identification card issued by the election authority, and eliminates the Secretary of State's obligation to notify voters about voter ID rules. The 2020 elections were marked by increased absentee voting, and showcased why election officials need more lead time, not less, to process and count absentee ballots. Americans waited for days for results from battleground states like Pennsylvania, which prohibits the counting of absentee ballots until Election Day. Many states (including Missouri) allow for the processing of absentee ballot envelopes before Election Day, but prohibit the tabulation and reporting of ballots until Election Day. Missouri law currently prohibits the tabulation and reporting of absentee ballots until Election Day. This measure would delay that further, until after other ballots have been counted. Not only do many states allow the processing of absentee ballots before Election Day, but fourteen states allow the tabulation of absentee ballots before Election Day, even if prohibiting disclosure of that count until after polls close. Other states prevent counting of absentee ballots until Election Day, and a few prohibit the counting until close of polls on Election Day. Only one state provides for the counting of absentee ballots to start after Election Day. Missouri local election authorities applauded the increase in absentee voting in Missouri in 2020, and reported results they characterized as "timely, accurate and secure." Absentee voting benefitted voters and election

authorities alike. Even without the now-expired COVID-19 voting provisions, increased absentee voting is likely here to stay. Unfortunately, H.B. 738 increases administrative burdens on election authorities by postponing their ability to count ballots to a window in which they are already extremely burdened counting Election Day ballots, Indeed, some Missouri election officials have advocated for a greater advance window in which to process and count absentee ballots. Additionally, H.B. 738's hand-counted paper ballot mandate will only generate further delays in election results, and impose additional burdens on local election authorities and voters. While the bill provides for a paper ballot marking device to support voters with disabilities, this will not be sufficient to ensure that all voters can cast a secret ballot. For example, electronic voting equipment with audio features currently allows visually impaired voters to cast a secret ballot, without needing to obtain assistance from someone to read or cast their ballot. The Help America Vote Act of 2002 sought to ensure that voters with disabilities have full and equal access to voting by mandating that every polling place have at least one voting machine accessible to voters with disabilities. Failure to ensure fully accessible voting equipment could contravene this and other state and federal protections. The Americans with Disabilities Act provides that "no qualified individual with a disability shall, by reason of such disability, be excluded from participation in or be denied the benefits of the services, programs, or activities of a public entity, or be subjected to discrimination by any such entity." 42 U.S.C. § 12132. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act provides that "[n]o otherwise qualified individual with a disability . . . shall, solely by reason of her or his disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance." 29 U.S.C. § 794(a). Moreover, Article VIII, Section 2 of the Missouri constitution guarantees the right to vote to all citizens in all elections. Accessible voting equipment is essential to realization of that mandate. Finally, H.B. 738 is fatally flawed by its unconstitutional strict photo ID provision. H.B. 738 imposes a strict photo ID requirement to vote in person (including in-person absentee voting) by eliminating non-photo ID options currently allowed to vote under § 115.427 RSMo. The Missouri Supreme Court has concluded that elimination of Option 2 IDs - as H.B. 738 would do - would create a strict photo ID requirement that would be be unconstitutional. It would burden more than 200,000 valid Missouri voters who do not have a non-expired state-issued photo ID. The Missouri Constitution "establish[es] with unmistakable clarity that the right to vote is fundamental to Missouri citizens." Weinschenk v. State, 203 S.W.3d 201, 212 (Mo. banc 2006), providing an explicit, affirmative constitutional right to vote more extensive than the federal constitution. Under the Missouri Constitution, any law that significantly burdens the right to vote is subject to strict scrutiny, the highest level of judicial review, a standard that has been reaffirmed by the Missouri Supreme Court in two cases involving photo ID requirements to vote. This is why the Missouri Supreme Court in Weinschenck concluded that a strict photo ID requirement imposes "a heavy and substantial burden on Missourians' free exercise of the right of suffrage" in violation of the Missouri Constitution. The passage of Amendment 6 in 2016 doesn't make the photo ID provision in H.B. 738 permissible. In January 2020, in Priorities USA v. State of Missouri, the Missouri Supreme Court considered the state's request to strike the non-photo ID options to vote – which is what H.B. 738 would do - and suggested it would not pass constitutional muster. The Court stated that eliminating Option 2 IDs to create a Photo ID-only requirement would have "pose[d] constitutional concerns and could not have been adopted by this Court." 591 S.W. 3d at 459. Because H.B. 738 eliminates the Option 2 (non-photo ID) options for voting, it is similarly unconstitutional. Eliminating the Secretary of State's advance notice obligations only makes it worse. Voters need advance notice of voting rules to navigate voting requirements. Testimony at two recent Missouri voter ID trials revealed widespread confusion by voters and poll workers alike. As the Missouri Supreme Court has recognized, lack of sufficient notice on voter ID requirements can "cause voter confusion and decrease voter turnout." Voters need more notification from their state's chief elections official, not less.H.B. 738's photo ID provision is a solution in search of a problem. Missouri law already requires all voters to produce identification at the polls. There has never been a prosecuted instance of voter impersonation in Missouri – and study after study shows it is exceedingly rare. Instead, H.B. 738 would erect barriers to the ballot for thousands of eligible Missouri voters. Missouri law already provides stiff penalties for voter impersonation. In the midst of a deadly pandemic without the ongoing protections of Missouri' now-expired COVID voting provisions, members of this committee should focus on making voting more accessible rather than again impose additional hurdles for voters and local election authorities. Accordingly, I urge the committee to OPPOSE H.B. 738. Dear members of the House Elections Committee, I am writing today in opposition to HB 738 which impacts voter ID in the State of Missouri. For the last 7 years, I have worked with college students to further their civic and community engagement at Washington University inSt. Louis. Each year, part of my effort has included extending undergraduate and graduate students' knowledge of and participation in elections. In these efforts, I have worked with students to help them understand and navigate the rules to voting in Missouri, to ensure their votes count. Due to this personal experience, I am strongly opposed to any additional limitations on acceptable forms of voter ID. The voter notification card and the student ID are both crucial to ensure that college students can exercise their right to vote. College students, particularly those who are voting for the first time, are overwhelmed by small barriers. They are balancing many priorities, including class, job, and frequently being responsible for theirown identification for the first time ever. Being able to use their student id, which they are required to carry around with them every day, or their voter notification card, which they receive soon before the election, helps ensure that they will not be turned away at the polls. Learning to become an active citizen is a lifelong process, and increasing barriers early on in someone's civic journey may set them back years in participation. Outside of my concerns with students, I am also concerned because of the burden for all the other Missourians who do not have ready access to state-issued photo IDs. According to the Missouri Voter Protection Coalition, more than 200,000 valid Missouri voters do not have a current state-issued photo ID. Getting an ID is an expensive and difficult process, and it would disproportionately burden voters of color and low-income voters. This is unconstitutional. In addition to this, the other provisions included in this bill are extremely worrying. Election officials should not wait until election day to begin counting ballots. Election officials all over the state are hampered by the current requirements, and I hope you will give them more time, not less. In addition, limiting changes within 6 months of an election does not give our elected officials the space to prepare for the unanticipated challenges that may come — such as a global pandemic. In this age of technology and rapid change, there must be flexibility for you and the governor to protect democracy, whatever the circumstances. I urge the committee to stop HB 738. Unfortunately, instead of enabling reason two to work for those who are permanently disabled as well as those who face current health concerns and conditions, this bill further limits the flexibility of a measure that currently exists. What would be even more effective, is to expand opportunities for everyone who is qualified to vote—no excuse absentee voting, expanded genuine early voting, and mail in voting for everyone. All these measures actually provide opportunities to secure the rolls, are more efficient for voting authorities, and we would not spend time sorting those qualified voters who deserve to vote and those who don't because of circumstances. Delaying the counting and preparation of absentee votes is very curious. It would perhaps make sense if sufficient funds were made available to every voting jurisdiction so that judges used for prep could be at the polls, reducing lines in many locations. This obviously is not the reason because no statement or funds are presented for this reason. Personally, I don't mind not knowing the results right away. However, this would be quite a burden on our voting authorities. Are you trying to sow seeds of doubt in the election? I am an advocate of hand marked, hand counted paper ballots. I have had problems with voting machines myself. It is obvious when there is a problem with an election, ballots are counted, when they exist. However, there MUST be made available voting machines for those with disabilities who wish to cast a private ballot and do not want someone helping them. Also, some people don't have someone they trust to mark their ballot for them. I believe that voting is the cornerstone of democracy. I trust the process. I believe we have a more stable society when people have a voice. That means sometimes the candidates I support lose and sometimes they win. What I don't want is an election process that does not allow all who are qualified to vote. There is no significant in-person voter fraud and requiring difficult to acquire unexpired photo ID would exclude qualified voters from casting a ballot—excluding more people, than any evidence of voter fraud has ever demonstrated over 10 yes in the entire United States over ten years. Missouri NEA Testimony on HB 738 to the House Elections and Elected Officials CommitteeMarch 3, 2021The Association appreciates the opportunity to present written testimony regarding HB 738. The Association opposes the bill as filed. Missouri NEA believes that the constitutional right to vote should be guaranteed to all citizens. The Association encourages the legislature to enact legislation to simplify voting, improve absentee voting provisions, and ensure uniform residency requirements throughout Missouri. The Association also believes that the human and civil rights of individuals with disabilities must be protected. In contrast to these suggestions, HB 738 would eliminate non-photo ID options currently allowed for registered voters. This provision is not needed. Further, the Association expects that this requirement would make voting more difficult for many Missouri voters. Many currently and properly registered voters do not have a government-issued photo ID that meets the new requirements of this bill. The bill also changes the law to eventually disallow electronic voting machines and other emerging technologies that can help disabled and visually impaired voters. Missouri NEA opposes barriers that keep eligible citizens from voting and being politically active and thus opposes HB 738. Dear Committee Members, We urge you to oppose HB 738. While the bill is flawed for several reasons, we will focus on photo ID. Voter ID is unconstitutional and we know the results. When states implement voter ID, voters, especially voters of color, elderly voters, and low-income voters stand to miss out. Nationally, thirteen percent of Blacks, 10 percent of Hispanics, compared to 5 percent of white voters do not have a government-issued photo ID. For low income people, especially those who are transient, government issued IDs are extremely difficult to procure with a frequent catch-22- you cannot get an ID without an address, you cannot procure housing without an ID and, to make matters worse, IDs are expensive. This past August, the price for a non-driver's license ID in the state of Missouri increased has from \$11 to \$18. For a person living on the edge, those dollars matter. According to Project Vote, twelve percent of adults living in a household with less than \$25,000 annual income lack photo ID. compared to just 2 percent in households with over \$150,000 annual income. Voting is not just for those who have the money to pay for their rights. Voting is a fundamental right. By imposing voter ID requirements to vote absentee in person, HB 738 narrows the very limited early voting available to voters. On the ground, this bill removes non-photo ID options for voters and will require voters who lack an ID at the time of voting to cast a provisional ballot which will not count unless they return with an ID on Election Day. Strict photo ID requirements are unconstitutional and burden more than 200,000 valid Missouri voters who do not have a current state-issued photo ID. Photo ID requirements disproportionately impact communities of color and the elderly. The Missouri Supreme Court in its two cases involving photo ID requirements to vote, including a decision in January 2020 stated that both the right to vote and right to equal protection under the Missouri constitution are "even more extensive than those provided by the federal constitution." Repeatedly, Missouri's Supreme Court has concluded that a strict photo ID requirement for voters imposes "a heavy and substantial burden on Missourians' free exercise of the right of suffrage" in violation of the Missouri Constitution. We urge you to vote in opposition to HB 738. Where is the need to make voting harder in Missouri? We do not have early voting or even no-excuse absentee voting. Let's focus on increasing voter turnout and engaging everyone in the democratic process instead of restricting access to the ballot box. We urge you to vote "no" on HB 738. I look forward to your questions.

Prohibiting any election law changes within six months of an election would have prevented the implementation of the COVID-19 voting provisions passed by the Missouri General Assembly last year. Those measures passed less than six months before the 2020 primary and general elections. This bill would delay ballot counting until after all other Election Day ballots have been counted. Election authorities need more lead time to process and count absentee ballots, not less. The bill eliminates non -photo ID options currently allowed to vote, including a voter identification card or student ID, and eliminates the Secretary of State's obligation to notify voters about voter ID rules. This is an undemocratic voter suppression bill.
