Theseelected directors work with professional staff to govern and oversee the operations of the watersupply and distribution systems for each District's territory. We understand that HB 767 intends to alter RSMo 247.200. We are opposed to theamendments as unduly restricting the latitude Water Districts need to govern their affairs asdetermined by the sound judgment of the elected Board members charged with running the District. Districts are already managed by professional, licensed staff that operate these systems withthe aid of their hired engineers, financial advisors, legal counsel and receive assistance, guidanceand training in best practices from work with the Department of Natural Resources and associations such as our organization and Missouri Rural Water Association. These proposed restrictionshamper the ability of the Districts to address issues which have real cost to them and would unfairlytransfer those costs to the other District customers. The Board needs the flexibility to assess wherethe responsibility should lie for these operational issues. We believe the proposed legislation improperly usurps the control of elected official'sdecision making by dictating requirements without regard to the priorities and local needsdetermined by those elected officials. Rather we need the State to allow the local elected officials torun our water supply districts and for the State to support programs to fund infrastructure expansionand improvements.
